

A bit of Eye Candy in Brum...

Leading names in pop culture, street art, illustration and style will be making their way to Digbeth this month to take part in Eye Candy, a weekend-long celebration of visual pop culture featuring one-off installations, workshops, talks and performances. Amongst the big names to look out for are Fashionista favourite Daisy de Villeneuve, allmale collective of illustrators Brothers Of The Stripe, textile artist Felt Mistress and Parisbased artist Fafi, who makes a rare visit to the city to create a bespoke, wall-based mural.

Eye Candy takes place at Boxxed, a cavernous space in Birmingham's cultural quarter, from 13 to 15 November. For further information, visit www.eyecandyfestival.co.uk



Art Council funding for Warwickshire gallery

Compton Verney, Warwickshire's award-winning independent art gallery, has received a £123,500 investment from Arts Council England (ACE). Part of ACE's National Lottery-funded small-scale Capital programme, the award will enable Compton to install Wi-Fi throughout the Georgian mansion - an improvement benefiting both artists and visitors. The funding will also support the gallery in the replacement and upgrade of its heating, air conditioning and lighting.

Groundbreaking ventriloquist and acclaimed filmmaker Nina Conti is to return to Stratford's Royal Shakespeare Theatre in the new year. Nina, who's previously appeared at the RST as an actor in productions includ-

Six world premieres in Rep's new season

Major revivals of The King's Speech and the Pulitzer Prize-winning Harvey are among the highlights of a Birmingham Rep spring-summer season that also includes six world premieres.

Jason Donovan stars as Australian speech therapist Lionel Logue in The King's Speech, while Mount Pleasant favourite James Dreyfus takes top billing in the Mary Chase comedy, Harvey. The season also features a new production of Jim Cartwright's Olivier Award-winning Rise And Fall Of Little Voice and the visit of hit West Ender Jeeves And Wooster In Perfect Nonsense, starring Robert Webb (Peep Show) and The Young Ones' Christopher Ryan. A new production of legendary musical Oh What A Lovely War commemorates the centenary of World War One.

Commenting on the season line-up, The Rep's artistic director, Roxana Silbert, says: "I'm particularly proud of our commitment to new regional and international work, and this season alone features plays by four local writers and six world premieres."

Putting On The Ritz in Birmingham's King's Heath

Organisers behind a special concert in King's Heath, Birmingham, are hoping to raise significant funds to help create a new Ritz Community Arts Centre & Pop History Museum on the site of the city's old Ritz Ballroom. The 9 November concert at the Kitchen Garden Cafe features award-winning West Midlands group Out Of The Shadows. Public support for the idea of creating a new Ritz Community Arts Centre has so far seen over five hundred people agree to pledge £10 a year, enabling organisers to apply for charitable status and seek lottery funding.

All good at Coventry theatre

Finding innovative ways in which to diversify its existing income streams has certainly paid off for Coventry's Belgrade Theatre. By renting out facilities for events & conferencing and introducing commercial theatre workshop programmes, the venue has significantly increased its earnings. The past year has also seen the Belgrade's audience attendance increase by twelve percent to 164,300, with the theatre staging a

audience attendance increase by twelve percent to 164,300, with the theatre staging a total of four hundred-and-thirty-four performances of seventy productions, five of which were the venue's own.

Debut album from Solihull singer-songwriter

An artist who's supported Amy Winehouse and Ben Howard is to launch his debut album in Birmingham this month. Solihull singer-songwriter Chris Tye's The Paper Grenade is described as 'a collection of truthful, sad, romantic and bruised songs, written and recorded over a period of three years, mixing bare acoustic guitar and vocal tracks with more ambitious string-filled arrangements'.

Chris performs the eleven-track collection, recorded in Birmingham with co-producer Michael Clarke (Ron Sexsmith, Dan Whitehouse), at the city's Glee Club on 23 November, a day before the album's release.



RSC announces casting for Death Of A Salesman

Harriet Walter makes a welcome return to Stratford's Royal Shakespeare Theatre next year to star as Linda Lohan in the RSC's new production of Arthur Miller's Pulitzer Prize-winning play Death Of A Salesman. Joining Walter will be RSC veteran Sir Antony Sher, who'll play her husband, downtrodden salesman Willy Loman. Alex Hassell plays their son, Biff.

Directed by Gregory Doran, the 2015 production marks the centenary of Miller's birth. Walter, who's previously worked with both Doran and Sher, is currently playing King Henry in the all-female production of Henry IV at the Donmar Warehouse.



Dragonboat Festival raises bumper funds for charity

Organisers behind the Brindleyplace Dragonboat Festival are rejoicing after the event raised an astonishing £66,000 in aid of Help Harry Help Others.

