A retro boardgame, horror movie and chick flick crossover, lighthearted musical parody Scream Phone is coming to Birmingham this month...

Scream Phone gives retro 'secret admirer' boardgame Dream Phone a killer twist and a sprinkling of comedy.

The musical spoof merges '80s and '90s teen chick flicks with horror movies to create a funny and dangerous journey through the music and stereotypes of those two decades.

The critically acclaimed production is the brainchild of Natasha Granger and Kerrie Thomason, the co-founders of Swipe Right Theatre, the company producing the show.

"Scream Phone is based on this very bizarre boardgame called Dream Phone, which Kerrie and I both had as kids," explains Natasha. "It's basically Cluedo but with a big pink phone, and instead of working out who the murderer is, you work out who your secret crush is! It's definitely a very gendered game. Some of the voices that come through the phone to tell you about your crush are really quite creepy. We thought about how that would make a good horror film, if you mixed it with plots such as Scream. So we've mixed the boardgame with a horror world and it's a really silly, fun outcome. Scream Phone is essentially a parody crossover of '80s and '90s horror and teen films. It's definitely a comedy, but it's a musical as well. We've got some really great songs inspired by classic '80s ballads and hits."

Characters in parodies often follow certain stereotypes, which is definitely the case here at least to begin with...

"The characters we meet are definitely stereotypes, especially on the surface. They look and act just like the kind of girls you'd see in those teen movies. We definitely want to poke fun at and parody those stereotypes! We've got Melody, who's the bitchy cheerleader character and definitely the leader of the group. Then there's Stacey, who's very into her studies and definitely fits that stereotypically geeky character. Finally there's Janice, who's quite random and thinks she knows a lot about the world but everything just comes out wrong. There's a big twist at the end, too! Obviously I can't say what it is because I'd ruin the surprise, but all those stereotypes are flipped on their head and aren't quite as obvious as they seem at the

beginning."

"The first show that Kerrie and I wrote together was '90s pop musical 2 Become 1. And now we've done Scream Phone! I think we really developed our comedy through writing 2 Become 1. We started by trying to write this really nice musical, and then we realised that what we actually liked to do was comedy. Then, with Scream Phone, we were down in Brighton in my childhood room and we decided to play Dream Phone. There was definitely a bit of wine involved and we were finding the game really funny, plus we were already fans of '80s and '90s horror films, some of which are just hilarious. That's where the idea came from. When we write, we aim to make each other laugh, and then, if something does make us laugh, we find out if it works for an audience as well. We do a lot of previews to get feedback. We worked very closely with the director for Scream Phone, Tom Parry, in getting our structure right. Kerrie and I just bounce off each other, so writing seems like a very natural process."

Scream Phone premiered at London Vault Festival and has since been seen at the Edinburgh Fringe, where the production received rave reviews.

"We've been absolutely overwhelmed by how Scream Phone has done so far in terms of reviews and audience feedback. Our first show had amazing sales and feedback, so we were really worried that Scream Phone wouldn't live up to that. In Edinburgh and Brighton especially, we'd really built up a following for 2 Become 1, so we didn't want to fall short of expectations. Luckily Scream Phone has gone down incredibly well, with people saying it's even better than 2 Become 1. The show's received a lot of industry interest too, which has been amazing. We're thrilled!"

Since graduating from university, Natasha's primary role has been as a director and performer for children's theatre company Theatre Fideri Fidera - a stark contrast to Swipe Right Theatre.

"Kerrie and I also trained together, always doing a lot of comedy at university, so that was something I really loved doing. I got into children's theatre straight after uni - and actually, surprisingly, the two have worked really well together in my career. Through doing the children's work, I've learned a lot about using improvisation - particularly responding to audiences shouting out or reacting to whatever's happening on stage, and in a way that really adds to the show. That definitely works well for the comedy element of Swipe Right Theatre too, especially because sometimes we do really late-night shows and people are having a laugh and have maybe had one too many. I've also been able to learn skills through doing children's theatre that I've then been able to bring across to our company. The same with writing, too. There are very different themes with Swipe Right on one hand and Theatre Fideri Fidera on the other. but it's all working well for me."

The future certainly looks bright for Swipe Right...

"We've got an idea for a new show that we've started to work on, but our main focus is getting this tour up and running because Kerrie and I also star in the show as Janice and Melody. We really want to make sure our tour of Scream Phone is of the same quality as we've presented elsewhere. Hopefully, in 2021 we'll be premiering something new, but we have a lot of interest in Scream Phone that could still give us some amazing opportunities. We've got a big London run and some interest in touring internationally too, so fingers crossed that all goes ahead."

