
Benson Boone to play Utilita Arena

Primarily known as a jazz singer, Jacqui also draws on influences including folk, soul, classical and blues. Her latest album features a selection of songs which have all 'struck a chord' in her life, with Michel Legrand's Windmills Of Your Mind serving as its centrepiece.

Boo and Yvonne weave these fragmented, ephemeral stories with their own.



SAM EVERY (LITTLE) BIG BAND

Lichfield Cathedral, Friday 18 July

What if Frank Sinatra had sung the theme tune to Fireman Sam?

Sam Every and his band - featuring some of the hottest young jazz talent in the UK embark on a whirlwind tour of TV themes, reimagined as big-band classics.

This fun, family-friendly concert is a great entry point into jazz - and the only place you can hear the Match Of The Day theme as a Count Basie swinger, or Coronation Street as a smoochy jazz ballad.



KASAI MASAI

The Hub at St Mary's, Sunday 20 July

Superstars of Soukous - Congolese dance music - Kasai Masai are influenced by sounds passed down through the generations.

The group, who are originally from Congo and now based in London, present original compositions that move beyond traditional Congolese music to include galloping rhythms, strong melodies and passionate beats. Their work nods to the cultural diversity of the Congo - written in Swahili, Lingala and Kimongo.

TAKE A CHILL PILL

The Old Joint Stock is bringing contemporary musical theatre to Birmingham



Birmingham's Old Joint Stock Theatre (OJST) has developed a reputation as a hotspot for cabaret, comedy, and (more recently) innovative versions of acclaimed musicals. Passionate about presenting high-quality shows in the venue's small-scale space, Theatre Manager James Edge spoke to What's On about OJST's summer production - cult favourite Be More Chill, which blends teen drama and future-tech - and also revealed what else is on the horizon...

The Old Joint Stock Theatre (OJST) - situated above the Grade II listed Old Joint Stock pub and half-hidden in the heart of Birmingham's city centre - is an intimate studio space specialising in fringe theatre. Under the management of James Edge, who has worked there for the past two years, the venue's upcoming in-house programme features a selection of ambitious musical theatre productions.

This summer's offering is Be More Chill (Wednesday 6 - Sunday 31 August), a musical which premiered in 2015 before making its way to Broadway and the West End in the six years following. The show found rising online popularity thanks to its soundtrack, which hit the top-10 charts in the US, as well as winning a Tony award for Best Original Score.

"Be More Chill follows a young guy called Jeremy who is not very popular at school." James explains. "He's not a cool guy; he's a bit of a loner. One of the kids at school tells him about a supercomputer chip - a Japanese pill you can take that teaches you how to be cool. Jeremy takes the tablet and the 'SQUIP' appears, which is this 'computer' character. But being cool's not all it's set out to be..." The musical's ultimate message is about ensuring that, in the face of self-doubt or negative feelings, the loudest voice in your head is a positive one. And in a world where AI technology is surging forward, the story holds even more relevance than it did in 2015. "We want to update the show with the

character of the SQUIP, so we see that development - to see what happens as it learns about the human race."

The production is one of the Old Joint Stock Theatre's largest musical endeavours to date. With a cast of 10, plus the band, and a limit of 80 seats in the venue, budgets can be tight when ensuring that the company is paid fairly.

"You have to be really creative with what you do with your set, costume and lighting. We don't have the ability to spend whatever we want. It's such a small space, doing bigger shows is a much higher risk."

However, the limitations of performing in a smaller room, to a smaller audience, is also one of the venue's greatest strengths. As James explains, the intimacy of performance at the OJST makes for a unique theatrical experience: "Instead of presenting a piece of work over the top of everyone's heads, you

bring your eyeline down. You look the audience in the eye and take them on that journey from the get-go. And throughout the show, you include the audience as much as possible."

With a wide variety of theatre spaces available in Birmingham, James' aim is to feature highly regarded musicals which perhaps haven't gained enough of a following to fill 1,000 seats, or warrant a major UK tour. "I wanted to fit into that gap - to produce contemporary musicals that people know, and produce shows that become people's new favourite. We did the UK premiere of The Mad Ones and of First Dates. And through that, people have been coming more and more. We see familiar faces, and people book to see every in-house production now, which is great. I feel an obligation to that loyal audience, to take things further, and keep pushing what we can achieve."