The festival celebrated its fifteenth anniversary this year and so far has raised more than \$350,000.



Alexandra Burke to star in The Bodyguard on tour

News that former X Factor winner Alexandra Burke is to star as Rachel Marron in the UK tour of The Bodyguard has delighted fans across the region.

Burke, who's received great acclaim for her portrayal of Marron in the West End production, will appear in all evening performances of the show when it visits Wolverhampton's Grand Theatre (21 April to 2 May) and the Birmingham Hippodrome (5 to 29 August). Zoe Birkett (Priscilla Queen Of The Desert, Thriller Live and Rent) will take the lead in all matinee performances.



Award cements city's standing as 'a major cultural player'

Birmingham Hippodrome and DanceXchange are celebrating after winning the Achievement In Dance Award at the annual UK Theatre Awards.

The award - presented recently at a glittering event in London's prestigious Guildhall - was given in recognition of the 'bold, extensive programming and presentation of International Dance Festival Birmingham 2014'.

Accepting the award, Hippodrome Chief Executive Stuart Griffith (pictured above, left, with DanceXchange's Artistic Director, David Massingham) said: "We're absolutely thrilled to receive this award. This truly is a festival with an international reach, securing the involvement of some of the world's most prominent dance companies, which has helped to establish Birmingham as a major cultural player within the UK. Birmingham to become virtual aviary

More than one hundred individually designed owl statues are to appear on the streets of Birmingham as part of a city-wide art event.

The Big Hoot, which takes place across all ten districts of Birmingham next summer, is the latest high-profile project from public art specialists Wild In Art - the team who last year famously hosted Gromit Unleashed, a similar event in Bristol. On this occasion, Wild In Art is working in partnership with

Birmingham Children's Hospital. Its aim is to showcase the city's wide cultural appeal while at the same time raising half a million pounds for the hospital.

Speaking about the project, Wild In Art's director, Sally-Ann Wilkinson, said: "Our public art projects have a proven track

record of increasing tourism and heightening the profile of our host cities. We're confident that this will continue in Birmingham, as visitors and residents alike discover the city through this unique and visually stunning artistic trail."

Noel Fielding

on why he's glad to be back doing stand-up...

Noel Fielding is about to embark on his first solo tour for five years. The zany comedian, who has an enormously loyal following thanks to TV shows The Mighty Boosh, Noel Fielding's Luxury Comedy and Never Mind The Buzzcocks, is now starring in a brand new show, simply entitled An Evening With Noel Fielding. James Rampton recently caught up with him to find out what audiences can expect...

Noel's inimitable blend of stand-up, animation, music and appearances by some of his best-loved characters, including The Moon, The Dark Side Of The Moon and Fantasy Man, makes for a blinding show. As Noel himself puts it, "You'd be a fool to miss out. Come along, bring your nan. Fancydress optional."

The critics have been queuing up to praise this hugely talented and impressively off-thewall comedian, who can be summed up by all those adjectives beginning with C: charismatic, comic, charming, compelling. The Daily Telegraph calls Noel 'a comedy wunderkind', while The Guardian has described his work as 'a neo-psychedelic riot of mirth'. And Phill Jupitus labels him 'a Gothic George Best'.

The five years away from the live arena have only whetted Noel's appetite for stand-up. He can't wait to get back in front of an audience. The performer, who's spent the last few years occupied by semi-animated E4 show Noel Fielding's Luxury Comedy, begins by underlining that nothing beats the rush generated by live work.

generated by live work. "The problem with TV is that it takes years to make, and after a while you can't remember what it's like to tell a joke and get a laugh from it. The great thing about live comedy is that it cuts out the middle men - all those TV producers and directors. It takes out everything that gets in the way, so it's just you and the audience. It's a really pure setup."

Because it's so deeply original and innovative, Noel's comedy can divide people. But he thinks that the infectious nature of his stand-up show can help to win over the agnostics. "Some people might think they're allergic to you, but if they come to a live show and see everyone laughing, it's hard to say that it's not funny. It was the same with the Boosh. Sceptics were convinced when they came to our shows.

"As a stand-up, you spend all day being nervous. But as soon as you step onto the stage and get the first laugh, it's 'magic time'. It's like being in a dream. It's a real buzz."

Noel, who for many years has been a highly

popular team captain on BBC2's longrunning pop quiz, Never Mind The Buzzcocks, is also relishing the prospect of touring the country.

"It's great," he enthuses. "You get to visit all these nice places you've never been to before. When you arrive at a lot of towns, you just go, 'Wow!'"