Natasha is particularly excited to be bringing Scream Phone to Birmingham: "The Old Joint Stock has a reputation for programming really fun, different theatre, so I hope people are up for a laugh, a singalong and a dance-along! Scream Phone has also got that twist at the end and some really spooky elements too, so it's a fantastic night of entertainment. I think a pub-theatre like the Old Joint Stock is perfect for the rowdy, fun atmosphere that a parody generates."

REVIEW: Pushkar High-quality cuisine at popular Broad Street Indian restaurant

Located in the vicinity of some of Broad Street's less elegant venues is award-winning finedining Indian eatery Pushkar. Taking its name from one of India's oldest cities, the critically acclaimed restaurant & cocktail bar is popular with Boris Johnson (make of that what you will!), Alfie Boe and the Indian cricket team.

Featuring tasteful and sophisticated decor, with a menu and ambience to match, Pushkar's kitchen is looked after by Executive Head Chef Chandra Singh. Chandra has worked with top TV chef Atul Kochhar in his Michelin-starred restaurant, Benares, and at London's awardwinning fine dining restaurant, The Painted Heron. The talented chef has also held senior positions in several other top London restaurants, including Bangalore Express, the Michelinstarred Tamarind and Cinnamon Kitchen.

On the occasion that we visited, and despite the developing situation regarding Covid-19, Pushkar was close to full. Supporting hospitality in the current climate, to whatever extent is possible, is an absolute must, so it was great to see so many happy and contented diners doing just that on a cold and wet Thursday evening.

As well as an extensive a la carte menu, Pushkar offers two fivecourse tasting menus - one meat/fish and one vegetarian for £40.95 per person, with pairing wine flights at either £30 or £50 per person depending on whether you opt for 'captivating' or 'prestigious' wines. We opted for the meat/fish option and two pints of Kingfisher. I was feeling slightly fragile from the night before, so the wine pairings weren't sounding too appealing to me, lovely though I'm sure they are!

We started off with a dahi puri chaat amuse bouche. Comprising nicely cooked, crispy and puffed puris filled with potatoes, boiled pulses and onion, and topped with yoghurt, a sweet chutney and pomegranate seeds, it was a pleasant way to kick off the evening's proceedings.

The next dish of crab meat balls with smokey mashed potato was probably my favourite of the night. Delicate in its presentation, the singular fried crab ball was bursting with intense Thai-inspired flavours. The smokey flavour from the perfectly seasoned mash added another taste sensation. I could have eaten it three times over! Chicken tikka pie was the next dish we were served. Simple yet tasty, the pie featured perfectly cooked pastry and nicely cooked chicken pieces. The sweet berry chutney with which it was served ensured a fantastic flavour contrast.

Next up was another chicken dish, and the final savoury offering of the evening - pieces of nicely cooked free range chicken in a kadai sauce. Comprising a tomato base with onions, ginger, garlic and ground spices, it was served alongside a portion of pilau rice, laccha paratha (a multi-layered Indian bread) and a rich and creamy dal maharani.

For dessert we were presented with a chocomosa with vanilla ice-cream - pastry filled with warm, gooey chocolate sauce; what's not to love?!

The food at Pushkar is both beautifully presented and of a high quality. My only (very minor) criticism is that, rather than two consecutive chicken dishes, it would've been nice to see the tasting menu feature a different meat or fish option. Being a tasting menu, the portions are relatively small, so for the price tag, a little more variety would've been welcome.

Although, in my opinion, Pushkar isn't the very best Indian restaurant that Birmingham has to offer, it certainly makes for an enjoyable experience, and is a venue to which I would definitely be happy to return. Lauren Foster





New food offerings include warm asparagus spears with truffle hollandaise, grilled chicken and watermelon salad, and pan-fried sea bass fillet served with marinated courgette and mixed peppers. For those who follow either a vegetarian or vegan diet, the menu boasts chargrilled halloumi with giant cous cous, smoked aubergine and labneh, and guinoa and watermelon salad with roast sweet potato. Behind the bar, new cocktails include The Ivy VLS, which comprises Ketel One Citroen vodka with Fever Tree Mexican Lime and Yuzu soda.

Sakari Oramo & Royal Stockholm Philharmonic


Symphony Hall, Birmingham, Sat 25 April

John Shuttleworth

Midlands-based lovers of light comedy here get the chance to enjoy another laughterfilled evening in the company of Sheffield's raconteur par excellence.