And the OJST is making a name for itself within the wider theatrical community. Over 2,000 people applied for the 10 roles in Be More Chill, including performers who have appeared on West End and Broadway stages. "Whilst we wanted some people with fantastic CVs in the room, we've made sure some of our cast are people without that experience. We wanted to stay true to fringe theatre, and made sure that at least half of the cast are new graduates, or haven't had that lead role yet. As a fringe theatre, we're

fresh, upcoming talent."
Looking to the future, the scale of production will increase yet again with Bonnie & Clyde: The Musical, which runs at the venue in October. The infamous outlaw duo have been depicted on stage and screen many times - but James intends to draw their story away from the glitz of Hollywood.

providing a platform and opportunity for

"Their story is not a story of glamour. It was dirty and bloody and uncomfortable. There's a fantastic book called Go Down Together, which is the closest account of what happened, and it's such a great read. We want to make it really raw and visceral. We're considering putting it in the round and really stripping it back.

"We're in a time of contemporary musical theatre. It started with Heathers. Then SIX and Dear Evan Hansen had these massive cult followings... And two of the shows that developed a cult following in the West End were Be More Chill and Bonnie & Clyde.

Hopefully, we'll get our loyal audience coming to see how far we're pushing our inhouse productions, and then a new audience who come because they love the shows."

James hints that OJST's productions are set to become increasingly ambitious - the theatre's two biggest shows yet are scheduled for April and August 2026 - so watch this space!

At the end of 2025, the venue is hosting a festive production with a difference. It's A Wonderful Knife is partly inspired by the BBC's record-breaking 1989 screening of Crocodile Dundee, which remains the mostwatched film ever broadcast on Christmas Day in the UK.

"We found a story that mixes It's A Wonderful Life - arguably the most famous Christmas story of all time - with Crocodile Dundee. We've made a story that's cohesive, hilarious and actually heartfelt - and it works. It's going to be barmy. You'll have a croc, wearing crocs, put it that way!" Producing large-scale musicals in a small-scale venue isn't a one-man job, but it's not far off, when distilled down to the theatre's core personnel.

"I'm grateful for my team, Liam and Emily. We're a team of three and we work very hard between us - with some fantastic freelancers as well. Emily's a fantastic director and producer, and Liam - well, what he can do with trailers and artwork...

"It means we're a crack team. And we have this theatrical playground for the shows we're creating."

With James and the team's passion for theatre, and their drive to create astonishing shows, it seems like anything is possible. But are there any productions which might be off-limits?

"My favourite show of all time, which couldn't work in our space - and I've spent many nights awake, trying to think of how it could - would be The Hunchback Of Notre Dame. It has a choir of 24 and a band. The music is the most stunning thing I've ever heard, but I think if we had a choir of 24 singing The Bells Of Notre Dame, we may get some noise complaints..."

Tenebrae Choir

Passion and precision are the core values
of this award-winning chamber choir,

Nigel Short.

Although dedicated to supporting contemporary composers, Tenebrae are also held in high regard for their interpretations of the choral cannon; works by Poulenc, Tavener, Brahms and Bruckner have all featured in their extensive repertoire across the years.

This cathedral concert, presented as part of the Lichfield Festival, features a performance of Joby Talbot's Path Of Miracles. The choir's first major commission back in 2005, the dramatic four-movement piece is based on the Catholic pilgrimage to Santiago.









Jewelia

Sunflower Lounge, Birmingham, Sat 12 July Emotional vocals, poignant lyrics and memorable melodies are impressively brought together in the nostalgia-infused indie pop and piano-powered fairytales of Bucharestborn Iulia Tache, who performs and records under the moniker Jewelia. Now based in London, the rising-star singer-songwriter explores a wide variety of music, from cinematic chamber pop to catchy synthpop and pop-punk-influenced rock.

Jimmy Carr

Civic Hall, Wolverhampton, Sat 12 July; Utilita Arena Birmingham, Wed 10 December

Jimmy Carr's comedy is all about quickfire, deadpan one-liners - so many of them, in fact, that he's not sure whether their content actually matters all that much: "People don't really remember the individual jokes I tell because I tell such a lot of them. What they do remember is how those jokes make them feel."

