





### Get in on the moves...

A chance to perform at this year's Dance Show - part of Clothes Show Live at Birmingham's NEC in December - is just one of the prizes on offer at a competition to be held in the city this month. A partnership between Punch and International Dance Festival Birmingham 2012, Desi Moves sees six groups/individuals present a fusion dance act to celebrity judges, with Bhangra, Bollywood, Giddha, street dance and bashment styles all incorporated. An impromptu audience dance - choreographed and led by a famous dancer - also features. Desi Moves forms part of the Cultural Olympiad's Dancing For The Games project, and will take place at Birmingham's Town Hall on 18 May. #### Transport museum awarded lottery fundina

Coventry Transport Museum has announced that it's received the green light to move on from the first stage of its application for lottery funding. The popular visitor attraction has been awarded an undisclosed sum, which will enable it to proceed to the next level of the application process, where, if successful, it will be awarded £4.9million from the Heritage Lottery Fund. A major redevelopment of the museum's exhibition spaces, together with plans to bring the city's Grade One Listed Old Grammar School back into public use, form the basis for the project, which promises to provide enhanced opportunities for people to learn about, and get involved with, Coventry's rich transport heritage.





### Local designer crossing bounda

Fusing his eclectic range of skills as a designer, composer and drummer, JoJo Remeny this month heads to Birmingham's Adrian Boult Hall to showcase the world premiere of his symphony, Bombay Is Weeping - a production that fuses Indian, Western classical and jazz. Birmingham Conservatoire-trained JoJo is bringing together Conservatoire students and Birmingham musicians in an orchestra of eighty to accompany a fashion show of his couture clothing, all of which reflects the diversity of the city.

Spending his formative years in the care of Father Hudson's children's orphanage, JoJo's creative passion earned him an apprenticeship with an Italian tailor. Now, in his most adventurous project to date, he hopes to be able to give something back to the community via Crossing Boundaries, an event which it's hoped will raise much-needed funds for Selly Oak's St Mary's Hospice. The exhibition includes outfits worn in the hit TV drama series Downton Abbey, displayed alongside a

dress worn by Helena Bonham Carter when she portrayed Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother in the King's Speech. Items which featured in Madonna's recent film, WE, are also included. The Drama Queens exhibition shows at Himley Hall until 17 June.



### West Brom students take centre stage...

## **Isy Suttie** Peep Show actress in the Midlands...

Although best recognised for playing the softly spoken Dobby in the award-winning Peep Show, the lovely lsy Suttie is also an accomplished musician, songwriter and stand-up comedian, all of which will be greatly in evidence when she stops off at two Midlands venues this month. What's On caught up with the Derbyshire lass to talk about what audiences can expect, and what it's like being compared to Victoria Wood...

#### For those not familiar with you as a standup comedian, how would you define your show?

Well, it's a story about my pen pal and his relationship with a woman. It's got a bit of stand-up in it and quite a lot of tomfoolery. There's quite a lot of music too, but generally it's a play based around the characters Pearl and Dave. Sometimes I sing as them, sometimes I speak as them, and sometimes I sing as myself. It kind of goes in and out of songs, but basically it's just like a long story.

#### Is there any audience interaction that forces you to digress from the story?

No, I don't think it's that kind of a show, to be honest. It's a gentle show, and I've not been heckled yet...

### So how old were you when you decided you wanted to become an entertainer?

I was very young; probably from when I first learned to speak. I think my first word was "encore". No, I did a lot of amateur stuff when I was little, and it was always my plan to write and perform. But even now I can't believe I've actually done it.

### You started out in acting, so how did you end up doing comedy?

I'd been writing songs since I was ten or eleven, always together with the acting. I always thought that maybe I could be a singer alongside being an actress, so I always wrote stuff. When I went to drama school, I didn't really know that you could make a living being a comic. It didn't really occur to me, because I was in guite a theatrical setting. I think if I'd gone to university, then I might have started writing sketches and stuff, but that didn't really happen at college. But I did go in for a songwriting competition there, and it was such a great feeling when everybody started to laugh at the song I'd written. I'd never had that feeling before, because up until then I'd always written serious songs. I decided to do it in a stupid voice at the very last minute. It was just such a great feeling, and I guess I became addicted, although I didn't really take the plunge until I was twenty-two or twenty-three.

### Can you remember the time when you thought, "right, this is it, I'm on my way!"?

I don't think there was a single moment. Certainly with the acting, it was when I joined Peep Show. I'd done bits of telly before that, but nothing people would remember, because they were really small parts. With stand-up, it was probably when I did my first solo Edinburgh show in 2007, which was before Peep Show. I remember when I'd finished I couldn't believe that I'd done an hour. I didn't really care whether it was good quality or not. When you start off in stand-up, you do about five minutes and you can't believe that you'll ever manage seven. Then, when you've done seven, you can't ever imagine doing fifteen. So when you get to an hour, well...

#### As an accomplished musician and songwriter, who and what influences your writing most?

I like all kinds of musicians, really. I really like Frank Zappa, Rufus Wainwright and Tom Waits. Tom is so funny he could have been a stand-up. I like all different styles - people like Tim Minchin and Johnny Vegas. I remember Johnny was one of the first standups that I saw live. It was in Edinburgh, and I was about eighteen. I just thought, "wow, what an incredible experience!". It was so fast and so raw, but I never thought it was something that I'd end up doing. The thing that I try to do is make my songs as specific as possible. A lot of them have me playing people I know; songs where I try and focus on their particular idiosyncracies. Sometimes I make people up, but in the main they're based on people I've met.

### Is there a fellow female comedian who's inspired you most?

No, I generally just like things that I find funny. When I was younger, I didn't really watch stand-ups and think "I'd like to be like that". I just wanted to go to London and make money out of acting and writing.

### So what are your thoughts on the comparisons between you and Victoria Wood?

Even though she's wonderful, I've hardly watched any of her stuff. I think I've seen three of her songs in my whole life, so I find it really funny when people say, "well, she's not as funny as Victoria Wood!" because it's not something that I'm trying to be. I've met her in real life and she's lovely. She's wonderful, and when I've seen little bits of her work, I've thought, "Oh, I don't want to watch anymore in case I do think we're really similar". Also, I think, "what if I watch one of her songs and then, a year later on stage, I come out with 'beat me on the bottom with a Woman's Weekly'?" Since the comparisons, I've consciously avoided watching her, but I'm always very chuffed to be compared to her.