The comedian will be joined on stage by the loose stylings of his brother Michael Fielding (best known as Naboo and Smooth from The Mighty Boosh) and the physical lunacy of Tom Meeten (who plays Andy Warhol in Noel Fielding's Luxury Comedy).

"The first half is set in a cabaret club," he reveals. "Then I get kidnapped from my own show, and in the second half the rest of the characters have to find me. I'll be playing other characters during the second half. It becomes like a play. It's a sort of farce." The show promises a typically uplifting variety of disparate elements. "That's why I've called it An Evening With Noel Fielding, because it's not something I'd usually do. It's more like something Barry Humphries would do."

The evening will also feature music that Noel's composed with Serge Pizzorno from Kasabian, and some characteristically entrancing stand-up routines.

"I touch on turning forty and my Peter Pan complex. Because I'm now forty, I try to do a bleak bit, but of course it soon becomes completely fantastical. I attempt to go gritty, but I can't help going fantasy."

As an example, Noel says he's been working up the character of Chicken Man. "He's like a figure from a Jodorowsky Spaghetti Western. He's half man, half chicken. He has to fight a bandit, and he's got Tourette's. He's like a cross between A Streetcar Named Desire and Foghorn Leghorn. He keeps flipping in and out of madness."

Noel's comedy is always richly imaginative, but can he tell if he's gone too far? "No!" laughs the comedian, who's also acted in The IT Crowd, Nathan Barley and Garth Marenghi's Darkplace. "Locked away in North London for years making Noel Fielding's Luxury Comedy, we'd think, 'Let's do something based on William Blake's painting, The Ghost Of A Flea.' That could be very self-indulgent. But it could only exist on telly. Doing stand-up, you're edited by the audience. If you take too mad a line, you'll lose people. But on the other hand, if something is getting big laughs, it'll never leave the show. There are certain things that you just know will work. At one point I play a herbal tea bag. I knew that would strike a chord because everyone has tea.

"The Chicken Man was more of a gamble, but people really seem to like him. They're also really enjoying a section where Tom plays Antonio Banderas and Michael plays Hawkeye, the living embodiment of the tennis line judge. It's great to think up these ideas and then watch them take flight. The show's so abstract. It's like you turn the radio dial and something random comes on. You're not quite sure what it is, but you warm to it."

So what does the comic hope that audiences will take away from the evening?

"I hope they have a really good time. I hope they laugh their heads off. I've always been very concerned not to sell people short. But the only danger is that the show ends up as long as the film Gandhi! I suppose if it doesn't work, I'll have to do something else, like maybe breed shire horses!"

The only drawback about touring, as far as Noel's concerned, is that "You're buzzing with adrenaline when you come off stage. You have to do something with that, and it's very hard not to go and get drunk. In the old days, we'd give the Rolling Stones a run for their money with our after-show behaviour. But now I'm in my forties, I have to find new ways to calm myself down. Like Mick Jagger, I'll have to get fit. After the show, Michael and I used to go drinking. This time we'll have to go to mazes and local markets and drink peppermint tea. It's the Peppermint Tea Tour. I should have called it that!"

Story of the ring...

The world famous Mariinsky Opera visits the Midlands this month. Under the leadership of its Artistic & General Director, the legendary Valery Gergiev, the company will perform in its entirety Wagner's Ring Cycle, an epic production with a total playing time of fifteen hours...

Written by German composer Richard Wagner across a period of approximately twenty-six years, from 1848 to 1874, the gargantuan Ring Cycle takes the umbrella title of The Ring Of The Nibelung, and is a cycle of four epic operas: Das Rheingold (The Rhine Gold); Die Walküre (The Valkyrie); Siegfried; and Götterdämmerung (Twilight Of The Gods).

A composition of extraordinary scale, it relates a fantastical tale of gods, heroes, dwarves and giants, and the ongoing struggle across three generations to harness the magical power of the eponymous Ring, which grants its owner domination over the entire world.

Claims that Wagner's Ring Cycle inspired the Birmingham-raised JRR Tolkien to write his fantasy novel The Lord Of The Rings were emphatically denied by the author, who memorably stated that "both rings were round, and there the resemblance ceases". The similarities that exist between the two are hardly surprising, though, as Tolkien drew upon much of the same source material as Wagner, including the thirteenth century Icelandic Völsunga Saga.

As is usual with the Ring Cycle, this Mariinsky Opera version is presented across

four separate dates. In total, the cycle's playing time is approximately fifteen hours, with the final and longest work, Götterdämmerung, taking up to five hours,

excluding intervals. The Artistic & General Director of the Mariinsky Theatre, the renowned Valery Gergiev, is bringing two hundred-and-fifty company members from St Petersburg to Birmingham Hippodrome to perform this particular production of the Cycle, which he

conceived in 2003. Because of its size, it's been seen in only a few venues worldwide. Willard White, who stars as Woton, the chief of the gods, is confident that The Ring Cycle will have great appeal for opera newcomers as well as for die-hard fans.