Jimmy is a comedian for whom no subject is off limits: "I'll talk about anything as long as I feel the joke justifies it. Sure, it may cause controversy - but then controversy is an easy story on a slow-news day. And I never apologise for jokes. After all, I'm not making a serious political statement, I'm just trying to make somebody laugh."

Lucy Beaumont

Lichfield Garrick, Wed 16 July; Birmingham Town Hall, Wed 10 December; Warwick Arts Centre, Coventry, Thurs 11 December

"I started out acting but quickly realised I needed to try something else," says Hull-born comic Lucy Beaumont, who was diagnosed with



ADHD a couple of years back and more recently separated from her husband and fellow comedian, Jon Richardson. "I've had all sorts of humorous things happen to me in my life, so I thought it made sense to see how I'd do at being funny."

Jonny Cole

Dudley Town Hall, Fri 4 July; Walsall Arena, Fri 11 July

"It's difficult for me to put my brand of comedy into an industry-standard soundbite," says local comedian Jonny Cole. "There



are a lot of people who love Black Country humour and who'd love to go into a rough & ready Black Country pub just to listen to the banter - and that's exactly what I do. I've absorbed Black Country humour the whole of my life. I take it out of that pub - where people wouldn't dare go, in case they got their teeth knocked out - and I put it into a safe, controlled environment where they can enjoy it."



Mark Watson

The Hub at St Mary's, Lichfield, Fri 18 July; Foxlowe Arts Centre, Staffs, Fri 26 September; Midlands Arts Centre (MAC), Birmingham, Sat 27 September; Royal Spa Centre, Leamington Spa, Wed 1 - Thurs 2 October; Theatre Severn, Shrewsbury, Sun 2 November

Well established on the UK comedy circuit, Mark Watson was born in Bristol to Welsh parents and initially delivered his act with a Welsh accent, claiming he felt "more comfortable talking in a voice that I didn't quite recognise as my own".

"Comedy is certainly a time-consuming

element of my life," he admits, "but then while I'm out touring and on stage, there are people at home doing far less glamorous things. There have certainly been times when I've been very happy to say, 'Of course I'd like to stay and help out with that plumbing crisis, but the Midlands awaits!"









Shrewsbury International Comedy Festival

Theatre Severn and various other venues across Shrewsbury, Wed 9 - Sun 13 July

As well as being a hotbed of food and folk music, Shrewsbury in recent times has also become a centre of comedy excellence, thanks to this hugely popular event. Five of the town's venues will be co-hosting the festival, which offers top-drawer comedians the chance to preview their new material in readiness for the Edinburgh Festival. As on previous occasions, the 2025 edition of the five-day laugh-in is brought to a close with a special gala event at Theatre Severn,

with this year's line-up of laughter merchants comprising Troy Hawke, Lindsey Santoro, Tez Ilyas and Scott Bennett (pictured above). Other comedians contributing to the festival include Abandoman, Scott Bennett, Tony Law, Sally-Anne Hayward, Ignacio Lopez, Frankie Munroe, Dave Chawner and Stella Graham.

Terry Christian, one-time presenter of cult television series The Word, also puts in an appearance.



THINKING GAMES

Alan Davies talks about returning to the stage for the first time in a decade

Comedian and QI star Alan Davies is back on tour for the first time in a decade - and the first time since the publication of an extraordinary memoir detailing his traumatic childhood. It's good to get back to doing the thing that really defines him, he tells What's On...

It's hard not to like Alan Davies. The Essexborn comedian is hugely engaging company, quick to laugh as well as mull over the ups, downs, complexities and absurdities of life. Which is especially gratifying in the wake of Just Ignore Him, his astonishingly candid second memoir that was published in 2020 and contained shocking revelations about his difficult childhood. The mother he adored died when he was six years old, he never got on with his two siblings - spending many family events as something of an outcast - and most alarmingly of all, he was sexually molested by his father.

The book is a tough read ("hard going but worth it" for writer and reader alike, says its author) but has been acclaimed for its candour and honesty. It has also been lauded for providing an insight into how such abuse manifests itself in the behaviour of the victim, something that has prompted many others to reach out, he says.

