THE PATH TO REDEMPTION

Set against the tumultuous events that led to the fall of Afghanistan's monarchy and the rise of the Taliban, Khaled Hosseini's The Kite Runner is one of the 21st century's bestselling novels - and the stage adaptation of the story is coming to Wolverhampton this month...

Khaled Hosseini's story of trauma, guilt and redemption follows central character Amir from his childhood into manhood.

It is Amir's relationship with his father, and his close but strained friendship with Hassan, that guides The Kite Runner's narrative, which in turn is influenced by ethnically charged violence and the need to seek asylum.

"The Kite Runner is a journey that pretty much spans Amir's entire life up until his present day in 2002." explains David Ahmad, who plays the character. "Amir recounts his life and the choices he made that got him to that point. One choice from his childhood in particular he feels incredibly guilty for, and so The Kite Runner becomes the story of his path to redemption. It's definitely an epic journey. Essentially, he's a child who makes a mistake, and I think that's something which most people can relate to. A lot of people, especially at the end of act one, really don't like Amir. As a child, he's not a particularly likeable character. But the more I've lived with Amir, the more forgiveness I have for his actions, as I feel like I've been with him for so long - since the play was first staged in 2013, to be exact. He's a coward, sure, but at the end of the day he's a child who makes some poor choices. He certainly tries to work through them in the end."

This particular adaptation of The Kite Runner sticks as closely as possible to Hosseini's groundbreaking novel.

"I have to say that the play is such a faithful

adaptation of the book. Matthew Spangler did a wonderful job of really distilling the story into its key moments. Obviously there were lots of parts of the book that we simply couldn't fit in, but Matthew very cleverly picked out those essential moments to create the narrative arc of the play. People who've read the book don't often notice that we've left much out. It's a very successful adaptation - and very different to the film adaptation. I don't think the film worked particularly well. The play works much better because we've been able to keep the narrator character, where Amir relives parts of his life in front of the audience. That really helps create a better connection to the audience, as they go on the journey with Amir. It helps them feel part of the story."

Almost two decades after it was published, The Kite Runner's deep exploration of human relationships, and the wider political statements that the novel makes, continue to resonate.

"The Kite Runner is just as important today as when it was written. There are so many facets to the story, and that's why it's so well-loved. There's part of the story that everyone can relate to, in terms of the characters' own personal emotions and experiences and wider politics. The story definitely still resonates with the current situation in the Middle East - and with the refugee crisis in Syria, in particular. A lot of The Kite Runner is about being an immigrant; about adapting to leaving so much behind and being faced with a whole new culture; about which characters embrace the 'new ways' and which ones feel a little left behind, clinging to the old. Sadly, these are all very real dilemmas for some civilians in the Middle East, and they don't look like they're going away any time soon.

"Interestingly, on the first day of rehearsals, we all sat down as a cast and told our stories - and while not being exactly the same experiences as Amir and his father had, they certainly had some similarities. For example, my father came to the UK from Pakistan in the 196os. We all live with those experiences of feeling slightly different. Having that understanding of what life was like for my father trying to make his way in a very alien country makes me relate to the story on a personal level also.

"But this isn't just a political story; it's a story about people finding love, about regret, about the betrayal of a friend and a father-son relationship. There are so many aspects for the audience to connect with, and that's what The Kite Runner does so well. The story is such a rollercoaster, and Hosseini certainly fits a lot of gut-punches in there! It's so emotional. Certainly, the immediate reaction to the show is often one of silence, while the audience digests what's just happened. The main thing, though, is that there's still hope!"

The Kite Runner shows at Wolverhampton Grand Theatre from Tuesday 21 to Saturday 25 April.

REVIEW: INFINITII Sheer perfection at Staffordshire gem

Prestigious Indian street food eatery INFINITII is one of those restaurants that you'll find yourself still talking about months after paying a visit.

Located in the Staffordshire town of Abbots Bromley, INFINITII provides a modern twist on the textures and flavours of India, combining and celebrating diverse cooking techniques from multiple regions across the country.