### What was your most memorable moment when filming Peep Show?

It was definitely the cupboard scene, but only because it was very awkward. I'd only met David Mitchell a short while before, and there we were crammed into this tiny cupboard and everyone was saying "this scene is either going to be really great or really awful, we don't know which, so you're just going to have to go for it". It was just a case of getting on with it. The funniest scene was - I think it was the series before last when we were using the fire extinguishers, and had to spray them all over each other. We were so very cold and wet afterwards, but It was really fun to do because I'd never used a fire extinguisher before.

### What was it like being part of such a hugely popular TV series?

At the beginning I was quite quiet and shy,

but David and Robert were both really lovely to work with, and they made me feel really welcome.

#### How much were you personally able to develop Dobby as a character, or were you told "this is how she's got to be"? I suppose there was a bit of both, really. Often when you go for auditions, you're told

she's got to be like this, and this, and this, and you do it as best you can. I think when I auditioned, she was going to be a bit more of a goth - I certainly think they'd planned for her to be a little less girly. Her costumes were always a bit quirky, and I guess it was a process of discovery. Initially when I joined, I just read what was in the script, but over the years, as I've got to know the writers better, a bit more of me has gone into the character.

#### Any plans for more Peep Show?

Yeah, we're doing the next one in August, and I guess it'll probably screen before the end of the year.

### Is there a particular artist who you'd really like to collaborate with?

Steve Coogan, I suppose. When I was growing up, me and my mates just really loved watching Brass Eye and The Day Today. I think Alan Partridge is the best comedy creation ever, and I love Saxondale and Tony Ferrino. Everything he's done, really...

### You've been described as 'one of the nicest women in showbusiness'. What's that about?

Oh, that's probably my mum. No, I think they're referring to the fact that I'm quite upbeat and positive. I can't ever see why that would change, because even when I've gone through hard times in my life, I've not become a hard-hitting political comic as a result of it. I've always managed to get back on the horse, so to speak. It's my nature to tackle things head on. Although you never know - maybe I've got a dark period ahead of me where I'll turn into a female Frankie Boyle and people will then say, "she's the nastiest woman in showbusiness but she used to be the nicest - how can she have fallen so far?".

### What's the best thing that could happen to you professionally?

It would have to be making a sitcom. I'm working on a pilot at the moment with my mate, and it's going to be a sitcom with songs in it. I'd really love to write and perform in the same production.

## Elaine C Smith Dreams a dream in Birmingham...

When global phenomenon Susan Boyle announced that she'd like Scottish actress Elaine C Smith to portray her in the story of her life, it came as a complete surprise - not least to Elaine herself, best recognised for playing Mary Doll in one of Britain's best-loved comedies, Rab C Nesbitt. What's On recently caught up with Elaine to talk about I Dreamed A Dream - the musical that's creating so much interest, both here and abroad...

#### Were you surprised when approached to

**portray Susan in her life story?** It was a complete surprise. It was never something that I would have pursued, and I would never have wanted to do something that was in any way exploitative of Susan.

#### So how did it come about?

It came from Susan, when she was doing an interview with the Radio Times and there was talk about doing a movie of her life. They asked her who she thought should play her. They'd heard that Demi Moore was interested! But Susan said that there was this Scottish actress who she'd long admired called Elaine C Smith, and she knew that she sung as well. Susan had sort of grown up watching me on television in Rab C Nesbitt and Naked Video. She'd also seen me do stand-up, and appear in panto at the King's Heath in Glasgow. We'd never met and I'd sort of joked about it to Michael Harrison, the producer, because he'd seen lots of stuff in the press about her suggesting me and about me ending up on these American websites with people going 'who the hell is she?' So it all snowballed from there. I joked and said "we'll never get the movie, it's Hollywood. But once the movie's out, we should put in for the stage show." He phoned me back and said, "why don't we go for that, then?". I said, "don't be ridiculous; Simon Cowell will never give you that - there'll be lawyers from here to Los Angeles". But Michael pursued it and we got it. In between times, I'd done the audio book of Susan's life. I'd had access to her autobiography before it was published, so I knew that there was a great story there much better than we, the public, knew at that particular time. Also, I found that there were huge similarities in our backgrounds. We're both from mining communities, and although I'd gone off to the Royal Academy to be an actor, we'd both sung in working men's clubs. So I guess it's a very strange serendipity that's brought us together.

#### And is it a truthful portrayal?

Oh absolutely! I wouldn't want to be involved if it wasn't. It's not a sing-along-a-Susan or a Mamma Mia! version of her life not that there's anything wrong with that but I made sure all along that we spoke to her family to ensure it was an honest account. It's much more of a Blood Brothers/Billy Elliot musical. It examines the darker side of her life, because that fascinates me from a writing point of view. Who was that woman? Why did she have her hair like that? Why did she choose that dress? Why did she wear black tights with white shoes?

#### What's the balance between pre and post-Britain's Got Talent?

It doesn't get to Britain's Got Talent until the second half. From Susan's perspective, it's a fairytale, and I play her looking back on her life - from her parents being told at her birth not to expect too much because there'd been a lack of oxygen to her brain, through the experience of being bullied at school because her slight learning difficulties made her different, to discovering that she was an extremely talented singer.

### Susan's got an iconic voice. Can you live up to audience expectations?

So far, so good. I'm a different singer to Susan, and it's not an impersonation. The only time I have to sing in the same key is the Britain's Got Talent scene, when I have to sing a bit of I Dreamed A Dream. But within the context of the show, it works. The first number that I do is Someone To Watch Over Me. It's at least about twenty minutes in, and it's great because you can feel the audience thinking 'can she sing, or is she just going to talk about singing?'. Then, when I actually do sing, you can feel the relief of 'oh, she can sing, it's okay!' I'm not an impersonator but I've got a good enough singing voice to manage.

### And how much has Susan been involved from concept to stage?

Again, I wouldn't have been involved if she didn't approve. So I went to her house and we had a cup of tea and a laugh together. I met a lot of her family, and then, when I left, she put her arms around me and said, "I'd be honoured if you'd play me, Elaine". So from then on I felt I was holding something very precious in my hands, and that I didn't want to do a sugary sweet version of her life. But the biggest compliment has been her family, in tears in my dressing room in Newcastle on the opening night, saying "you've really honoured us, Elaine, thank you". That means more than anything.

### Do you think that this has been a cathartic process for Susan?

Maybe. I do know that when she first saw the dress rehearsal, although she'd had the script and been there all along, she had to get up and leave, because she found it too distressing watching the death of her father. But then I don't know how anyone would cope with such a dramatic version of their life being portrayed on stage. So it was very delicate, but she loves it, and I think it was a real relief for her that her family loved it too...