"A lot of people have been in touch with me who have had similar experiences and said very nice things about the book," he says. "I was told this would happen - that once launched into the world, it would develop a life of its own. I feel quite glad that I did it." Even though the book contains many moments of (mostly dark) humour, the content is hardly material for comedy routines - but does the very fact that it exists inform his new stand-up show, Think Ahead, which he's touring in the autumn?

"It does a bit, because I now feel able, just a little bit, to address some of the things that happened to me as a kid, and also to talk about the sort of stand-up comedian I am nowadays, as opposed to what I was in my 20s, and why I did the things I did then and how I am now."

In some ways, Alan will no longer be the same person to those who have read the book and/or know the story.

"Perhaps that's right; I'll see how it goes. Lots of [the show] is about my life now - the byline is that I spend more time in the pharmacy than the gym, and the title is about the inevitable thinking ahead you do as you reach the second half of your life... children growing

up, what the future holds and so on."
So 'Think Ahead' isn't the sort of arbitrary title comedians typically give their shows just to appease an agent with a poster to design? "There's always an element of that, and it's always inevitable because it's unusual that you're gonna be naming a show that's fully written, so it's necessarily got to be a little open ended. I actually use the phrase 'think ahead' in one of the routines, and when I was tinkering with ideas, it's the one that stuck. Pithy and to the point!"

It's been 10 years since Alan last went out on tour, a gap almost identical to the one he left between stand-up stints in the early noughties. I wondered if it reflected a love/hate relationship with his craft, but it turns out he's largely been focused on other things.

"We had a third child nine years ago and things got pretty busy at home. I was still gigging when he was born, and then I did a Creative Writing MA at Goldsmiths College, and although it was part-time, I spent a couple of years on that. It's where I began to write Just Ignore Him. I carried on writing that, and then Covid happened - everything closed, and when I put the book out, I couldn't do any book festivals or appearances.

"I got back on the horse a little bit when things started opening up, and then I thought sh*t, I'm 60 next year, I better get out there."

Speaking of which, does he find returning to the stage nerve-wracking, or is it more like riding a bike?

"It's a bit of both. I know it'll be alright. I've got loads of material, and ideas for more. I'm going to book an opening act this time, which isn't something I did on the last two tours, which meant I ended up on stage two hours a night, and that was too much - too much for the audience, never mind me. "So I'll do 70 to 80 minutes, and it should be a good night and everyone will go home happy. But there are always nerves - and you look at the tour dates and think 'Oh my God that's a lot of travelling about.' So you can have negative thoughts, but I know that once

I get on stage with the mic in my hand, I feel very at home. It's very much what I see myself as - a comedian."

The show's content is also very much about where he is now (he turns 60 next March) and will be "relatable for people of a certain age" he says.

"I've noticed my audience is growing up with me. I did a show recently in Milton Keynes and a phone went off, an alarm on a phone. I could see someone rummaging about, desperately trying to turn it off, and I said 'Is that alarm to remind you to take your medication?' And the woman said 'Yes, it is.' That got such a big laugh, but I knew that was my audience."

That said, he's quick to point out "it's not an OAP's show," and he'll constantly be on the lookout for new material to help it evolve.

"You're always hoping something new comes along - a new thought or a new line you can add in. I find most things funny, and the process of accumulating material is to jot down anything you hear or see that's funny. But you must write it down or you won't remember it - the worst thing for a comedian is to think of something funny and then forget it."

And while his three children provide an increasingly useful source of inspiration for material, he admits it's largely in terms of attitude rather than specific behaviour.

"I've got a routine I'm working on about kids parachuting and me nagging them about whether they've checked their 'chutes properly." He adopts a sullen teenager voice and says 'yeah yeah'. "And then, when they jump out of the plane, they've forgotten to pack it. And of course they leave the door open behind them. I've just thought of that while we're talking, so I better write that down."

There he goes, thinking ahead as ever.