The kitchen is fronted by awardwinning chef Mamrej Khan, whose CV includes stints at the five-star Taj Hotels in Chennai, The Rose Garden in the Maldives and the Deluxe Palace Hotel in Bahrain.

On the evening my partner and I visited INFINITII, we sampled the five-course tasting menu - a chef's surprise. The restaurant showcases a unique concept whereby the menu is catered to the customer. Diners are asked three questions: do you have allergens or dietary requirements? Is there anything that you don't like? Is there anything on the menu which is a must-have for you? Your musthave choice(s) will be included within your specially designed menu

We started off with a pint of Kingfisher and an INFINITII G&T Sweet Gin Cocktail, comprising Nelson's Rose & Raspberry Gin, juniper berries, cardamom and Fever Tree Aromatic Tonic. INFINITII is in partnership with Nelson's, a Staffordshire-based distillery, so we felt it was only fitting to sample their creations. I'm not actually a big gin fan (bucking the trend, I know), but my selected drink was both refreshing and tasty. It may even have converted me, which is something I thought would never happen.

Our first course, light and crispy vadams - a modern but less oily alternative to poppadoms - were served with a homemade spiced tomato salsa and a fresh onion green salad.

They were swiftly followed by course number two - aloo brie tikki and kaffir lime lemon sole. A vegetarian dish (which can be made vegan by swapping the brie for a vegan cheese), the aloo brie tikki comprised spiced mashed potato cakes stuffed with gooey, melted brie and coated with cashew nutflavoured breadcrumbs. The three potato cakes were served atop a sweet tamarind sauce alongside decorative swipes of vibrant rhubarb and honey and mustard sauces. The flavour combinations were simply stunning!

The fish dish featured a beautifully soft and delicate shallow fried lemon sole fillet marinated with ginger, garlic, curry leaf and paprika, served with mint lime olive oil - a healthier option which didn't compromise on flavour whatsoever.

We were seriously impressed and beyond excited about what was to follow!

My partner's must-have choice was rabbit varuval - wild rabbit meat marinated with homeground spices and served with green chutney. Presented on the bone, the sweet rabbit was cooked to perfection, the coating showcasing just the right amount of spice. The green chutney, bursting with mint and coriander flavours, was the perfect accompaniment.

I'm a sucker for a bit of food theatre and INFINITII's smoky lamb tikka dish provided just that. Served inside a smokefilled dome, which was lifted at the table, sat marinated boneless morsels of cinnamon-smoked lamb fillet, grilled to perfection in the restaurant's clay oven. The smoky meat was served with roasted peppers & onion and accompanied by delicious green chutney and rhubarb sauce.

On to the main courses of duck lucknowi and machchi mango curry. The first of the two dishes featured seared barbary duck breast simmered in caramelised onion, tomato, yoghurt & cashew nut sauce. Bright orange in colour and sweet in flavour with its underlying hint of cashew, the sauce was absolutely phenomenal and definitely one of my highlights of the evening. The duck itself was cooked to absolute perfection.

The second dish featured soft pan-fried fillets of tilapia fish simmered in coconut milk, fivespice - a sweet & sour sauce of green mangoes - and served with a portion of nicely seasoned spiced potato. I adore a fish curry, and INFINITII's offering was up there with the nicest I've ever eaten. The perfectly cooked fish, the spicy, creamy sauce, and what is essentially Indianinspired mashed potato, made for the comfort-food dish of my dreams.

To accompany the two dishes there was a portion of saffron rice, a portion of rice flour roti (a healthier alternative to naan) and one of the richest, creamiest and downright tastiest dal makhanis I'd ever eaten. I genuinely couldn't fault a thing the food was sheer perfection.

Our final dishes of the evening were the desserts: a sweet and refreshing mango sorbet supplied by award-winning dairy farm Daltons, and a rich cinnamon dark & white chocolate mousse served with caramelised golden syrup and decorative swirls of mango sauce. Both were beautiful in taste and presentation. Indeed, the presentation at INFINITII is second to none, and in my opinion of Michelin-star quality.