"It's a wonderful story of an interpretation of the beginning of an era," said Willard in a recent Classic FM webchat. "It's a very human experience, and the whole Ring is actually connected to choice and conflicts. It's like life!"

One of Gergiev's company is the Chicagoborn Christian Knapp. An assistant conductor who steps in for Gergiev when his busy schedule means he can't make a rehearsal, Christian can still clearly recall the first time he met the maestro. "Gergiev sent for me, gave me a long lecture for about an hour, and then threw me in at the deep end by getting me to conduct Richard Strauss' Elektra - that really was a baptism of fire! That was in 2011, and since then I've conducted many productions, but this is my first full season on the books as a conductor."

Stepping in for the maestro is one thing; but how does Knapp feel when, having himself done so much of the musical preparation for a production, Gergiev turns up and takes over?

"I just get on with it! There are a lot of opportunities for achievement here at the Mariinsky Theatre. I've built a great relationship with the singers and am involved in the entire process, from its beginning up to its premiere."

The Hippodrome's presentation of the Ring Cycle is the largest Midlands event in the 2014 UK-Russia Year of Culture.

Frasey Ford

Glee Club, Birmingham, Wed 19 November

With her music heavily influenced by the energy of the 1960s - a time when her parents moved to a Canadian commune to escape the Vietnam War -Frazey is best known as lead singer of Vancouver trio The Be Good Tanyas. Presenting a mellow, folk-infused sound, the British Columbia-born singer-songwriter's first two solo albums - Obadiah and the recently released Indian Ocean - show she's unafraid of searching her soul to find her lyrics, which she then sings in buttery-sweet vocals.



The Wailers

O2 Academy, Birmingham, Sat 8 November

This is a band that needs no introduction. Originally curated in Kingston, Jamaica, in 1969 by Bob Marley, Bunny Wailer and Peter Tosh, The Wailers had one ambition and one ambition only - to reach an international audience. In doing so, the band took their inspiration from the Rastafari movement and introduced the sound of reggae to the world. Together with Marley, The Wailers have sold in excess of two hundred-and-fifty million albums worldwide, playing across the globe in the process. Having played at countless festivals this summer, including Glastonbury and V, they're here performing the album Legend in its entirety.

Kasabian

LG Arena, Birmingham, Sat 22 November

"It could be the littlest thing from any track that inspires us," says Kasabian singer Tom Meighan, "even a rubbish track might have a little sound in there that appeals to us."

There are certainly no shortage of influences evident in Kasabian's music - The Stones, The Doors, The Beatles, Motown, Chuck Berry, Roy Orbison, The Four Tops, The Supremes. Add in a little Ennio Morricone and early Pink Floyd and it's easy to see why this hugely successful Leicester band appeal to such a wide range of people.





Peter Gabriel

LG Arena, Birmingham, Fri 28 November

Peter Gabriel has never been a man to rest on his laurels. As well as being the lead vocalist and flautist of legendary rockers Genesis, he's also enjoyed a hugely successful solo career. And he's made plenty of headway as a humanitarian activist too, co-founding Womad, the Witness human rights organisation and The Elders, a group of global leaders working together for peace and human rights. Inducted into the Rock And Roll Hall Of Fame both as a member of Genesis and, in 2014, as a solo artist, Gabriel returns to Birmingham with his career-spanning Back To Front show.

Paloma Faith

Symphony Hall, Birmingham, Mon 10 November; Civic Hall, Wolverhampton, Sat 22 November


A familiar presence on the London underground circuit for several years, the multi-talented Paloma Faith eventually broke into the mainstream thanks to her theatrical image and retro-soul sound. After turning down an opportunity to join Amy Winehouse's band, she began writing and performing her own songs, and soon earned a reputation as one of the capital's most unique and flamboyant live acts.

Faith's sixty-six-date tour follows the release of her third album, A Perfect Contradiction, which debuted at number two on the UK Albums Chart.

MUSIC PREVIEWS

Twin Atlantic

The Institute, Birmingham, Sat 1 Nov Influenced by fellow Scottish rockers Biffy Clyro, Sam, Barry, Ross and Craig made the decision to pursue music, practised like crazy - and soon found themselves fired from their jobs. Seven years later their sound has really taken off, with their single, Free, being used as the official soundtrack to Felix Baumgartner's record-breaking jump from space. Third album Great Divide was released this summer, and the single Heart And Soul has already been crowned 'hottest record in the world' by Zane Lowe. Taking on their biggest tour to date, the Glaswegians here play to a sold-out audience.



