New dance venue for Brum

The Birmingham-based ACE dance and music this month launches its newly refurbished dance studio and performance venue.

Located in the Digbeth area of the city, ACE SPACE will provide the company with an opportunity to expand its existing programme, secure additional trading income via hires, and add to Birmingham's growing stock of high-spec rehearsal spaces and venues.

Founded in 1996, ACE dance and music skilfully combines African and Caribbean movement aesthetics with contemporary techniques to create high-quality innovative performance work.

Commenting on ACE SPACE, ACE's founder and Artistic Director, Gail Parmel, said: "It's been ACE dance and music's long-term ambition to build a multi-purpose space. After several years of dedicated fundraising, we've finally managed to achieve our goal. At ACE SPACE we can run our extensive education programme, offer rehearsal and performance space to visiting companies, develop and rehearse our own work and perform to invited audiences."

Mike Bartlett's Olivier Award-winning King Charles III opens Birmingham Repertory Theatre's autumn/winter season. Co-produced by The REP and the Almeida Theatre and directed by Rupert Goold, the production 'explores the people underneath the crowns, the unwritten rules of democracy, and the conscience of Britain's most famous family'. King Charles III shows from 4 to 19 September and kick-starts a season of diverse theatre at The REP. Kneehigh Theatre's Dead Dog In A Suitcase (And Other Love Songs) (29 September to 3 October) and Meera Syal's Anita And Me (9 to 24 October) are other early-autumn shows being presented at the venue. Maxine Peake's critically acclaimed Beryl, meanwhile, celebrates the life of unsung sporting 'legend' Beryl Burton, who cycled her way into the record books. The production runs from 24 to 28 November. Other highlights include William Golding's Lord Of The Flies (3 to 7 November) and the return of The REP's acclaimed version of John Steinbeck's Of Mice And Men (4 to 13 February), directed by Roxana Silbert. Birmingham Contemporary Music Group (BCMG) is celebrating after its recent nomination for a prestigious Royal Philharmonic Society (RPS) Music Award.

The ensemble has been nominated for its

mass-participation performance, Crowd Out, which was presented in the glass atrium at Millennium Point last summer by one thousand Birmingham residents.

The performance, which featured people singing, yelling, talking, shouting and whispering, was composed by Pulitzer Prize-winning American composer David Lang. BCMG produced the show, with the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra's Simon Halsey directing.

This year's RPS Music Awards winners will

be announced at a ceremony on Tuesday 5 May. A special programme about the Awards will then be broadcast on BBC Radio Three on Monday 11 May at 7.30pm.

Old Rep reveals new patron

Film star Brian Cox is the new patron of Birmingham's revitalised Old Rep Theatre.

Cox, whose movies include Troy and the Bourne trilogy, has taken the role at the invitation of Birmingham Ormiston Academy (BOA), which took over the running of the premises last year. The academy's students are responsible for the complete running of the theatre - both on stage and behind the scenes - allowing them to develop a combination of performance, administrative and technical theatre skills.

Commenting on his new role, Brian said: "I have very fond memories of my time here at the Old Rep Theatre, which was a fantastic starting point for me. My love for the theatre is something I've carried with me throughout my career, and I have no doubt that these students will do the same.

"BOA has provided some of the country's most talented young people with a unique stepping stone to utilise such a fantastic stage, and I look forward to seeing them go on to achieve very successful careers."

Mark Benton

takes to solving crime on the French Riviera

Roles in Early Doors, Northern Lights, Waterloo Road and Catterick have ensured that Mark Benton is a familiar face on television. Having donned a dress and heels to play Edna Turnblad in the 2012 tour of Hairspray, Mark is this month returning to the stage in the touring production of West End hit Dirty Rotten Scoundrels. What's On recently caught up with him to find out more...

Explain the role of Inspector Andre, Mark - the character you play in Dirty Rotten Scoundrels - and give us an idea of what the show is about...

It's about a couple of conmen who have a bet to get some money out of this lady. My character is the sidekick of Lawrence, one of the two conmen, and he falls for one of the ladies who he's trying to con. It's kind of a comedy love story but that's all I'm giving away. You'll have to come and see the show.

The film was a 1988 remake of 1964's Bedtime Story with David Niven and Marlon Brando. Now the 1988 remake's been adapted for the stage. Which elements of the story have ensured its popularity with different generations of audience?

It's such a big, fun piece. There are great songs in it and big numbers, but also the structure's really funny. I think it really appealed to me because it's almost like a comedy with songs.

If you weren't playing Andre, which role would appeal to you the most - Lawrence Jameson or Freddy Benson?

I think Freddy because he's a slob. He's a mess, and that would be right up my street. But I'm happy playing Andre. He's got so many fun lines. He's dry and French...

So how's the French accent going? It's kind of a work in progress. I'm trying to get a cross between Inspector Clouseau and Arsene Wenger.

Moving away from Dirty Rotten Scoundrels to focus on you; you grew up in Teeside in the mid-1960s - a long way away, I'd imagine, from any showbiz glamour. So what made you decide to become an actor?