### So have you become firm friends as a result of I Dreamed A Dream?

Yeah, but it's not like we're round each other's houses all the time. I'm on tour every night. But we get on well and we're good professional friends.

### So what's the most challenging aspect of playing Susan?

I suppose I hadn't realised the emotional places to which you have to go to portray it accurately. It sounds very actory, but doing it twice a day is knackering. And it's a big thing for me - there's no after-show drinking or anything like that. I've got to be very disciplined, so much so I'm living like a nun at the moment, straight home to toast, tea and bed. I have to, because I've got eight or nine numbers to do every night, and there's an expectation that, although you're not going to be Susan Boyle, you're still going to be on a par...

#### Do you have a favourite scene?

Well, I have to say the Britain's Got Talent scene is very good and very funny. We use Gerry Rafferty's Stuck In The Middle With You, which works very well in that scene. Also, I love the last song that I do, which is Patty Griffin's I Went Up To The Mountain, based on Martin Luther King's words. I just adore that, because it's such a great song and has great sentiment.

#### Has Simon Cowell seen the show yet?

Not yet. I think he might be around in Birmingham. I don't know when, but I think Birmingham being closest to London, it'll probably be there. We've had Cameron Mackintosh and Andrew Lloyd Webber on the phone, and there's been so much interest because it's been such a hit so far. The reaction from the audience is amazing they've been on their feet every night.

### Apart from the voice, why do you think it is that the nation have taken Susan to their hearts?

I don't know. I remember standing on stage one night in Newcastle and at one point thinking 'what is this feeling?'. I guess it's fairydust, and we mention that in the show there's fairydust around her and there's fairydust around the story. In Newcastle, we had one hundred-and-one women from Texas, California and Chicago, who came to see the show five times.

### So would you class this as one of your biggest roles?

Twenty-odd years ago I did Shirley Valentine, and that was a huge role. I've also done Calendar Girls and various other big roles throughout my career, but this is probably the most pressured I've ever felt.

### Are there any plans to tour the show further afield?

There's been a lot of speculation, but we'll have to wait and see. It could go anywhere, I think.

#### So would you like to play Susan abroad? If I'm asked, I'd like to. They might get Demi Moore! Who knows...

And finally, you're obviously well recognised for playing Mary Doll in Rab C Nesbitt. For all those fans out there, are there any plans for a future reunion? I think there are plans for a Christmas special, possibly. One-offs are easier to get together for. I'm destined to wear a wig forever, I think...

Hollyoaks star talks about moving into musical theatre...

With roles in Brookside, Hollyoaks and The Bill under her belt, as well as a stint on Strictly Come Dancing, British actress Ali Bastian has now turned her hand to musical theatre, playing Roxie Hart in the current tour of Chicago. What's On recently caught up with Ali to talk about her latest venture, and to find out about her time on Strictly.

### Why do you think Chicago remains so popular?

I think it's a very unique, very special musical. To me as an actress, when I got hold of the script, I thought, "wow, what a well-written piece". It's so well devised and the script is so economical, which I really like. Everything is so polished - Bob Fosse's style of dance, the music and all of the different mediums seem to echo each other, and it all works really well. I've never done anything like this before, so I'm finding it a really amazing experience. Also, I think having the band who are absolutely phenomenal - on stage brings a wonderful cabaret-feel to the show, and gives us, as performers, a real boost.

### Is it a musical that you were familiar with when you were growing up?

Yeah, definitely. I'd seen it a couple of times, so I was just thrilled when I got offered the role of Roxie. It's an absolute dream role, and probably the most exciting one I've ever had. I just love it and can't wait to get on stage every night.

#### You say this is a new experience for you. So which disciplines have you had to master?

This is my first musical, so I've had to learn how to sing and dance at the same time, but I'm having a ball. I did Burn The Floor last year, which was a dance stage show, so I'm familiar with the dancing part. And obviously my experience with Strictly has helped me prepare. That's an opportunity for which I'll always be grateful. It's given me another string to my bow.

### Were you surprised by your success on Strictly?

Yeah, we all were. You never know what to expect when you say yes to doing it, or whether you'll even get past the first week. You just take a leap of faith and see what happens. When Brian and I got through to the finals, it was amazing. We managed to do every show and then do the tour, which then led to doing Burn The Floor. It was an amazing run, really.

### So was it Strictly which gave you the confidence to do Burn The Floor?

Definitely! It was all about the technique, because it was a Latin show. If Brian hadn't taught me the way he did, then I couldn't have done it. He was quite a taskmaster. When it was Samba week, he taught me a proper traditional Samba, which meant blood, sweat and tears in the training room. He imparted a great deal of knowledge, for which I'm really grateful.

#### Who's your all-time favourite Roxie?

I saw America Ferrera perform Roxie just before I got the part, and I remember seeing Ruthie Henshall years ago. Then obviously I've seen Renee Zellweger in the film. But if I had to choose, it would have to be America. We all bring a bit of ourselves to this, and you really want to make it your own, but she was really fantastic. I loved her characterisation.

### You're performing alongside stage veteran Bernie Nolan. Was that an intimidating prospect initially?

l've known Bernie for years and I just love her. The nice thing is that we all go back a long way. Bernie and I were in Brookside together, and Stephan and I got our first big break at the same time. We were both in Hollyoaks, and actually played girlfriend and boyfriend. We've sort of been tailing each other in our careers ever since, so it's really nice to be back together and to rekindle our friendships.

### It's a very physical show. How do you unwind after a performance?

It's a very fast-paced show, which just seems to hurtle along for two hours. We've got a really great group of people in the company, and we all get on really well. Most of the time we live together, so we chill-out together. We come back and make dinner, relax and watch TV. We may have the odd night out - not me so much, though, as playing this role is, as you say, so physical. I really do have to pace myself. Last night, I literally came home, climbed into bed and watched old episodes of Will And Grace with my little puppy Molly, who's also touring with me.

### Do you have a routine that you use to psyche yourself up before going on stage?

We get in quite early to do a group and vocal warm-up, then I go and do my makeup. That's always a bit of 'you time', where you just sit and relax and put your face on, but I do have funny little things that I do. When I worked on Burn The Floor, we had this thing that we did on the side just before we went on stage. We'd all stand in a circle and do this little ritual...