Carl Barât & The Jackals

The Sugarmill, Stoke-on-Trent, Mon 17 November; Kasbah, Coventry, Tues 18 November

This new project by Libertines and Dirty Pretty Things frontman Carl Barât is set to take the UK indie rock scene by storm. Having decided he wanted a new challenge alongside his Libertines commitment, Barât posted ads online asking if there were any likeminded souls who wanted to try their luck at playing with him. The response was overwhelming and The Jackals were born. Debut single The Glory Days is available as a free download, with the band's first album set for release in early 2015. Catch them here at this intimate warm-up show.



The Old Dance School

Artrix, Bromsgrove, Sun 2 November Taking their name from the old Betty Fox School of Ballet in Birmingham, The Old Dance School are a septet of musicians whose provocative songs and cinematic sound have been championed by BBC Radio Two's Bob Harris.

"Our live shows chart our journey," say the band, "from ballet school basement jam sessions and cowshed rehearsals to remote lighthouses and headline appearances at international festivals."

Along the way, they've created all manner of ear-bending contemporary folk landscapes, their duelling fiddles, soaring brass crescendos and irresistible grooves marking them out as true innovators within their chosen genre.



Lee 'Scratch' Perry

SU Bar, Warwick University, Coventry, Thurs 27 November

Charismatic Jamaican legend Lee is getting on a wee bit nowadays, having earlier this year celebrated his seventy-eighth birthday. Not that age is any barrier to continued success for this innovative reggae producer, whose early adoption of remixing techniques marked him out as one of the pioneers of dub music. One of Rolling Stone Magazine's top one hundred artists of all time, Perry has worked with, among others, Bob Marley And The Wailers, Junior Murvin, the Congos and Max Romeo. "I find the inspiration for my music in love," says Lee, "love and comics. In comic books, good triumphs over evil, just like in my music."

Beardyman

The Institute, Birmingham, Sun 23 November

Darren Foreman, better known as Beardyman, is a British musician from London renowned for his beatboxing skills and use of live looping technology. Becoming UK Beatbox Champion in 2006 and retaining his title the following year - making him the first beatboxer in UK history to win two consecutive championships - he released twenty-track debut offering I Done A Album in 2011. This UK tour comes in support of his eagerly awaited second album, Distractions, which is released this month.

Gregory Porter

Symphony Hall, Birmingham, Tues 11 November

Brooklyn-based vocalist and songwriter Gregory Porter has been called 'one of the most captivating voices in contemporary jazz'. Not bad for a fella who didn't follow his dream of becoming a professional musician until he was nearly forty - a step he took to fulfill his dying mother's wish for him.

A move from Southern California to New York kickstarted his success story, which last year saw his album, Liquid Spirit, bag a coveted Grammy Award. This sold-out show is sure to captivate.



Submotion Orchestra

Submotion Orchestra are a seven-piece live project from Leeds whose influences include jazz, dubstep, soul, ambient and electronica. The band have performed in both the UK and Europe, with highlights including appearances at Bestival and Latitude and a recent support slot for Ms. Lauryn Hill at the Outlook Festival opening ceremony in Croatia. Following two critically acclaimed albums, Finest Hour and Fragments, they return bigger and brighter with Alium - their first album for Counter Records - which they're supporting with this current tour.



Classical Music PREVIEWS



Andrea Bocelli

LG Arena, Birmingham, Fri 21 November

One of the world's most acclaimed classical music stars, Italian tenor Andrea Bocelli this month stops off in Birmingham as part of a four-date UK tour. The biggest-selling solo artist of all time, Bocelli has performed for four US presidents, two popes and the royal family. He's sung at ceremonies for the Olympic Games and the World Cup, and been praised by Luciano Pavarotti, Jose Carreras and Renee Fleming. Celine Dion, meanwhile, once introduced him by declaring: "I heard someone say that if God had a singing voice, he'd sound a lot like Andrea Bocelli." Bocelli here performs songs from his extensive repertoire, including several from latest album Passione, a work influenced by the artist's pre-fame days spent singing in bars and taking requests for popular tunes like Girl From Ipanema and Elvis' Love Me Tender.

The maestro will be joined by two yet-to-be-announced guests. One, a soprano, will accompany him through the classical section; the other, a pop star, will join him to perform a selection of works from his chart career.

Orchestra Of The Swan

The Stratford-based Orchestra Of The Swan are here joined by Czech conductor Marek Stilec and his colleague, pianist Kasumi Barouch, for an evening of works entitled Mozart And The Czech Connection.