My uncle's an actor, and I wanted to be like him. That inspired me to do as many local plays and as much am-dram as I could get into. I went to technical college to do a drama course, and I guess I always wanted to be either an actor or in a band. I went to drama school when I was eighteen, then applied to RADA when I was twenty and moved to I ondon

What were your initial expectations of RADA?

It was much better than I'd expected. I was worried because I thought there were going

to be all these posh kids and I'd be the odd one out, and that I wasn't going to understand what was going on because I was this lad from the sticks. Actually it was nothing like I expected. It was lovely, and our year was a real mix of people from all walks of life. It was a real eye-opener and it changed my life forever. Some of the people who I met then remain my best friends today. I've done quite a lot of weird things throughout my career that I never imagined I'd do, but I've ended up doing them nonetheless. I've really enjoyed the variety.

You recently faired pretty well on Strictly Come Dancing. Were you game from the word go, or did you have to be persuaded that you'd enjoy the experience?

I wasn't game. I'd always said I wouldn't do a reality show. I talked to the guys from Strictly and was adamant that I wasn't going to do it, but I still decided to meet them. I thought about it again, and the one thing that's different about Strictly is that you've got to learn a skill. It's not about sitting in a room chatting. And I do enjoy dancing, so I thought 'what the hell?' As an actor, you worry about your credibility, but it's one of the few Reality TV shows that doesn't harm that, because people see it for what it is. The people who I thought would be the most critical about me doing it turned out to be the least critical.

You made it through to the eleventh show. Were you surprised by how well you did?

Very surprised. I damaged my knees on week two of the rehearsals and had to see a surgeon, who pumped some steroids into me and said, "You might make a week or two but remain philosophical". I guess I relied on my acting ability because I couldn't to certain things due to the knee. I hate to use the 'journey' word, but it was a journey for both me and my dance partner, Evetta. She had to choreograph around my limitations. I was in a lot of pain a lot of the time, but I look back on it as a really lovely experience.

You also starred as Edna Turnblad in Hairspray. How did you enjoy the experience of performing in drag - was it a more difficult challenge than you'd imagined it would be?

I was doing Waterloo Road at the time and the offer just came out of the blue. I just jumped in because I thought I was getting a little bit stale. I'd been doing Waterloo Road for two years and fancied doing something different - and you can't get anything more diverse than Hairspray and Waterloo Road! I really enjoyed the experience. It was great dragging up and a really iconic part. It was brilliant fun and I could've carried on doing it.

Your big break came playing Ricky in Career Girls, a 1997 film by Mike Leigh, who's famously known for using lengthy improvisations - developed over a period of weeks - to build characters and storylines for his films. How did you find the experience of working with him? Amazing. He's a genius, and I would jump at the chance to work with him again. The thing I found with Mike is not necessarily that he taught me how to act but more that if you start with the truth of a character, you can go anywhere. I knew my character inside out because of all the months of hard work we'd put in, so I was able to say 'Ricky wouldn't do that' and actually be qualified to say so, because I knew him so well.

And did he give you a lot of freedom to develop Ricky?

He develops it with you. He'll maybe steer you in a certain direction but it's very collaborative. I never saw a script but I knew my lines better than when I've learned with a script.

Talking of freedom, how much were you given when developing the role of Eddie in Early Doors?

That was great fun. When I initially met Craig and everybody for Early Doors, I was going for the role of the policeman, but it didn't work out. I knew the director because he'd directed me in The Second Coming. I told him Eddie was my favourite, and he said to come back in and audition for him. So I read for Eddie and this character came out of nowhere. Obviously all of the lines are Craig and Phil's, but all of Eddie's moves, the way he uses his hands and everything, just came out of nowhere and continued to develop throughout the series. We all had such a laugh making Early Doors. There's an episode, the last of Series One, where we all go on the Big Boys Beano. We're having breakfast and James McAvoy starts choking on his cigar smoke. We're proper laughing, and so they kept it in. I just love that scene.

What's your criteria for accepting roles and has it changed over the years?

I think it's very hard to say what it is. I've done jobs in the past where I've maybe only done one or two scenes, but there's been

something in the character that's really made me want to do it. I think sometimes it's not about playing the biggest part but more about wanting to play a part because it's different from me. It has to be something that will challenge me - and there has to be something in it that I've never done before, like with Strictly. I didn't know whether I could do it but I gave it a go. It was the same when I first took on Hairspray. I was excited because it was a challenge and I didn't know whether I could do it.

If we were to ask either of your teenage children which of your roles they thought was the 'coolest', what do you think they'd

They're just proud of me whatever I do - but if I was to ask my youngest, she'd probably say Hairspray or Hobson's Choice. My oldest would probably say Catterick, which I did with Vic and Bob. There's kind of a whole spectrum there, really.

You've displayed great versatility throughout your career, playing both dramatic and comedic roles. Which of the two do you find the most challenging and

I don't necessarily think it's about whether

serious drama or comedy is harder. It's down to the individual part. Sometimes I've done a comedy - like Early Doors, Catterick or Northern Lights - where it's easy because it's all there in the writing and it just flows. Other times you have to do comedy where it's not quite right and you really have to work on it. It's the same with drama, so I don't think it's down to the genre.