The creation of actor Graham Fellows - a one-time chartbuster with 1970s' hit, Jilted John - Shuttleworth has been making his presence felt on the UK comedy circuit for more than 30 years.

This latest show finds John a pale shadow of his former self. "If my first reaction to the prospect of doing a show is one of raw terror, I know I'm on the right path. I'm always open to a new experience, however scary!"

Jack Barry

Having previously provided tour support for James Acaster and Joe Lycett, Jack Barry here steps out on his own for a show that sees him addressing the fact that he doesn't think you've been laughing enough. No surprise there, says Jack, what with the world having turned to s***. Jack's show is called Alien - by which he means the immigrant kind - and being a potsmoking old hippie at heart, he'd be happy to do away with borders altogether. His timely message about acceptance will no doubt resonate with many in The Rep's audience, his line in humour with even more.

Joel Dommett

Palace Theatre, Redditch, Wed 8 April; William Aston Hall, Wrexham, Sat 18 April; Theatre Severn, Shrewsbury, Sun 19 April; Evesham Arts Centre, Sat 2 May; Stafford Gatehouse Theatre, Thurs 28 May

"I absolutely love performing in small, intimate spaces," says The Masked Singer presenter Joel Dommett, a man who was once the face of MTV - until he was sacked at the age of 27 for being 'too old'. "I'd far rather do a small gig in front of 50 people, but be doing new stuff, than do old stuff in front of 5,000 people."

Joel is extremely committed to the business of keeping his act fresh. "I'm working on material pretty much all the time," explains the one-time Justin Bieber warm-up act. "In fact, I try to put in something new every time I go on stage. If there's something new in there, it brightens up the whole set and gives it more energy and excitement."

His jokes aren't bad either, with two examples being as follows: "I don't understand swimming. You don't see fish going for a walk," and "Are city-centre beat officers police who rap?"

Sukh Ojla

"Life Sukhs is about moving back in with your parents at a time when all your mates are buying houses and having babies," explains Sukh Olja, in talking about her currently touring show. 
Rhod Gilbert

A MESSAGE OF HOPE

Message In A Bottle is a new dance-theatre storytelling spectacular about refugees, humanity and hope. The production takes to the stage in Birmingham this month...

Determined and daring, three siblings parted by violence step out on their own extraordinary adventures...

Directed and choreographed by triple Olivier Award nominee and Birmingham Hippodrome Associate Kate Prince, Message In A Bottle has been astounding audiences in the West End. The piece is inspired by the iconic hits of 17time Grammy Award-winning artist Sting.

"The production follows a family in a village as they're displaced due to war," explains associate choreographer and star of the show Lukas McFarlane. "It specifically focuses on three siblings in the family and their unique journeys and experiences of being refugees. It documents their attempts to find family, love and hope again in a new home."

Included among the Sting hits featured in Message In A Bottle are Roxanne, Every Breath You Take, Walking On The Moon, Fields Of Gold, Englishman In New York and Shape Of My Heart.

"What Sting speaks about in his music subjects like politics and the world climate - is still really relevant today, even when you listen to his earlier works," says Lukas. "So many of his songs still ring true! Being a massive fan of his, Kate felt like his songs and lyrics would lay really beautifully on a story about refugees.

"Message In A Bottle is definitely more like a ballet in terms of the fact that there's no dialogue - the story is told through dance, movement and music alone. Dance is a universal language - the emotion and energy behind it can be understood across all languages and cultures - so that's really interesting when you compare it to a story about people who are forced to leave their home and adjust to a new environment."

Having won Sky One's hit TV show, Got To Dance, at just 19 years of age, Lukas is fast becoming a well-known and widely respected artist. He has worked as a creative and choreographer on The X-Factor, The Voice and Strictly Come Dancing, and with artists including Taylor Swift and Celine Dion.

"In Message In A Bottle, I play the eldest brother. You get to see his attempts to find his version of family love after his own family is divided. Then, as associate choreographer, I worked with Kate on creating the dance. It's a wonderful hybrid of breaking and hip-hop styles, as well as contemporary. Kate has a massive background in hip-hop styles, but not necessarily contemporary, so I came in to make a contribution with that. I've helped Kate create this story through that hybrid movement.

"Working with her has been a gift - and that's putting it mildly! I've been such a massive fan of hers for so long, so when she reached out to me and said she was also a fan of mine, it was so humbling. I couldn't have asked for a better person to learn from in this realm, especially as I come from a TV commercial background, working with artists and in the music industry but with my training being in theatre.