Overture: Avanti - a piece by one of the Czech Republic's most esteemed composers, Sylvia Bodorova - opens the evening's proceedings, and is followed by Mozart's Piano Concerto No.27, Rossini's Overture: Barber Of Seville, and Voříšek's Symphony in D.





Takács String Quartet



Around The World In 80 Days

David Hare's acclaimed play centres around the relationship between Oscar Wilde and Lord Alfred Douglas, concentrating on two critical points during Wilde's final years - the eve of his arrest at the Cadogan Hotel and a night in Naples after his release from two years' imprisonment. The production contains both male and female nudity and has been deemed unsuitable for young people below the age of fourteen.

Slava's Snowshow

Trailing in its wake all manner of plaudits, gongs and awards, Slava's Snowshow is a truly unique production. "I love Monty Python too," he adds, "they were a great intellectual team, never mind about the humour!"

Imagine his surprise, then, when he suddenly finds himself coming faceto-face with the very creature that he's imagined!



We're Going On A Bear Hunt

mac, Birmingham, Sat 22 November - Sun 7 December Suitable for children aged two-plus, this Little Angel Theatre adaptation of Michael Rosen and Helen Oxenbury's popular picture book follows the exciting adventures of a family as they head out on an intrepid quest to find a bear. Catchy songs and enchanting puppets are combined with no shortage of swishy swashy grass and oozy, squelchy mud in a show that seems certain to keep youngsters well and truly entertained.



The Christmas Truce

Royal Shakespeare Theatre, Stratford-upon-Avon, Sat 29 November - Sat 31 January

Despite its First World War backdrop, Phil Porter's The Christmas Truce is very much a family play, recommended for children aged nine and older. Presented by the RSC to commemorate the one hundredth anniversary of the Great War, it's set on the Western Front in December 1914, inspired by true events, and focuses on the men of the Warwickshire Regiment. As they shelter in their trenches, they hear the German soldiers singing Christmas carols, and pretty soon find themselves joining their enemies in no-man's land; to talk, exchange gifts and celebrate the festive season. In a world devoid of any peace or goodwill, for a brief time the soldiers decide to live according to their own rules - and as their truce continues, they engage in an unforgettable game of football...

The BFG

The REP, Birmingham, Wed 26 November - Sat 17 January

Roald Dahl's delightful tale has been enchanting children and the adults in their lives for over thirty years now. The story follows the adventures of a little girl named Sophie, who's taken to a magical land by the Big Friendly Giant (or BFG, for short). There, he teaches her whizzpopping, shows her his secret collection of dreams and lets her taste his extraordinary food, the snozzcumber. When it becomes apparent a tribe of boghumping giants are planning to rampage through England, Sophie and the BFG realise they must save the country from unprecedented disaster... Dahl named the heroine in his book after his very own granddaughter, who was only five at the time The BFG was published, but who later became a high-profile fashion model and author.

Gloriator - Spitz & Co

Artrix, Bromsgrove, Sat 15 November

When was the last time you laughed nonstop for a full hour? One journalist reviewing Gloriator asked that very question at the beginning of her critique, going on to explain that Spitz & Co's first ever show had provoked just such a reaction from her. Indeed, she 'hooted', 'snorted' and 'exploded with such mirth' that the tears streamed down her face. With other reviewers having called the production 'wildly inventive and hilarious' and 'belly-achingly funny', we definitely recommend a trip to Bromsgrove to see what all the fuss is about. Inspired by the epic swordand-sandal movie Gladiator, Spitz & Co describe their offering as 'an awe-inspiring production of bravery, honour - and costumes made out of cardboard'.

The Wind In The Willows

A firm family favourite, Kenneth Grahame's classic story ably demonstrates the way in which one life can command the full attention of three others! Mole, Badger and Ratty simply don't have time for any of their own interests - they're far too busy having to look after their reckless and irrepressible friend, Toad... The Wind In The Willows is here brought to the stage by acclaimed touring troupe Oddsocks. Zany humour is a guarantee.

Horrible Christmas



Blood Brothers

Birmingham Hippodrome

This was my most euphoric theatrical experience since watching my very first musical, West Side Story, aged just fourteen. Celebrating its twentyninth anniversary, Willy Russell's heartbreaking family masterpiece deserved its standing ovation and reduced me to tears!

Blood Brothers tells the powerful story of twin boys Mickey and Eddie, who're separated at birth by their single mother - the pivotal role of Mrs Johnstone is here taken by Maureen Nolan. Eventually the two lads become great pals, though remain unaware of the fact that they're siblings - but their friendship eventually brings tragic consequences. The devastating impact which social class has on life opportunities is powerfully depicted through impressive performances by Sean Jones as the working-class Mickey and Joel Benedict as the middle-class Eddie.