#### A bit like Madonna?

Yeah, that's it. You know, I really do get the mickey taken out of me for that. But on this show I've only managed to recruit two other people to do it with me, but we do it every night. The others all look on like we're real idiots. I know it sounds silly, but I really like it; it kinds of gets my head in the right place. Roxie's got a bit of a journey to go on during the show, so I really need to get my head into gear.

#### What's your favourite all-time musical?

I<sup>1</sup>ve really fallen in love with Chicago, but Phantom is probably my all-time favourite.

### Is there a particular role that you'd really love to play?

I'd love to play Christine; wouldn't everybody? I remember seeing Phantom when I was about twelve and thinking she was absolutely amazing.

Talking about age, how old were you when you got your first break in acting? I was ten. I started working as a child. I attended a theatre school in Berkshire, then I got a job as Jane Eyre in a BBC production, and I guess it all started from there. I always knew that it was what I wanted to do, and I was lucky that I had a stage school just up the road from where I lived. Crossing over from child to adult actress is always a bit of a tricky time, and Hollyoaks was a really good break for me in that respect. I was nineteen, and it really helped with the child actor to adult actress transition.

### Having broken into stage musicals, which do you now prefer, stage or screen?

It's always difficult to say. I love them both. You can't beat the buzz of a live performance, but at the same time, I really like TV. I suppose it's what I've known for the past few years; it's very fast-paced and every day is very different.

### What's the downside of touring with such a major show?

I don't think there's a downside to this - apart from missing my family, obviously.

### Are there any roles that you've turned down and later regretted?

No! I pretty much don't believe in ever turning down a job. It's such a hard industry.

#### Has there been a time when your looks have proved a disadvantage when auditioning for a role? No, I don't think so.

### But don't you always get glamorous roles?

Oh no! I get a real mix of roles. I can be a little bit of a chameleon. To be honest, the glamorous roles aren't always the most interesting. As an actress, you want to have an eclectic range. In my last couple of plays, I've been a murderer. One of those was an Agatha Christie play, which had a great script and was really enjoyable. Obviously I'm playing a murderer in Chicago too, so I guess I'll have to be careful not to get typecast.

### So where does Ali Bastian want to be in five years' time?

Oh, that's a difficult one. I guess I'd just like to still be working, and to be happy. I just tend to go with the flow in most aspects of my life, really - there's no big 'game plan'. You never know where life's going to take you, but I'd just like to keep things as varied as possible.

Denise Welch Celebrity Big Brother winner talks about her latest role...

#### Actress Denise Welch heads for the Midlands this month, where she'll follow in the footsteps of Dolly Parton by portraying beauty parlour owner Truvy in Steel Magnolias - the story of six strong-willed women from deep south Louisiana whose friendship knows no boundaries. What's On caught up with Denise to find out more...

The character who holds everything together in Robert Harling<sup>1</sup>s Steel Magnolias is, of course, Truvy, whose hairdressing salon and beauty parlour provides the meeting place for the town's prominent ladies.

For Denise Welch, in the role of Truvy, this means only one thing. "I'm not marvellous with props," she confesses, "and I spend a lot of the play walking, talking, doing nails. We've had Nicky Clarke in to teach us, so I hope that it looks as if I know what I'm doing. It has to be so tightly choreographed that the sooner I can put the script down, the better."

Audiences first got to know Denise as a television actress in such series as Coronation Street and Waterloo Road. More recently, she's established herself as a plainspeaking presence on ITV1's Loose Women. She's also been a regular subject of stories in tabloids and celebrity magazines. Her best-selling autobiography, Pulling Myself Together, which detailed her struggle with depression and with the alcohol and drugs she took to combat it, has found a sympathetic echo among the many who also suffer from the illness.

With all this other activity, it's easy to overlook Denise's theatre career, which began at the Live Theatre in Newcastle, within hailing distance of her birthplace in County Durham.

So why did she choose Steel Magnolias as a vehicle for her return to the stage? "I hadn't toured for about twenty years because I was otherwise engaged bringing up my children. I would just say no thanks, almost automatically. However, when Steel Magnolias popped up, I thought to myself that I loved the film, that it was about eight years since I'd done any stage work, and that it wasn't that long a commitment. So I decided to go for it. Steel Magnolias is an ensemble piece, so I'm not carrying the weight of the play on my shoulders everybody has an equal share. And I'm working with some proper grown-up actresses.

In comparing her experience of the stage

with television, Denise makes an interesting point. "Having done a lot of television, I was desperate to come back to the stage, where I could give a performance without somebody shouting out Cut! Rehearsal is a great luxury. On television the lines are in your head only about five minutes before you're due to go on the set to say them." Like the ladies in Steel Magnolias, Denise treasures her moments at the hairdressers "They're friends and counsellors. You sit down, you relax, you have your coffee and you start to gossip. I love gossip - not the malicious kind - and I love to gossip with my friends. I love my female friends, and it's the 'girl power' aspect of Steel Magnolias that was one of the reasons I wanted to do the play. I don't quite trust women who don't have many female friends. The friendships in the play are already reflected in the cast. The first day of rehearsals is a bit like the first day of school. To begin with, you think you're the only person who's a bag of nerves and who's worried and anxious about everything. In fact, you soon find out that everybody's in the same position." At various stages of the tour, Denise will be returning to London to join her colleagues on Loose Women, the show that opened up a whole new presenting career for her. "I was originally a guest on the show - this was before the programme became such an important part of the TV furniture - and I was eventually asked to be a regular member of the team. I tend to be a bit of an open book, and that gives the viewer access into what's happening in my life. People believe that I tell everybody everything but I'm just being myself.

"You have to diversify. Loose Women keeps my profile up. These days, if you're not on television, people assume you've either retired or died."

Denise explains that one of the reasons for writing her autobiography was to help people suffering from similar symptoms. "I had to take the reader to my dark places, and I had to talk about them honestly." She is certain that her illness was the result of post-natal depression, but hopes that she may now be over the worst. "I'm well for longer periods of time nowadays," she says, "although depression is an illness where you can go to bed feeling fine only to wake up in despair."

Brandishing a copy of a celebrity magazine, Denise indicates a front cover photograph in which she's looking especially downcast. "My misery sells," she remarks with a smile of resignation. "A photographer followed me, my son and the dog around the park last weekend. I had to say to him that there was no point in taking a shot of us enjoying a family occasion, because the papers only buy when I'm miserable."