"I'm so, so grateful to have had the opportunity to work with someone who is not only amazing at what she does, but who is also so kind and who cares so much about the stories she's telling and the company of dancers telling it. Kate is a very compassionate director and choreographer, and I feel very lucky to have worked with her.

"The biggest thing I've learnt from her is the power of storytelling; how even the tiniest, most minimalistic movement can contribute so much to an emotion or narrative. The beauty of theatre is that you're creating something which the audience can feel so palpably because it's right in front of them. That's very different to what I'm used to doing, with an audience watching something captured via a lens.

"Theatre is just so much more alive, and

feeling the audience's energy back from you is an incredible feeling.

"I'm the director of my own company -UnTitled Dance - and have self-produced three shows of my own, but to have worked in the West End is such a dream. Hopefully, with the knowledge I've gained and the experience of working with people like Kate, Sadler's Wells and Universal Music UK, doors will be opened for me to produce my own work on a larger scale. I'm a creative first and foremost - that's what I love doing."

Message In A Bottle will tug on your heartstrings, says Lukas: "The biggest thing we've tried to get across in the show is that hope and love prevail over everything else. While it's a really emotional story, we hope the audience is left with a sense of hope - a feeling that a sense of belonging can be created anywhere, and not necessarily just by blood either. Acceptance of who you are, no matter what your background is, can definitely be found.

"I'm obviously a little biased, but I honestly believe there's nothing else that's similar to what we've created. Message In A Bottle is so unique in that it is, essentially, a ballet, but from a more commercial narrative, about dance being the language of youth. It also tells such an emotional story. I promise that you will be left with lasting memories if you come to see it, whether what sticks in your mind is the incredible physicality of the dancers, the lighting, set & costume design, Sting's amazing music, or the actual story itself."

Message In A Bottle shows at Birmingham Hippodrome on Wednesday 8 & Thursday 9 April.

Yhonnie Scarce

Ikon Gallery, Birmingham, Thurs 9 April - Sun 3 May

"Some people don't like my work; they find it too confronting," says Australian Aboriginal glassblowing artist Yhonnie Scarce. "But if you don't want to engage in this conversation, then the solution is simple - don't look at my art. But that doesn't mean it will go away." Yhonnie, whose work explores the political nature and aesthetic qualities of glass, is undertaking a five-week residency at Ikon before presenting a new work in the venue's Tower Room. "To define the strength of our culture, it may seem strange to use glass," she says, "but it's not as fragile as most people would think. Glass can be very strong, and in that way it reflects the resilience of our people. It is a creation that has been witness to our journey, and one that still continues today."

Capturing the pomp and spectacle of the British court, the exploration and shaping of a modern nation, and a sense of the close-knit family at the centre of it all, Victoria & Albert: Our Lives In Watercolour is a touring exhibition from the Royal Collection. Throughout their marriage, Queen Victoria and Prince Albert were enthusiastic patrons and practitioners of the art of watercolour painting. They built up a collection of thousands of artworks and often spent happy evenings together organising their acquisitions into albums...

The exhibition is touring to mark the bicentenary of the births of both Victoria and Albert.

Cranach: Artist And Innovator

Compton Verney Art Gallery, Worcestershire, until Sun 4 June

Lucas Cranach the Elder may be best known in modern times for his seductive paintings of the female nude, but back in his day - some 500 years ago - it was his paintings of German nobility and the leaders of the Protestant Reformation for which he was most admired. This exhibition of work by one of the most

successful German artists of all time features paintings and illustrations on loan from the National Gallery, the Royal Collection, the British Museum and Waddesdon Manor.

The show also reflects on the enduring appeal of Cranach, whose work has been admired by a range of modern and contemporary artists, including Pablo Picasso.



Cornwall As Crucible

Barber Institute, University of Birmingham, until Sun 17 May

This hugely popular exhibition takes as its inspiration the Barber's recently acquired Constructivist sculpture - Russian artist Naum Gabo's Linear Construction In Space No1. Cornwall As Crucible considers the relationships and networks that existed between artists who lived and worked in the county (and most particularly in St Ives) during the mid-20th century.

Featuring works by, among others, Barbara Hepworth, Ben Nicholson, Peter Lanyon and Sandra Blow, the installation examines the artists' development of a visual language that explored the boundary between representation and abstraction.

The show also investigates the impact which the distinctive Cornish landscape had on the work of the artists residing in the region.



Made At MAC: Painting