If you could choose any one character to revive in the future, who would it be?

I'd love to do Eddie Bell again from Early Doors and Mark from Catterick. I'd also love to do Northern Lights, so that me and Robson could get together again. There's so many, I couldn't possibly name them all.

It's been ten years now since Early Doors, is there a possibility that we might see

I don't know. We'd love to. I know that James McAvoy and everybody would be up for doing it again. It was one of those programmes where you can't wait to go to work every day. We were in the pub together all of the time, laughing and joking and learning our script. It was just a very special job. All I can say is that I hope we get to do it again. As the years go by, it kind of gets less

likely - but never say never...

What's on the cards post-Dirty Rotten Scoundrels?

I'm also doing a film at the moment called The Eagle. It's about Eddie The Eagle and we're filming that alongside rehearsals for Dirty Rotten Scoundrels. I rehearse for a couple of days and then go off and film for a couple of days, so it's a bit busy at the moment.

Who do you play in the film?

I'm the sidekick to the head of the British Olympic Association. We're a couple of baddies who try and stop Eddie from competing because we sort of see him as an embarrassment. It's a great film and real fun

Finally, have you ever questioned your

career choice?
I do feel really blessed to have had the career that I've had. I've worked really hard at trying not to get bitter about the whole business.
Acting is tough, and you're constantly
dealing with rejection, so I feel very blessed that I've been able to do so many diverse things. I wouldn't change any of it.

Best known to TV viewers as Coronation Street's Janice Battersby, Vicky Entwistle waved a fond farewell to Weatherfield's cobbled streets in order to pursue a career on the stage. After a successful stint as Madame Thénardier in the West End production of Les Miserables, Vicky is this month visiting the Midlands to play Mari in a new staging of Jim Cartwright's hit musical, The Rise And Fall Of Little Voice. What's On recently caught up with her to find out more...

Mari is a huge role and a physically demanding one. What coping strategies are you putting into place to deal with this? It's still early days but I'm trying to work my way through it. Mari's not an athlete and she's not a slim woman - so if I get hot and bothered, that's exactly what she'd do too. So I'm not particularly worried about it.

Are there many similarities between Janice Battersby and Mari?

I don't think they're alike at all. For a start, they're from a different era. Mari, although she might look trashy, thinks she's glamorous. She really makes an effort - and she's a lot more fun than Janice. Mari's a bit of a dreamer and fun-loving party girl, whereas Janice is more of a realist and quite dour. They both work in a factory, but that's probably where the similarity ends. Well, it certainly will be the way I'm intending to play it, because I don't want her to be anything like Janice. I'm trying to break that mould. I don't think you should play a part and have it trap you forever. That's why I'm doing lots of different theatre. Every part is different from the one I've just played. Otherwise there's no point in doing it. I might as well have stayed

You certainly proved there's more to you than Janice Battersby when you played Madame Thénardier in Les Miserables in the West End. How was that experience? It was great, but I felt a bit like Granny Grumble because I was probably the oldest cast member - me and Cameron Blakeley, who played Thénardier. I see it as another string to my bow.

Was wanting to progress as an actor your only reason for deciding to leave Corrie? I wanted to challenge myself and put myself into positions, parts, situations and roles that were going to test me; ones which I'm going to learn from.

I want to break down barriers and move out of my comfort zone. Being in Les Miserables did that for me because I'm not a singer. I didn't train as a singer, but Cameron Mackintosh paid for me to have lessons and that gave me the confidence I needed. Just because I'm not a singer shouldn't mean that I can't play this amazing woman, so I just played to the woman and didn't think about the singing.

Did the outcome surprise you?

Yeah, I suppose it did. I don't think I could do opera somehow, but it certainly doesn't have the same fear for me now. I think that's what it's all about. When I left Corrie, I went to drama centre and then went on to play a part that was very close to me - a northern girl who worked in a factory. Now I'm having fun because I'm getting to put into practice what I was taught for three years.

So how did your role as Janice Battersby

I was doing a play with Jill Halfpenny called Like A Virgin and the casting director from Corrie came to see it and offered me an episode. I was told to just come in and play a factory girl. I didn't get wardrobe, costumes and wigs - or even time to think about the character - because as far as I was concerned it was just a single episode. They asked me if I wanted to do a few more episodes, then a few more, and then they said they were writing this family around me. So before I knew it I was a larger larger to the factors will be in the same standard or the said by playing Janice as this factory girl. I might have made different decisions had I been allowed the luxury of creating the character myself. It was flattering, but at the same time I was always trapped into what I'd done with those first few lines.

You've been back and forth a few times. Why did you make the conscious decision to leave?

The time goes so quickly. I was in it for fourteen years but it only seemed like seven. When I got to forty I thought, if I don't move now then I'm never going to play the eleven women who I want to play.