The date that will mean the most to Denise is the week that Steel Magnolias plays the Theatre Royal, Newcastle. It was in the city that both Denise and her husband, the actor Tim Healy, made their professional debuts. And it was at school, in a production of the Broadway musical Finian's Rainbow, that Denise first felt that a life on the stage was for her. "I was a terrible show-off as a child, and I could never understand why my mother kept me away whenever she had company, since I was more than happy to entertain them! When I took part in that school production, it was as if a lightbulb had gone on inside my head. I thought originally of becoming a drama teacher, but dad, who was a very keen amateur actor and who eventually got his Equity Card at the age of sixty, persuaded me to try for drama school. My mum and sister are very supportive, but they prefer to keep their distance from the showbiz world. Most parents are against their children going on the stage but dad positively encouraged me. For some reason, he didn't think I'd make it as a teacher, and after working on Waterloo Road, I know he was right."

## Mies Ju on the art of successful blagging...

## Comedian, actor and panellist Miles Jupp is taking his bow as an author with the publication of Fibber In The Heat, a book based around his cricketing adventure in India in 2005 - a story which also provides the basis for his current stand-up show. What's On caught up with him to find out more...

### Can you tell us a bit about Fibber In The Heat?

Around about 2005 I got it into my head during the Ashes series that what I really wanted to do was not to be an actor or comedian, but rather a cricket correspondent of some sort. I wanted a job where I could watch cricket all day and kind of get paid for it. I've loved the game since I was ten or eleven, and covering it was something that I really wanted to do, but couldn't be arsed to go through the traditional route of journalism college and the like. So I thought if I could be in the right place at the right time - get into a press box and look as though I was busy - then people would start giving me work to do. I remember reading this thing about what Barry Norman did when he was out of work. He would go to El Vino's in London, in a suit, looking very smart, armed with some paper and a pen, and chat to everyone. When people would ask him how he was, he'd say "busy, very busy". Then, after a while, people would start to come up to him and say: "Barry, I know you're really busy, but could you possibly do ... ". So I decided to try the same formula. It meant me telling quite a few fibs, but it ended up with me having a bit of paper that said I was the cricket correspondent for Radio Scotland. So I rang the people that I needed to, turned up in India at the beginning of March and finally got on to the press tour. My father-in-law is Sub Editor of a paper in Wales, and they'd said that they'd pay me a small fee to write a piece about one particular Welsh cricketer, but he'd left before I arrived.

### So do you consider yourself to be a good blagger?

Er, I don't know. I think sometimes I've been able to be persuasive, but often I actually feel quite bad about asking permission to do things all the time. It's not really my nature to be audacious. I'm not the sort of person who finds it easy working a room full of strangers, but a lot of what I needed to do involved exactly that. When I got there, I thought the hard part would be getting into the press box, but that bit was alright. It was actually what to do once I was in there that became more of a problem.

### So has Fibber In The Heat formed the basis for your stand-up show?

Yeah, that's right. I told this story as a show at the 2010 Edinburgh Festival. It's presented in a stand-up style but it's not conventional - it's more of a monologue. When I first came back from India, after the whole thing had finished, I attempted to write a book but got a little bit confused and didn't quite know how to go about it. Instead, I just shoved the whole idea in a drawer for three years or something. I'd heard Tom Wrigglesworth do this show about an old lady on a Virgin train who was told that she'd got the wrong ticket and was forced to pay some exorbitant fee, and how he (Tom) got a whip round on the train that resulted in him getting arrested. I listened to that on Radio Four and thought "God, I'd love to do a show that was just telling a story. What if I

tell the story about my Indian adventure - the thing that I did that's just been growing mould in the corner of my study?". So I wrote it as a show and from there got asked to write a book about it.

### What came first, the comedy or the acting?

Professionally, comedy came first. I started stand-up when I was twenty. In my first year at Edinburgh University, I remember getting paid £15 for ten minutes. Balamory was my first professional acting job, although I'd spent a day playing a shoe salesman in something. Acting was something that I'd always done at both school and university.

#### Regarding Balamory, was that just a case

of taking your first step on the ladder? Yeah, there was an element of me not really understanding how it all worked. I was doing a programme in Scotland called Live Floor Show, which was a stand-up gang show with Frankie Boyle and Paul Sneddon, when I got asked to do an audition for Balamory by someone I already knew. I thought "I'll give it a go", got the part and thought "this must be how this TV thing works. I've done this comedy thing, I'll now try the children's thing and I'll see what comes after that". But there was nothing for ages...

#### Were you afraid that you might be forever holed up in the world of children's TV as a result of Balamory?

Yeah, I suppose - although I didn't stop really doing the comedy side of things. For one, when I did Balamory I was still at university, so I didn't feel like someone who didn't have any options. We filmed two series in 2002 and another in 2004, and in between I went to the Edinburgh Festival and got a Perrier nomination, so I was still trying to keep that side of things alive. Stand-up's always been a good way of getting back on the horse, so to speak...

### And has your stand-up style always been the same?

Not really. When I first started, it was me as me, then I turned into a character, which was a bit of a self-defence mechanism. I started out in Scotland and the comperes would always say "this next act is English", and I thought that the best way to deal with that would be to be even more English than they expected me to be. That then grew into a character thing, and then, when I stopped doing stand-up in 2005 - before I went off on my India adventure - that was one of the things that I was saying goodbye to. I started up again properly two years later, and went back to storytelling and stuff, telling it as myself.

#### You're recognised, as you say, as being very English and quite 'posh'. So just how posh would you rate yourself on a scale of one to ten?

Probably ten. No, not really! How about seven or eight? I know a lot of people who are much posher and better bred than me. Okay, I'm privately educated, so that puts me in a certain percentage, but it's not as if I went to Eton or anything...

### So what's your take on comedy being very much more working-class?

I think it's more in vogue for people to play things down. You may be in the dressing room, chatting with someone quite normally, and then they go out on stage with "alright fella?", in that sort of slightly irritating type of speech. But Will Smith is fantastic. When I was at university, some friends said "you want to come along and see Will, you'll get on because he's posh like you". I remember seeing him and thinking it was really brave. I guess he became a real inspiration for me. As we were both doing quite posh things, I'd often have to ring him up - you know, when a joke pops into your head so quickly and so perfectly that you may have heard it before.