My partner and I sat looking at each other in utter disbelief. How had we just enjoyed so much outstanding food for a mere £30 each?! INFINITII's tasting menu is value for money and then some! Our debut experience at the restaurant really couldn't have been any better. The food was exemplary and the flavours exceptional, with every course also showcasing excellent technical ability. The service was fantastic, the staff being both friendly and knowledgable. Not surprisingly, I can't wait to return to sample some more of the delicious cuisine this gem of a restaurant has to offer. 



Sports fans in the audience may be interested to know that Tom is the son of television presenter Jim Rosenthal, one of the broadcasters on whom Steve Coogan's Alan Partridge character was originally based.

John Shuttleworth

"If my first reaction to the prospect of doing a show is one of raw terror, I know I'm on the right path. I'm always open to a new experience, however scary!"

Having previously provided tour support for James Acaster and Joe Lycett, Jack Barry here steps out on his own for a show that sees him addressing the fact that he doesn't think you've been laughing enough. No surprise there, says Jack, what with the world having turned to s***. Jack's show is called Alien - by which he means the immigrant kind - and being a potsmoking old hippie at heart, he'd be happy to do away with borders altogether. His timely message about acceptance will no doubt resonate with many in The Rep's audience, his line in humour with even more.

Joel Dommett


Rhod Gilbert

A MESSAGE OF HOPE

Message In A Bottle is a new dance-theatre storytelling spectacular about refugees, humanity and hope. The production takes to the stage in Birmingham this month...

Determined and daring, three siblings parted by violence step out on their own extraordinary adventures...

Directed and choreographed by triple Olivier Award nominee and Birmingham Hippodrome Associate Kate Prince, Message In A Bottle has been astounding audiences in the West End. The piece is inspired by the iconic hits of 17time Grammy Award-winning artist Sting.

"The production follows a family in a village as they're displaced due to war," explains associate choreographer and star of the show Lukas McFarlane. "It specifically focuses on three siblings in the family and their unique journeys and experiences of being refugees. It documents their attempts to find family, love and hope again in a new home."

Included among the Sting hits featured in Message In A Bottle are Roxanne, Every Breath You Take, Walking On The Moon, Fields Of Gold, Englishman In New York and Shape Of My Heart.

"What Sting speaks about in his music subjects like politics and the world climate - is still really relevant today, even when you listen to his earlier works," says Lukas. "So many of his songs still ring true! Being a massive fan of his, Kate felt like his songs and lyrics would lay really beautifully on a story about refugees.

"Message In A Bottle is definitely more like a ballet in terms of the fact that there's no dialogue - the story is told through dance, movement and music alone. Dance is a universal language - the emotion and energy behind it can be understood across all languages and cultures - so that's really interesting when you compare it to a story about people who are forced to leave their home and adjust to a new environment."

Having won Sky One's hit TV show, Got To Dance, at just 19 years of age, Lukas is fast becoming a well-known and widely respected artist. He has worked as a creative and choreographer on The X-Factor, The Voice and Strictly Come Dancing, and with artists including Taylor Swift and Celine Dion.

"In Message In A Bottle, I play the eldest brother. You get to see his attempts to find his version of family love after his own family is divided. Then, as associate choreographer, I worked with Kate on creating the dance. It's a wonderful hybrid of breaking and hip-hop styles, as well as contemporary. Kate has a massive background in hip-hop styles, but not necessarily contemporary, so I came in to make a contribution with that. I've helped Kate create this story through that hybrid movement.

"Working with her has been a gift - and that's putting it mildly! I've been such a massive fan of hers for so long, so when she reached out to me and said she was also a fan of mine, it was so humbling. I couldn't have asked for a better person to learn from in this realm, especially as I come from a TV commercial background, working with artists and in the music industry but with my training being in theatre.