I couldn't say, other than that I've played two of them already, Mari included. They're all very different and that's why I want to play them.

Your tag line on Twitter is 'drink life while it's still fizzy'. So is your glass half empty or half full?

Leaving a big institution like Coronation Street has taught me to embrace every opportunity that comes my way. What can be achieved is quite special when you work hard.

How do you feel about again appearing opposite Chris Gascoyne, who played Peter

Barlow in Corrie?

It makes it a lot better. We came to the meetings about the roles with absolutely no idea what the other one was doing. We knew nothing until we were cast, but we were both ecstatic. Out of all the people I worked with on Corrie, Chris was one of the ones who made

me think, 'Yeah that's a proper actor'. I'm so glad I'm going to be working with him because we just get each other. We have a real friendship anyway, so it's really easy. The only thing that I'd say is that we're a little bit daunted by having to snog each other's face off. He played my son-in-law for a couple of years, so that's going to be a bit odd - but he's a good-looking lad so I'm sure I'll get over it.

Can you see Janice treading the cobbled streets of Corrie again?

I'm not thinking that way. It was brilliant while it lasted and I had an absolute ball, but you can't keep going back. I remember it fondly and it was a great job, but the whole reason for wanting to fly was so that I could do other things. To return would go against what I'm trying to do. Sometimes it's quite hard to shake off a character, so by making a return you'd be back at square one. Every single role that I take on now seems to shake off a little bit more of Janice. I don't want to sound ungrateful because I had a great time on there, but I want to work with different people and different directors. As lovely as it is working constantly with the same company and directors, you end up knowing exactly how everybody is going to say their lines. You're very rarely surprised. I want to be surprised.


The disciplines of working in TV and on stage are very different. What was the most difficult change to deal with?

I'd done a lot of theatre jobs before I went into Corrie. I just had to learn how to tell stories which came from the character's mouth. On one shot at it. You can't go again. I much prefer theatre because you get that instant reaction from the audience. I love that buzz and seeing the emotion that you can provoke. It's a really euphoric feeling that you don't get with television.

Jim Cartwright has written Mari in a very particular way. Do you get much freedom in terms of how you portray her on stage? Jim's been brilliant. If I want to try something and it's not working then obviously we go allowing me to have real fun with it.

What I've discovered is yes, Mari's fun, childlike, demanding and loud, but she's also extremely damaged, vulnerable and insecure. Those moments when things don't go how she wants them to should be absolutely heartbreaking - and that's what I'm trying to achieve. It's a real rollercoaster ride of emotions, with Mari having these terrific highs where she behaves in a way that normal people wouldn't. She's off the scale and then, when she crashes, she becomes so volatile. You really don't know what you're going to get from her, which makes it a really exciting role to play.

on playing the lead in the National Theatre's The Curious Incident Of The Dog In The Night Time

Simon Stephens' National Theatre adaptation of Mark Haddon's novel, The Curious Incident Of The Dog In The Night-Time, has been doing fantastic business both in the West End and on tour. It's also making a star of Swansea-born Joshua Jenkins, the twenty-seven-year-old actor who's currently starring as the show's main character, fifteen-year-old Christopher Boone. Joshua took time out from the role to chat with What's On...

How does playing Christopher measure up to previous roles you've undertaken? It's the best part I've ever played and could potentially be one of the best parts I'll ever play. It's such an amazing role in such a wonderful production. Christopher is on stage from start to finish. He's such a complex character - and that, combined with all the physical aspects of the show, makes

for a fantastic mixture.

Where did your research take you when you were preparing to play the character? It's never mentioned in the book or the play that Christopher is on the autistic spectrum, but I wanted to do as much research on the subject as I could. It's fair to say he possesses some of the traits and qualities of someone who's there. So I read endless amounts of books, looked at websites, documentaries and films. I also went to a school in north London to meet some of the pupils. They were very generous with their time, and I got to ask some questions. Once I'd done the research and I really felt I understood what autism and Asperger's were, I let that go a little bit and really tried to stay true to the book and Simon Stephens' adaptation.

Were you familiar with Mark Haddon's novel prior to joining the cast at the National?

Yes, I'd read it a few years before I auditioned for the play. I remember loving the novel but didn't think about it again until the audition came up. When I re-read it, I was reminded of just how brilliant it is. I think Simon Stephens has done a great job in terms of adapting it.

As you mentioned, you're on stage all the time. How do you psych yourself up preperformance?

I do a really long physical and vocal warmup, which takes about an hour. Then I just try to relax a little bit. I listen to music in my dressing room to take my mind away from the dread of going on stage in front of over a thousand people.

As well as portraying someone on the autistic spectrum and being on stage for all that time, you also have to memorise where all the boxes are and what's in them. How do you do that?

It's a very, very technical show, even in terms of the lighting and sound. The fact that Christopher never leaves the stage means half of my brain is focused on the acting and performance and the other half on the stage management aspect of the show - making sure I'm in the right spot for the right cue, and that I say the right line at the right time for the next cue. There's so much going on for whoever's playing Christopher. Its an awful lot to take in, so the only answer is to practise; to just keep doing it and doing it until it sticks.