### How would you define a Miles Jupp audience?

I've absolutely no idea. I think they're very nice, and I hope that they're people who enjoy needless wordliness with perhaps the occasional bit of dressed-up filth - that's me, not them. I would hope that my audience would be reasonably diverse - and I guess for this show it would probably help if they liked cricket. The only audience that I look at and think "Oh, am I really going to be able to make those people laugh?" are when it's a Friday or Saturday night and it's people with pointy shoes and shiny short-sleeve shirts, or whatever. But of course, one plays to those sort of people all the time - they make up a huge bulk of the audience, and they're usually really good fun. It's very dangerous to pre-judge any audience in terms of intelligence. To assume an audience won't get certain things is very reckless and conceited. So I'd like to hope that anyone would feel welcome at one of my shows...

### What's the best heckle you've ever received?

Probably the last heckle that I received. It was last week and from a Chelsea Pensioner at a function I was doing at The Dorchester. He took issue with me for being about to speak about Newcastle. I've never been heckled by anyone in uniform before, so I found that exciting, even if his heckle revealed some politics that I personally find unacceptable.

#### Did it throw you off your track?


No, I found it funny that this pensioner, a guest of honour, would spring up from nowhere and start to shout. But no, I've dealt with things like that lots and lots of times. It was nice to see one Chelsea Pensioner ask another to be quiet, though.

#### Do you have a favourite one-liner?

I'm a very judgmental person, I think you are too!

#### How much does your material evolve as you work through a show? Well, something like Fibber In The Heat

starts out as a very scripted piece, and I



suppose you might embellish it as you go along. When I first did it in Edinburgh, it was a fifty-five minute/hour-long show. Now it's seventy-five minutes or so, and I've not done any writing to get it there. That's down to onstage evolution or whatever. I usually start out with something scripted. Sometimes you find that you've been doing something for ages, then suddenly something pops into your head - a new line or something. My safety-conscious attitude is that if I've been booked for twenty minutes, I need to be able to talk for twenty minutes, even if there are no pauses for laughter. I always need to be able to fulfill my contractual obligation. I'm not one of those people who can walk on stage and just go "Alright mate, look at your hat!" and then proceed to talk about it for twenty minutes.

#### You recently appeared on Dancing For Sport Relief. How much control did you have over your choice of dance?

Quite a lot - well, with the song anyway. I wanted to do one of those songs that you could go a bit nuts to; something that had a get-out clause, meaning that if I forgot any of the choreographed stuff, I could just jump around a bit.

### So was it a case of masking an inability to dance properly?

I'm the first to admit that I can't dance. That piece was just two minutes long and within it there were only four bits of dancing.

You've had quite a few acting roles of late. Can you tell us a bit about what you've been up to? I've just finished filming with Michael Winterbottom's The King Of Soho, a film about London porn baron-turned-property millionaire Paul Raymond. I've also done a little bit more of The Thick Of It, and I'm currently working on Tank Commander, which is an extraordinary creation about the very funny Greg McHugh, who's just back from a war campaign.

#### You seem to be everywhere at the moment - books, stand-up shows, films and panel series. Would you describe yourself as a bit of a workaholic?

I guess I have been in the last few years. I did have a lazy spell in my mid-twenties. Balamory made me a bit too comfortable. I lost all ambition, and was mainly concerned with having Chinese food delivered and watching box sets. Now I'm married with two young children, and have a host of responsibilities. I try to work all the time, because that's what normal people do.

### Acting is quite a fickle industry, so are you ever afraid to turn work down?

Oh, I do occasionally turn work down, but there's got to be an alternative. There's an element of managing things as well. I genuinely want my acting work to be different to my stand-up and panel show persona. I want there to be a distinction between the two, because I want it to be actual acting and creating characters. In Rev, The Thick Of It or a play that I did recently, A Day In The Death Of Joe Egg, I've played characters that were far removed from my own personality.

### What acting role have you enjoyed the most?


I played Bri in A Day In The Death Of Joe Egg just before Christmas at the Citizens Theatre in Glasgow, which was fun. Also, the first time I did The Thick Of It, I played a character called John Duggan, who I really, really enjoyed.

### So what do you hope will dominate your future professionally - stand-up or theatre?

Gosh, I never have any plans. I don't know. Probably acting. I do like writing, and there's a radio sitcom that I've written about a cookery writer called Damien Trench, for which I'm going to write another series. I hope to take that into television in some format, slightly different from the radio one, but it's certainly something that I'd like to develop.





HMV Institute, Birmingham, Fri 18 May



#### Ladyhawke

The Glee Club, Birmingham, Sun 6 May

Real name Pippa Brown, Ladyhawke is one cool Kiwi, known not only for singles Magic, My Delirium and Paris Is Burning, but also for her insistence on wearing men's clothes. Playing as part of a number of groups, including one with Empire Of The Sun's Nick Littlemore, she relocated to the UK in 2007 and released her eponymous debut album the following year. 

### MUSIC PREVIEWS

#### **Jimmy Cliff**

The Ballroom, Birmingham, Sun 20 May Jamaican musician, singer and actor Jimmy Cliff is the only still-living musician to hold the Order of Merit, the highest honour that can be granted by the Jamaican government for achievement in the arts and sciences. Jimmy has also been inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, another outstanding honour which speaks volumes for the regard in which he is held throughout the music industry. Best known to mainstream audiences for songs such as Sitting In Limbo, You Can Get It If You Really Want and Many Rivers To Cross, all of which featured in the soundtrack to the hit 1972 movie The Harder They Come, Jimmy is one of Reggae music's most legendary exponents, and continues to draw a crowd wherever he tours.



#### **Elvis Costello**

Symphony Hall, Birmingham, Tues 15 May Can it really be over three decades since Elvis Costello arrived on the music scene wearing a charity shop suit and a chip on his shoulder? From his first album - the angry and vitriolic My Aim Is True (1977) - onwards, Costello's career has had some incredible highs and some spectacular lows, yet well over a quarter of a century later, he's still going strong. Be prepared for a wide range of exciting and innovative styles, presented by one of the most enduring and sophisticated home-grown talents of his generation.



### Hue & Cry

The Robin, Bilston, Tues 15 May

Brothers Pat and Greg Kane have certainly kept themselves busy on a professional level since bursting onto the music scene way back in the 1980s, but it's for early-career tracks like Labour Of Love, Violently and Looking For Linda - as well as for their first two albums, Seduced And Abandoned and Remote - that they remain best known. Their music has been described as intellectual, soulful pop, the most recent example of which is the newly released Hot Wire album, for which this Bilston performance is a supporting-tour gig.