The emotional intensity of the Johnstone family's experiences moved me deeply, and is undoubtedly the key to Blood Brothers' universal success. Marvellous performances and outstanding music - especially Shoes Upon The Table, as sung by the Narrator (Kristofer Harding) - made this an evening I'll never forget.

Inala Symphony Hall, Birmingham

It's not every day that a Zulu ballet comes to town. And when the dancers are accompanied by live music in the form of Ladysmith Black Mambazo one of Africa's greatest singing groups - it's an event not to be missed.

Teaming those nine singers with eleven classical and contemporary dancers from, among other companies, Rambert and the Royal Ballet was an imaginative if risky move on the part of choreographer Mark Baldwin and composer Ella Spira. For the most part it succeeded beautifully, creating a beguiling show that had the audience on its feet by the finale.

The performance is designed to celebrate twenty years of democracy in South Africa, with the choreography loosely telling the story of a day in the life of the country. A mix of landscapes and soundscapes, relaxed rural birdsong, farmers and fishermen gave way at the climax to the excited noises and dangers of urban streets and traffic. I can't pretend to have understood what was happening throughout, but the cheery chemistry between the singers and dancers meant it didn't really matter; this was a show to jump into and enjoy. And while the soul-stirring harmonies of Ladysmith Black Mambazo were worth the ticket price alone, the interaction between all the performers, including a terrific backing band, added a feelgood factor that made for a wonderful night. Top Hat Wolverhampton Grand Theatre

It's tough enough being the understudy in a straight play, having to store and retain all those lines in one's memory for weeks on end. Imagine, then, how much more difficult it's sure to be when there are thousands of rapid dance steps to compute too. So when the signs went up at Wolverhampton Grand Theatre advising that the part of Jerry Travers was to be played by Ben Palmer (promoted from a lowly role), I worried for him. But I needn't have.

Travers is, of course, the character Fred Astaire played in the 1930s movie version. Mr Palmer was his match in every department - from spats and taps to waggish gags and a loveable boyish grin. His footwork was fabulous, his enthusiasm infectious, his comic timing immaculate. His personal chemistry with the leading lady fizzed like pink champagne. Charlotte Gooch, in the Ginger Rogers role of Dale Tremont, was equally impressive, kicking so high it was positively dangerous.

The comedy was remarkably fresh too, considering the jokes were all eighty years old and peppered a plot device that dated back beyond Shakespeare.

The dance routines were dazzling and the choreography of Wild About You made me laugh out loud. The slick, sliding set worked a treat; the chorus line was all teeth and tempo; the orchestra, full blown. Opulence abounded. It was all terribly confident and clever. The original film was designed to lift the spirits in the midst of recession. This new stage tour is doing exactly the same - only this time it's live and in glorious technicolour. *Chris Eldon Lee*

Disney On Ice: 100 Years Of Magic National Indoor Arena, Birmingham

A long, long time ago, before 'Frozen mania' gripped the world, there existed a host of classic Disney movies much loved by children everywhere.

And how better to relive the magic of those favourites - Aladdin, Beauty And The Beast, Finding Nemo, Pinocchio, The Lion King - than by seeing them magically brought to life on the ice!

After the success of Worlds Of Fantasy earlier in the year, Disney On Ice 100 Years Of Magic is a further delight for die-hard fans to enjoy.

A total of sixty characters from Walt's vaults appear in this ice-skating extravaganza, which boasts exactly the sort of slick perfection and stunning choreography one would expect from a world-class brand.

A veritable feast for the eyes, the production begins with the genie from Aladdin. Then it's the turn of all the original Disney princesses, including Belle, Cinderella, Jasmine and Ariel, to take to the ice in their fairytale gowns, performing to the fitting score of One Day My Prince Will Come.

Next up were Pinocchio and Jiminy Cricket. Even though many children in the audience may have struggled to name these two vintage Disney favourites, they were nonetheless captivated by their performance, which came complete with giant whale and a Wish Upon A Star singalong.

Marching toy soldiers filled the stage for the arrival of Toy Story characters Woody, Buzz Lightyear and Jessie, much to the delight of screaming youngsters. This was the biggest crowd-pleaser of the evening.

However, it was a delightful scene from Mulan which was the most visually spectacular, complete with a dramatic swordfight under a flurry of snow, and a stunning Chinese dragon. This homage to some of the best-loved cinematic characters of yesteryear is positively bursting with Disney magic, and is an absolute must-see for anyone who wants their Happily Ever After even if only for a couple of hours. Disney On Ice 100 Years Of Magic shows at the NIA, Birmingham, until Sunday 2 November.