Have you ever pulled out the wrong box? Yes, when we were at the Lowry. I ran up to a cupboard, but I couldn't remember the order that I had to open the boxes. There was nothing in there, so I just ran to the next one in the hope that there would be something there. That was only the first couple of times, but then I suppose it's the same as anything the more you practise, the more you get it.

Did you see the West End staging before joining the National Theatre?

I really wanted to see it but never did. Then, when I got the part, I decided I didn't want to see it. I wanted to approach the rehearsal period with a fresh pair of eyes and put my own spin on it.

Having seen Christopher in the West End and on tour, the difference in how the character is portrayed is very obvious. How much of that is down to what you've learned personally, and how much to the way you're being directed?

I think every Christopher is going to be completely different because we're all different people playing the part. That's what's fun and exciting - but there's a lot of it that you're bringing to the table yourself. You bring an element of your own personality, which is the case with every part you play. There's a sense that you're joining a show that already exists, so there are certain things - like the blocking and the physical aspects of the show - that are already choreographed and remain the same. The director, Katy Rudd, really allowed us to find our own way and make it ours. We try to keep it fresh while at the same time making sure we stay within the choreography and set piece.

Has the physical aspect of the show been a new challenge for you?

Kind of. I did a little bit of dance when I was younger, and I used to tap dance - so I've always been comfortable physically. As an actor, I work from a physical point of view first. The physical aspect comes before the rest of the character. That said, even though I've always been comfortable in terms of working physically in theatre, this was a whole new challenge. We had a boot camp every morning - an hour of sit-ups, jogging, press-ups, boxing and weights - just to get fit for the show. The whole company and the whole ensemble were included. It was pretty intense but a great experience.

We've talked about how you prepare, but how do you come down from that high when you leave the stage?

It does take a little while, probably a couple of hours. Normally we try to go for a quiet drink or a bite to eat, then head off home. I find if I go straight home and straight to bed, I can't get to sleep until about 3 o'clock in the morning because I'm filled with adrenaline.

There's a twelve-year age gap between you and Christopher. Have you had to dig into your younger self to play a fifteen-year-old?

I tried to remember what I was like when I was fifteen - the energy and enthusiasm I had for things. I definitely had a 'get up and go' attitude, which I think Christopher's got as

well. But he's also very different to me, and to who I was when I was fifteen. He's a very special boy and a brilliant, brilliant character. In many ways I wish I'd been more like him at that age.

Do you have any personal experiences which have helped you relate to the bond between Christopher and Siobhan?

Yeah, I feel I've been really blessed with brilliant teachers, especially when I went to college in South Wales. I had a couple of teachers there who were really supportive and really went out of their way to make sure I could pursue the career I wanted to pursue. They really helped and guided me and are still my friends today.

Have they been to see you in Curious Incident, and did that make you nervous? Yes, a bit. I'm from Swansea and so when I played Cardiff, I had family and friends in every single night. It was a bit of a stressful week for me - a bit full on.

What's been your biggest learning curve with Curious Incident, and in terms of working as part of the National Theatre team?

On this production it's the sense of the ensemble; of how important and powerful it can be when a group of people come together and work really closely and really hard. We've got a fantastic company of actors, a great creative team, and we've really put the hours in. As a company we've produced work we can all be really, really proud of. It just goes to show that when everybody comes together and everyone is supportive, you can produce some really great work.

You mentioned earlier that this could be the biggest role you ever play. Did you ever imagine you'd be in such a huge production?

Well, I think as an actor you hope that you'll get a part like this, and you always back your own ability. You always think you could do it if you were given the chance. At the same time, you always assume it's never going to happen. After all, there are so many talented people out there who could play the part. I'm extremely grateful that I've been given the opportunity. I'm really enjoying the experience and I'm trying to make the most of it

What's next for you after Curious Incident? I'm not quite sure what I'll be doing after this

I'm not quite sure what I'll be doing after this because we've still got about eight months of the tour left. It's theatre that I love, and I hope to continue doing it. There's something about it being live that's really special and quite exciting for me..

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

Expect a winning fusion of new and more familiar material when they stop off in the Midlands this month as part of an extensive tour.









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
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Music Previews

The Glee Club, Birmingham, Tues 12 May When John Parker met Luke Concannon on a school bus at the age of thirteen, neither of them could've imagined that the encounter would lead to them becoming a prime-time television 'pop' act, playing the Wembley arena, touring Europe and selling a million records

Their road to success came via afternoons spent playing and writing songs, and later running their own record label from a spare room. But it was unique father-and-son number The JCB Song that shot them to stardom in 2005.

When the pressure got a bit too much, they took a break, returning in 2013 following a four-year hiatus.

Reverend Peyton's Big Damn Band

When it comes to showing commitment to fingerpickin', scrubboard scratchin', drumbucket country blues, Reverend Peyton's Big Damn Band take some lickin'. The talented trio sold everything they owned in a garage sale, hit the open road and have been playing a staggering two hundred-and-fifty-plus shows a year ever since.