### Marina and The Diamonds

The Assembly, Leamington Spa, Thurs 10 May; HMV Institute, Birmingham, Fri 11 May

Marina Diamandis burst onto the scene when she came second to Ellie Goulding in the BBC Sound Of 2010 poll. Her imminent second album, named after her new alter-ego Electra Heart, fits more into the pop vein and is "a vehicle to portray part of the American dream, with elements of Greek tragedy". Accompanied by an art project named The Archetypes, she's sure to have plenty to say at this gig, where FOE support.

### The Real Thing

The Buttermarket, Shrewsbury, Sat 5 May

With hits like You To Me Are Everything, Can't Get By Without You, Feel The Force, You'll Never Know What You're Missing and Whenever You Want My Love to their name, there's little wonder The Real Thing were the most successful black rock/soul act in England during the 1970s. As such, the group's credentials are not in question, with the Guinness Book Of Records having once pointed out that only fellow Liverpudlians The Beatles

and Frankie Goes To Hollywood had had more singles in the alltime Top One Hundred.



#### **Twenty Twenty**

HMV Institute, Birmingham, Thu 3 May

Three-piece pop band Twenty Twenty is made up of lead vocalist/guitarist Sam Halliday, his brother and bassist/vocalist Jack, and drummer/vocalist Sonny Watson-Lang. Last year saw the boys not only release debut album Small Talk but also support The Saturdays and The Wanted on tour. With a huge fanbase, thanks to their camera-pleasing looks and not a little charm, the band have admitted to wanting to duet with Jessie J, and look set to become the next McFly. Room 94 and Futureproof support.

#### **Brit Floyd**

### **English Touring Opera**

English Touring Opera perform at Everyman Theatre, Cheltenham, Tues 1 - Fri 4 May & Warwick Arts Centre, Coventry, Wed 9 - Sat 12 May.

Renowned for its varied repertoire and high-quality professional productions, English Touring Opera returns to the region to present two classic works - Rossini's The Barber Of Seville and Tchaikovsky's romantic Eugene Onegin. Conducted by Paul McGrath and directed by Thomas Guthrie, The Barber Of Seville features Kathleen Ferrier Award-winner Kitty Whately as Rosina alongside Nicholas Sharratt as the roguish Count Almaviva. In Eugene Onegin, ETO's Music Director Michael Rosewell conducts a thirty-two piece orchestra, while emerging star Nicholas Lester takes the title role of Onegin. Joining him, in the role of Tatyana, is Welsh soprano Sarah-Jane Davies, who represented Wales at BBC Cardiff Singer of the World.







# Theatre REVIEWS

### Cirque du Soleil's Alegria

National Indoor Arena, Birmingham

Engaging from the outset, Cirque du Soleil's Alegria takes its audience into a world where Baroque meets Burlesque - a place dominated by colourful characters who oversee the evening's proceedings. The show's ethereal set sees performers rise from the bowels of the stage to present an eclectic range of skills, interspersed with theatrical slap-stick courtesy of the troupe's three hugely popular clowns. Accompanied by a fusion of French/African music, the story of Alegria is recounted by The White Singer, whose beautifully honed vocals bring further magic to the evening's proceedings.

Cirque has a reputation for producing some of the world's most skilled performers, something that was very much in evidence during Alegria, as fire-twirlers, high-wire acrobats, trapeze and hand-balancing artists took to the stage. For me, however, there were three acts that really raised the bar. One of them saw two young girls contorting their bodies into the most



unimaginable positions. The second featured acrobatic flyers who drew gasps of amazement from the audience as they were thrust into the air from narrow, flexible bars perched on the shoulders of their catchers. The third was a ribbon dancer, whose ability to rotate numerous metal hoops around different parts of her body was simply amazing.

Alegria is every bit as spellbinding a show as you'd expect from the fabulous Cirque du Soleil. If you've never seen this truly stunning circus ensemble in action, make a mental note to grab yourself a ticket the next time they stop off in the Midlands. *Davina Evans* 


# The King And I

Grand Theatre, Wolverhampton

This latest production of Rodgers & Hammerstein's classic musical is a feast for the eyes and ears, its lavish sets, colourful costumes, precise choreography and the performance of sixteen talented local schoolchildren ensuring the show will live long in the memory. Based on the autobiographical story of the volatile relationship between an English schoolteacher and the King of Siam, Paul Kerryson's production is perfectly cast, with This Life actor Ramon Tikaram hugely convincing in his portrayal of the King. What he lacks in vocal aptitude is made up for by an abundance of charisma and wit.

Playing opposite the handsome Tikaram is ballerina Josefina Gabrielle, who gives a spectacular performance as the quintessentially English Anna, displaying the voice of a nightingale when singing numbers like Hello Young Lovers and Getting To Know You.

A story within a story, The Small House Of Uncle Thomas provides much amusement with



Starting in the midst of the story, the protagonist is introduced by prison guards as magic Mustafa. As the story unravels, it becomes apparent that this quiet man is in prison for the manslaughter of a young boy during an exorcism. Questions of faith and religion, and of East versus West, are raised, as we question how so pious a man could have been accused of so terrible an act. The explanation, that evil magic or djinn killed the boy, is disturbing especially when it becomes evident that the djinn is still with Mustafa, and might well be responsible for a number of strange and unexplained happenings taking place in the prison... Dark and unsettling, this compelling thriller is expertly written, and takes ghost stories to another level. Alev Dervish 🔳 🗖 🔳

# Push - Sylvie Guillem & Russell Maliphant

Birmingham Hippodrome, Fri 11 - Sat 12 May

Referred to by The Guardian as 'the most brilliant ballerina of her generation', Sylvie Guillem this month makes her Birmingham debut as part of the city's International Dance Festival. Guillem once again performs alongside British dancer/choreographer Russell Maliphant in a union that's previously earned them an Olivier Award and a Critic's Circle National Dance Award for Best Choreography for their production Broken Fall. Here, the duo perform a mixed programme of works that includes Push, a duet set to an original score by Andy Cowton that perfectly combines the respective abilities of both artists. The evening also sees Guillem perform Solo to the music of Carlos Montoya, while Maliphant completes the performance with his signature solo Shift.

# Richard Alston Dance Company

Theatre Severn, Shrewsbury, Mon 21 - Tue 22 May

Richard Alston is recognised as one of British dance's most inspiring and influential choreographers, his work being described by The New York Times as 'the finest by any choreographer alive'. 