Solomon And Marion The REP, Birmingham

Janet Suzman has been a towering presence on the world stage for as long as I can remember. She was born in Johannesburg in 1939... so she's now seventy-five, and completely undiminished. She has a quiet, uncluttered command of the stage and her lines. She's very matter-offact, yet brimming with deep, undemonstrative emotion. She almost invites her audience to reach down into her soul and draw the words out for her. I find her mesmeric; but in this play she's met her equal in a young, naturally talented, black South African actor named Khayalethu Anthony.

Together they play Solomon and Marion. He is her former servant's grandson, emerging from his warrior class. She is a middle class white landowner with a lethargic heart, more that a little fearful about the new democracy. So when Solomon turns up in her living room for the first time in years, Marion feels threatened.

How she lowers her defences and what his purpose really is are the substance of an endearing first period of the play in which they establish how their new relationship should work. He calls her 'Miss Marion', she calls him 'my boy'. Both object until it becomes clear they are both terms of affection and respect.

But the play explodes like a pressure cooker once the truth tumbles out and a past moment is startlingly re-enacted. Suddenly the atmosphere is electric. The background to Lara Foot's script is the awful regularity of meaningless murders and death from AIDS, which still haunts South Africa. Both characters have lost close family, and both feel they have little else to lose. That at least is a commonality in two characters who are cultures apart.

As a pen portrait of South Africa's present problems, Solomon And Marion is superb. So much telling detail is pressed into seventy-five spare minutes. Twenty years after the apparent abolition of apartheid,

the tensions are just skin deep - no matter what colour your skin is. But whilst there are Solomons and Marions, there is hope. And whilst there are actors of the quality of Khayalethu and Janet, thank God their stories will be told. Chris Eldon Lee



West Indies To West Midlands

Documentary photographer Ines Elsa Dalal is a rising star on Birmingham's creative scene, and here presents an exhibition designed both to commemorate the centenary of the First World War and coincide with The Drum's Commonwealth World War One Programme. The display launches an ambitious four-year project to create a contemporary photographic archive documenting the contribution of West Indian service personnel. "I utilise reportage photography as a way of gaining knowledge and understanding of different perspectives," explains Ines, "and of documenting a diverse spectrum of people of varying nationalities. My Swiss, German, Italian and Indian heritage is a natural catalyst for my fascination with Birmingham's kaleidoscopic culture."



Bruce Bairnsfather

The life and illustrative work of soldier-artist Captain Bruce Bairnsfather is explored in this fascinating new exhibition. Indeed, the illustrator's work was so popular that published volumes of his cartoons sold a staggering million-plus copies, and captured the imagination not only of the soldiers they depicted but also of their families back home... The exhibition is curated in collaboration with leading Bairnsfather expert Mark Warby, and also takes a look at the artist's personal connections to Stratford-upon-Avon and the Royal Shakespeare Company.



What happens if you let children be restaurant critics? This is what Fierce Festival decided to find out. During October, a group of twelve-year-olds from Wheelers Lane Technology College visited five Birmingham restaurants, giving their uncensored opinions on the food, service and décor to members of the public who'd paid to eat amongst them.

The group savoured Italian food at Piccolino, where they saw the pizza chef twirling dough; Mexican at Bodega, where they learned to mix a virgin moiito: and Indian at Manzils, where the waiters taught them napkin folding and how to lay a table. They also had a taste of Polish cuisine surrounded by animal furs at The Karczma, and a fine dining experience at Simpsons, one of Birmingham's Michelin-starred restaurants.

#### JOSHUA'S REVIEW

It was curious, not knowing what the food would be like or who I would be sitting with. Simpsons from the outside seemed more like a large, elegant house.

We received a warm welcome and sat in front of the fire on comfy settees, drinking lemon juice or blackcurrant.

A disappointing fact - the table hadn't been cleared before we sat down, so we marvelled at the size of someone else's bill!

We inspected the kitchens - all very clean - and met the chefs, all very friendly. We were then shown to a table in the conservatory. The table looked beautiful with white linen. Majestic smells wafted from the kitchen. Our co-guests were friendly, and we settled down to the reason we came - the food.

I began with an amuse bouche (something to make your mouth happy) of coconut curry soup, followed by lobster for the first time in my life. It was delicious.

My main was cod with chicken wings. Although I didn't think the wings worked, the cod was exquisite.

Pudding was chocolate soufflé with coffee ice cream, and it was awe-some.

Wonderful food and great service meant my bouche was most definitely amused!