Dub Fx

The Institute, Birmingham, Sat 2 May
Australian-born Benjamin Stanford, better known to the world as Dub Fx, creates hiphop, reggae and drum & bass rhythms, then raps and sings over them. Having started out playing and singing in a band called Twitch, he went solo after arriving in Europe, developing a style that combined his voice with live looping and effect pedals.

Stanford's latest release is Theory Of Harmony, which stays true to his live sound while at the same time taking listeners on a hypnotic journey.



Twenty One Pilots

Hare & Hounds, Birmingham, Wed 13 May

As they put it on their website, Josh Dun and Tyler Joseph - otherwise known as indie pop band Twenty One Pilots - are currently earning 'widespread applause for their energetic live sets and distinctive fusion of piano-driven schizoid pop and lyrical uplift'. And the boys are pretty clear about their motivation too: "What's our purpose for playing music? We're constantly asking ourselves that question. The answer can change all the time, but for right now we're just going to stick with something as simple as 'we want to make people think'."

The Strypes

Kasbah, Coventry, Tues 26 May

Irish four-piece punk rock band The Strypes started off by playing blues covers. They were soon signed to Elton John's Rocket Music management company - a development which saw the three oldest members of the band quit school.

Counting such megastars as Noel Gallagher,

Roger Daltrey and Paul Weller among their fans, the band's fast-paced garage rock 'speed blues' has made them a real force to be reckoned with when performing live



The Beach Boys

Barclaycard Arena, Birmingham, Fri 29 May Having won the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Recording Academy and been inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, there's no question that The Beach Boys

have, in their time, been just about as big as it's possible to get in the music industry. Expect all the hits in this latest touring show, including Good Vibrations, Wouldn't It Be Nice, God Only Knows, Surfin' USA and I Get Around.



Heaven 17

Student Union Copper Rooms, Coventry, Sat 30 May

One of the best-known new wave synthpop bands from the decade of Glasnost, yuppies, Miami Vice and mullet hair-dos, Heaven 17 took the early 1980s by storm - not least with their second album, The Luxury Gap, which they're performing at this gig.

Hailed a pop masterpiece, the album was a vehicle for the band's reasonably subtle and engagingly humorous leftist messages. Little wonder, then, that in the austere days of 2015, performing The Luxury Gap once again seems a pertinent thing to do.



Dr Hook

Wulfrun Hall, Wolverhampton, Thurs 14 May American rock band Dr Hook (shortened in 1975 from Dr Hook & The Medicine Show) enjoyed eight glorious years of chart success, with hits including Sylvia's Mother, The Cover Of Rolling Stone, Sharing The Night Together and, most famously, When You're In Love With A Beautiful Woman.

They visit these Midlands venues with the actual Dr Hook - Ray 'Eye Patch' Sawyer - and will be playing all the hits.

Marc Almond

Town Hall, Birmingham

Marc Almond is a quintessentially eclectic British artist. As a singer he's embraced not only pop music but elements of variety, vaudeville, theatre... the list goes on.

After a support act from Stephen Langstaff (check out Sirens, it's great), Almond took to the stage of Birmingham Town Hall. The gig coincided with his latest release, The Velvet Trail, with many of the evening's tracks coming



from this exceptionally accomplished album. But it's a work that was almost never made. Prior to recording it, Almond thought his album days were over - that was until producer/songwriter Chris Braide emailed him with three instrumental tracks. The songwriting muse returned to Almond, and a whole new batch of wonderfully melodic numbers have now joined his canon of work.

As well as the title track - a beautifully crafted, melancholic reflection on the past - the stand-out live performances from the new album were the poppy Bad To Me and Zipped Black Leather Jacket, and the ballad and recent single Scar. You hear these songs once and you think you've known them forever.

Almond, who appeared relaxed and in total control of the audience, was in fine voice. I won't pretend I know his back catalogue in great detail, but on the strength of live performances of the haunting Champagne and Meet Me In My Dreams (a piece of pop perfection), I'll certainly be investigating the Tenement Symphony album, from which these two tracks come.

The evening ended with some of the glorious Soft Cell hits for which Almond is probably most well known. The wonderfully depressing Bedsitter went down a storm - and yes, we got Tainted Love, and yes, it was great. But the highlight came in the shape of the final song on the set list, Say Hello, Wave Goodbye, a heartbreaking masterpiece. Almond has hinted this might be his last tour. I, for one, certainly hope that's not the case. Jack Rolfe



Classical Music PREVIEWS



Birmingham Contemporary Music Group: Fantasmagoria

CBSO Centre, Birmingham, Sat 9 May

The work of David Sawer is here celebrated by Birmingham Contemporary Music Group (BCMG), who commissioned the Stockport-born composer's most well-known work, 2009's critically acclaimed Rumpelstiltskin. A late addition to BCMG's 2014/15 programme, Fantasmagoria features three Sawer pieces which are new to the Group.

Cat's-eye takes its inspiration from a simple device in a Fantascope, a Victorian magic lantern, to look at ideas of illusion and changing perspective.