"I'm so, so grateful to have had the opportunity to work with someone who is not only amazing at what she does, but who is also so kind and who cares so much about the stories she's telling and the company of dancers telling it. Kate is a very compassionate director and choreographer, and I feel very lucky to have worked with her.

"The biggest thing I've learnt from her is the power of storytelling; how even the tiniest, most minimalistic movement can contribute so much to an emotion or narrative. The beauty of theatre is that you're creating something which the audience can feel so palpably because it's right in front of them. That's very different to what I'm used to doing, with an audience watching something captured via a lens.

"Theatre is just so much more alive, and

feeling the audience's energy back from you is an incredible feeling.

"I'm the director of my own company -UnTitled Dance - and have self-produced three shows of my own, but to have worked in the West End is such a dream. Hopefully, with the knowledge I've gained and the experience of working with people like Kate, Sadler's Wells and Universal Music UK, doors will be opened for me to produce my own work on a larger scale. I'm a creative first and foremost - that's what I love doing."

Message In A Bottle will tug on your heartstrings, says Lukas: "The biggest thing we've tried to get across in the show is that hope and love prevail over everything else. While it's a really emotional story, we hope the audience is left with a sense of hope - a feeling that a sense of belonging can be created anywhere, and not necessarily just by blood either. Acceptance of who you are, no matter what your background is, can definitely be found.

"I'm obviously a little biased, but I honestly believe there's nothing else that's similar to what we've created. 

Yhonnie Scarce

Ikon Gallery, Birmingham, Thurs 9 April - Sun 3 May

"Some people don't like my work; they find it too confronting," says Australian Aboriginal glassblowing artist Yhonnie Scarce. "But if you don't want to engage in this conversation, then the solution is simple - don't look at my art. But that doesn't mean it will go away." Yhonnie, whose work explores the political nature and aesthetic qualities of glass, is undertaking a five-week residency at Ikon before presenting a new work in the venue's Tower Room. "To define the strength of our culture, it may seem strange to use glass," she says, "but it's not as fragile as most people would think. Glass can be very strong, and in that way it reflects the resilience of our people. It is a creation that has been witness to our journey, and one that still continues today."

Victoria & Albert: Our Lives In Watercolour

Wolverhampton Art Gallery, until Sunday 31 May

Capturing the pomp and spectacle of the British court, the exploration and shaping of a modern nation, and a sense of the close-knit family at the centre of it all, Victoria & Albert: Our Lives In Watercolour is a touring exhibition from the Royal Collection. Throughout their marriage, Queen Victoria and Prince Albert were enthusiastic patrons and practitioners of the art of watercolour painting. They built up a collection of thousands of artworks and often spent happy evenings together organising their acquisitions into albums...

The exhibition is touring to mark the bicentenary of the births of both Victoria and Albert.

Cranach: Artist And Innovator

Compton Verney Art Gallery, Worcestershire, until Sun 4 June

Lucas Cranach the Elder may be best known in modern times for his seductive paintings of the female nude, but back in his day - some 500 years ago - it was his paintings of German nobility and the leaders of the Protestant Reformation for which he was most admired.

This exhibition of work by one of the most successful German artists of all time features paintings and illustrations on loan from the National Gallery, the Royal Collection, the British Museum and Waddesdon Manor.

The show also reflects on the enduring appeal of Cranach, whose work has been admired by a range of modern and contemporary artists, including Pablo Picasso.



Cornwall As Crucible

Barber Institute, University of Birmingham, until Sun 17 May

This hugely popular exhibition takes as its inspiration the Barber's recently acquired Constructivist sculpture - Russian artist Naum Gabo's Linear Construction In Space No1. Cornwall As Crucible considers the relationships and networks that existed between artists who lived and worked in the county (and most particularly in St Ives) during the mid-20th century.

Featuring works by, among others, Barbara Hepworth, Ben Nicholson, Peter Lanyon and Sandra Blow, the installation examines the artists' development of a visual language that explored the boundary between representation and abstraction.

The show also investigates the impact which the distinctive Cornish landscape had on the work of the artists residing in the region.



Made At MAC: Painting