#### Silent House CERT 15 (85 mins) Starring Elizabeth Olsen, Adam Trese, Erich

## A Turner classic...

#### REVIEW

Turners of Harborne is one of those 'must visit' places. forming part of the triumvirate of Michelin-starred establishments in Birmingham. Chef Richard Turner opened the restaurant in 2007, and won his star in 2009. It's a bijoux place, more like a classy hotel living-room, with about thirty seats, elegant and minimalistic soft furnishings, and wall-to-wall mirrors with 'Turners' etched in them. The staff are suited and booted, ever so polite, and even offer you a cushion to rest your handbag on! The problem with intimate, high-calibre places is that you feel that you have to whisper when you enter. Going into a place of such acclaim can be quite daunting - and believe me, the hype is justified. Chef Turner's dishes make him the Versace of cooking, and I was amazed to discover that he's been largely self-taught. Although many top chefs repeat the mantra of fresh local/ best seasonal ingredients, I don't always buy it. But Richard's dishes are impressively evident of this fact. The taste and textures are first class, and to a lay person are unique. One of my favourite things about fine dining restaurants is the complimentary

amuse bouche. The anticipation of this little surprise gift always leaves me warmly satisfied. Today was no exception. We had a light and creamy veloute of Jerusalem artichoke, topped with wild rice. My starter was a beautifully presented pannacotta of garden peas (yes, pannacotta as a starter) with a slow-cooked pheasant egg, new season asparagus and pancetta. How I marvelled at the presentation of the dish, not to mention the tastes and textures. My other half's dish looked just as divine; a fillet of mackerel wrapped in a cucumber cannelloni how unusual. The avocado purée, wasabi mayonnaise on a disc of bright red soya jelly, had Masterchef written all over it; beautifully crafted and boasting a great balance of sharp and sweet. For mains, I decided on the duck. Juicy and full of flavour, it was served with a bon bon of potato and bacon - which basically looked like a crispy ball of wool. I love my potatoes, and this was a great way to serve them. The most surprising part of this dish was the orange segments in the sweet-andsour duck jus. I've never tasted a slice of orange so sweet. Just where does he get them from? Or what does he do to them to make them taste like little

slices of heaven? This dish was matched with a very fine glass of New Zealand Syrah. My partner's main was the pavé of sea bream with shellfish tortellini. Another class act. After another dessert gift, I decided on the chocolate tart with caramel pannacotta and peanut oil ice cream. Michelin-starred chefs do desserts so unbelievably well. This was beautifully crafted - the perfect oval ice cream nestled on a caramel spear, with some gold leaf on the chocolate tart. I thought the ice cream was too icy, but apparently that's so it retains its shape. If you hanker for a star quality meal, then look no further than Turners. The lunch menu is an absolute steal at three courses for £27 plus two mini ones. I suspect a meal such as this in a top London hotel would set you back £100 per person. This one is under £30. I can't think of a better way to spend your money. Anita Champaneri

## Bustling Thai eatery well worth a visit...

The newly opened Chaophraya in Birmingham is situated in a prime location just outside the Bullring. Set over two floors and boasting an extensive al fresco terrace, the restaurant is very busy on a midweek night, packed with shoppers and people who've just finished work in the city. My partner and I were shown to a table situated right in front of a huge iellvfish tank set in the wall. Our waitress suggested we try an authentic Thai non-alcoholic cocktail, Mai Mao, which contained mango juice and lychee juice muddled with fresh raspberries, blackberries and strawberries (£4.50). It proved to be the most refreshing drink I've ever tasted. We also ordered two alcoholic cocktails: a Red Devil - raspberry vodka, Midori, cranberry juice and chillies (£7.50) and a traditional Cosmopolitan (£7.50). We decided to go for the Set Menu B for our meal, which cost £35.50 per person. The starters included prawn toast, crab, prawn and chicken dumplings, deep-fried marinated pork, Thai chicken pieces and chicken satay. Three dipping sauces accompanied the dishes; crunchy peanut sauce, sweet chilli, and soy and plum sauce. All the dishes were excellent, and the dumplings positively outstanding.

The main dishes included massaman lamb curry, sweet-and-sour chicken, beef in black pepper sauce and fresh ginger prawns,



served with egg-fried rice. The creamy lamb dish was particularly good. The sweet-andsour chicken was bursting with flavours, including fresh grape and pomegranate. Other dishes on the menu included the traditional Thai green curry (£9.95), king prawn jungle curry (£14.95), lamb in red curry sauce (£9.95) and pan-fried sea bass with chilli (£14.95). There were options for vegetarians, too, with a whole side of the menu dedicated to meat-free dishes, including chilli and basil tofu (£9), barbecued mushrooms (£6.95), and papaya salad (6.95). Although Chaophraya is quite a pricey night out, you simply can't knock the quality and service - I would certainly recommend giving it a try. Eva Easthope

## Impeccable service at refurbished restaurant...

Situated next to the picturesque Hatton Locks, The Hatton Arms has recently reopened following an extensive refurbishment. Both a pub and restaurant, the interior is a pleasant mix of the old and new, featuring lots of wood and mirrors, and deliberately mismatched furniture. This all results in a relaxing, welcoming atmosphere.

On the night my dining partner and I visited, the restaurant was buzzing with couples and families. To start, I tried warm goat's cheese (£5.65), presented with a suitably piquant beetroot and apple accompaniment. Personally, I would have preferred more of the raspberry vinaigrette mentioned in the menu, and the cheese itself could have been a little bit warmer, but nonetheless a good dish. My friend opted for the oyster, chestnut and chanterelle mushroom medley (£6.25). Served on toasted brioche with a creamy garlic and white wine sauce and a poached egg, this generously portioned starter very much hit the spot.

Mains include a good selection of meat and fish options. If you're vegetarian, though, you'll struggle, as there seems to be only the one choice - vegetable lasagne. I plumped for English chicken marinated in herbs, coconut and chilli cream sauce with coriander sticky rice ( $\pounds$ 12.95). This was perfectly pleasant, but I think a good sized breast of chicken, rather than strips, would have improved the dish. My friend's sea bass ( $\pounds$ 15.95) was apparently delicious, as was the pesto it was served with. The vegetables the fish came with were less impressive; he



thought the vegetables we ordered as a side dish were much better.

To end, we sampled green tea crème brulee with lemon shortbread, and citrus lemon tart with fresh raspberries, both £5. Rather bizarrely, the filling on top of the tart's base tasted suspiciously like the crème brulee! It wasn't like any lemon tart l've ever eaten, so was probably the most disappointing part of the meal.

Service throughout was impeccable, although the food didn't always live up to expectations. That said, with the promise of an alfresco dining option in the summer months, The Hatton Arms looks set to be a hit. *Jack Rolfe*