Between, meanwhile, is described as 'a short, beautiful solo piece for harp', while Good Night is 'a continuous train of musical thoughts that transform when inspected more closely'. The concert rounds off this current BCMG season.

Leamington Music Festival Weekend

The Royal Pump Rooms, Learnington Spa, Fri 1 - Tues 5 May

This year's get-together is certainly a special one for festival director Richard Phillips. The event will be the one hundredth festival that he'll either have created or directed over the last thirty-eight years.

Proceedings are kickstarted by the Fitzwilliam Quartet, who're joined by Anna Tilbrook to play Mozart's Piano Concerto K414 and Shostakovich's Piano Quintet.

Other highlights of the 2015 event include Raphael Wallfisch - returning with his trio, Shaham Erez Wallfisch - and Roderick Williams, who performs a World War One programme that includes a song by William Denis Browne, a Leamington-born composer who died at Gallipoli

in June 1915. The festival is brought to a close with a performance by the Henschel Quartet from Munich - joined for the first time by Michael Collins to play the Brahms Clarinet Quintet.





English String Orchestra

The Worcestershire-based English String Orchestra here welcomes leading piano and trumpet duo Clare Hammond and Simon Desbruslais for an evening of memorable Russian string music.




For anybody questioning the capacity of classical music to make them 'feel' anything, an evening in the company of the ever-dynamic Grimaud should put paid to their uncertainty. The critically acclaimed classical pianist has garnered a reputation for being a real risk taker, reinventing phrasings, playing in the face of conventional pianistic wisdom and bringing living colour to every composition she performs. took him less than two weeks to compose.
Jeffrey Skidmore conducts and is joined
by mezzo soprano Martha McLorinan and
tenor Jeremy Budd for a piece which Ex
Cathedra describe as 'passionate, serene,
and rooted in a deep and heartfelt faith'.

"After the 2011 riots," recalls Emteaz, "I felt frustrated over the myopic portrayal of working-class young people. It was important to me to write a play which captured the complexity of their lives and the brave, sassy way they negotiate their identity in a wider context."



Blood Brothers Theatre Severn, Shrewsbury

Have you heard the tale of the Johnstone twins? For the benefit of those who haven't - Willy Russell's Blood Brothers is a show that's achieved iconic status in the world of musical theatre. Nicknamed 'the standing ovation musical', it's a gold-star classic that keeps on giving - and the audiences keep on rolling in, too.

Combining humour and heartache in equal measure, it tells the story of Eddie Lyons and Mickey Johnstone. Twins separated at birth, the boys are raised at different ends of the 'class' spectrum, only to be brought together by fate at various stages of their lives before meeting their destiny in a tragic

Top billing this Theatre Severn production was show stalwart Maureen Nolan, who gave a solid performance as the matriarch of the Johnstone clan. Wet Wet Wet frontman Marti Pellow showcased his raspy tones to full effect as the Narrator, lurking Grim Reaper-like in the shadows and doorways to remind us that it'll all end in tears - which, of course, it does.

No matter how many times you see Blood Brothers, you can never properly prepare yourself for that final scene. But there are plenty of laughs to enjoy in the show too, many of which are provided by the young Mickey, Eddie and Linda - wonderfully played by Sean Jones, Joel Benedict and Danielle Corlass respectively.

The show is perfectly cast throughout. Full credit goes to Graham Martin for his instant transformation from posh school master to harassed state school teacher, and to Kate Jarman for her powerful portrayal of the neurotic Mrs Lyons.

Pasty Moss

Rosie Kay: **5 Soldiers**

The REP, Birmingham

Creating a production around a subject about which most people know relatively little is always a difficult task,



British military in a very insightful way. 5 Soliders explores the life of British soldiers - the existence inside the barracks, the training programme and, of course, the experience of war. Having spent several months conducting field research in various military bases, Kay's knowledge is clearly both current and accurate. Her dancers also spent time with soliders, learning various drills and weapon handling - although Kay decided against using actual weapons in the production. The piece as a whole is strong and the dancers are a credit to the choreographer. They manage to portray a discipline usually achieved after years of military training, while at the same time bringing a beautiful, contemporary quality and a real sense of movement to the material. The repetitive structure of quick marches and drills is hypnotising, the dancers moving in a machine-like unit. There are moments of comedy, seduction and pure

emotion. Kay has successfully captured a sense of a somewhat secret world - one in which outsiders aren't welcome.

This is a beautiful, engaging and touching piece. Jamie Ryan ■■■



The Bodyquard Wolverhampton Grand Theatre

One of the most explosive openings in musical theatre brilliantly set the pace for Thea Sharrock's stunning production of The Bodyguard.

There were gunshots, a scuffle - and then we got to meet the dashing Frank Farmer, wonderfully played by Stuart Reid.

It was then full pelt into the opening scene where, resplendent in gold, Alexandra Burke showcased why she's the perfect choice to play Rachel Marron - a role made famous by the late Whitney Houston. Accompanied by an ensemble of ripped dancers in the first of the show's spectacularly choreographed routines, Burke's vocals were sublime. As pyrotechnics intermittently burst from the stage, I found myself hoping that none of the front-row audience members had gone overboard with the hairspray.

Burke displayed a real versatility throughout; her acting was every bit as impressive as her singing. There was neither a note off key nor a foot out of step the whole evening. Delivering her lines with conviction, she shone like the star she is. Very much at ease in the role, her soft American tones didn't falter once.

Melissa James, as Rachel's sister Nicki, deserved equal credit. Possessing the voice of a nightingale, her powerful solos and harmonies with Burke gave me goosebumps. while cute-as-a-button Jhayheim Davis, as Marron's son Fletcher, displayed all the qualities of a star in the making.

Striking lighting design by Mark Henderson ensured Mike Denman's portrayal of Marron's stalker was menacing and creepy in equal measure.

This stunning production was further enhanced by an effectively designed set, an abundance of spectacular costume changes from Tim Hatley, orchestration by Chris Egan, superb video effects by Duncan McLean and first-class performances from each and every one of the supporting cast. As entertainment goes, The Bodyguard is Grade A quality, a true theatrical spectacle that's impressively superior to the film which inspired it. I urge you to go see for yourself. Patsy Moss ■■■■■

This is an amazingly perceptive and timely play. Dr Who writer Steve Thompson takes us only slightly into the future - into a world where the public really are sick of the same old stories and vote for something new; and where Internet forums rule supreme. Sadly, probably the day after tomorrow.

This is a play fizzing with topical traumas. The writing is exceptionally exciting and energetic, and a thunderingly good cast pick up Thompson's jubilant jokes and lancing lines and slice their way through the evening. Gerald Kyd is outstandingly dynamic as the bright-new-dawn PM. Shaun Mason is terrifyingly super-real as his raunchy, goget-'em press advisor. But this is far from a two-way fight. Director Peter Rowe has assembled six hugely talented and versatile ensemble actors. He seems to just wind them up and let them go, each character a star turn in their own right. Meanwhile, the family scenes are a delicately observed haven from the hellfire. Badria Timimi and Aimee Powell tenderly infuse the antidote of love and affection into the lifeblood of their man at No 10... and he protects them from the press with all his sacrificial might. As you might imagine, it all starts to go wrong. Even ideal men are only human. Steve Thompson's message is fearfully clear. We are doomed. He presents a sharply focused picture of a world in which elected democracy is terminally undermined by the clicking classes.

It's a remarkable evening and, I fancy, a landmark production in the history of political theatre. Robin Day would love it. Chris Eldon Lee


Not only an original production, Tigress also features an original score - specifically created for the project - and provides audience members with the chance to play a significant part in making the story of the Mercians come to life.






Lord Of The Dance: Dangerous Games


Red By Night






Pop-up burger joint launched

Flower power in Birmingham

REVIEW

The Botanist has only been open a few weeks - and judging by the crowds spilling out on to the pavement early on a Friday night, it's having no problems making its presence known.

Part of a portfolio of barrestaurants owned by Manchester-based Living Ventures, it looks set to blow a hurricane of fresh air through Birmingham's post-work cocktail scene. Don't expect to find any boring old B52s or margheritas: the overwhelmingly huge botanically-inspired drinks menu includes Rose Mai Tai (pink rose buds with rum, almond and rose syrup, lime juice and rose liqueur) and Bloody Porcini (garlic chive, micro celery, porcini syrup, tomato juice, gin and lime).

Of the sixteen gins on offer I opted for the Hoxtons, which came garnished with grapefruit and coconut to complement the nutty flavours. The cherry blossom martini will

have to wait for another day.

If you're a beer person, there's another lengthy menu. If undecided, simply have both. The Botanist has crafted three miniature cocktails to complement craft beers so a bottle of Innis and Gunn Rum Finish ale comes with a Number One (mint, lime, passion fruit, pineapple and Wray & Nephew rum). After that lot you'll be needing dinner to soak up the booze. We watched ours being prepared by an army of chefs in the open kitchen. We found ourselves sympathising with one young man whose sole job for the evening was to fry chips for the hordes. He did a good job - they came to the table hot and crisp, seasoned to within an inch of their lives with garlic, herbs and salt. The menu is posh pubgrub: the homemade Scotch egg (£5.95) came warm with piccalilli. Saltand-pepper onion petals (£3.50), meanwhile, are 2015's answer to the

soggy onion ring.

There's an extensive list of

deli items to mix and match into your own platter (£9.95), but we went for the more substantial gammon cutlet (£12.50) and chicken & chorizo pie (£10.95), both of which were fine. We could have gone for the Hanging Kebabs (£10.95, and they've gone to the trouble of trademarking them), a fiddly but fun contraption that bastes your dinner with garlic butter at the table.

Desserts are old-school and substantial; the traditional trifle sundae (£4.95), complete with sprinkles, was easily enough for two. The Botanist: it's busy, it's noisy, it's fun and the service is great. Just watch out for hangovers.