War Horse The Alexandra, Birmingham, Thurs 10 - Sat 19 July






























Ghost Stories



Showstopper: The Improvised Musical

Lysander and Demetrius both fancy Hermia, Helena's sitting on the shelf, Titania and Oberon are up to no good, and Puck's got his finger in more pies than Mr Kipling... Not that the plot is likely to be overly important in this particular production, given the fact that it's zany funsters Oddsocks who're at the helm! Expect plenty of madcap mayhem and knockabout fun from this always-value-for-money ensemble.

The Winter's Tale

Royal Shakespeare Theatre, Stratford-upon, Avon, Sat 12 July - Sat 30 August

One of Shakespeare's last plays - and featuring perhaps the quirkiest ever stage direction of 'exit, pursued by a bear'! - The Winter's Tale recounts the tragic story of the jealous King Leontes, whose unfounded belief that his wife, Hermione, has been unfaithful leads to a series of disastrous actions...

Director Yaël Farber makes her RSC debut, having recently helmed acclaimed productions of King Lear and an Oliviernominated Macbeth for the Almeida Theatre. "The Winter's Tale is a beautiful and strange beast," says Yaël, "a mystery to be solved; a fusion of gritty tragedy and leaps of faith for both the characters and the audience. "We are in such a stark and brutal time in the

world - and this story plunges us into the shadows of human nature from the start. The journey then expands into a space of miracles and wonder.

"I am drawn to stories that explore the shadows - but I am most interested right now in the possibility of redemption. A redemption that is earned."

Much Ado About Falstaff



KINDRED SPIRITS

Acclaimed RSC production My Neighbour Totoro is enjoying an extended run in the West End

The Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC) and Executive Producer Joe Hisaishi, in collaboration with Improbable and Nippon TV, have announced an extended West End run of My Neighbour Totoro. The production uses expertly implemented design and puppetry to bring the story to life on stage, showcasing the practical craftsmanship that goes into any RSC creation. What's On spoke to Ami Okumura Jones and Victoria Chen, who play young sisters Satsuki and Mei, to find out more...

Created in Stratford-upon-Avon and premiered at the Barbican Theatre in 2022, the Royal Shakespeare Company's (RSC) spectacular stage production of My Neighbour Totoro has now taken up residence in London's Gillian Lynne Theatre, where it will show in an extended run of performances until next March.

The 1988 animated film of the same name (albeit with an American spelling) was created by Studio Ghibli and directed by Hayao Miyazaki. It has become an enduring classic, which combines a touching human story with wild, surreal fantasy.

The story follows 10-year-old Satsuki and her younger sister, Mei, as they adjust to a new life in the countryside with their father, in the hope that the change will eventually benefit their hospitalised mother. Exploring the natural world around her new home, Mei befriends Totoro, a formidably large - but very cuddly - spirit of the forest...

Ami Okumura Jones has portrayed Satsuki since the show's first inception. Victoria (Vic) Chen, who plays Mei, joined the company this year. Both Ami and Vic have memories of watching the film, and other Studio Ghibli creations, as children.

"My mother is Japanese, and I grew up in Hong Kong." says Ami. "The films were as foundational to my childhood as Wallace & Gromit or Toy Story might be for a more Western audience. I don't remember the first time I saw them - they were just always there."

For Vic, the sisters' story resonates with her own childhood experiences. "How do you navigate what the world is throwing at you? When you don't understand what's going on, you're moving to a new place, you've got to be brave, and you've got to make new friends - it can get quite scary. This story reminds us to be curious. To keep our hearts, our minds, and our arms open to whatever comes - and to have joy!"

All the characters are played by adult actors, but Vic and Ami are incredibly childlike on stage, partly due to their own performances, but also thanks to their fellow cast members. "We work with such a great company of

"We work with such a great company of actors," says Vic. "They're really good at suspending their disbelief as they talk to us,

especially when we have Kimie Nakano's costumes on. We really look like kids!"
And while the story is definitely still a hit with youngsters, nostalgic adults also make up a proportion of its audience.

"When you watch My Neighbor Totoro, depending on where you are in life, it's astonishing how the film seems to change," Ami explains. "Its this magical fairytale when you're a kid, and then it becomes quite a heart-wrenching, bittersweet tale as an adult."

The stage show was adapted by Tom Morton-Smith and produced by the film's composer, Joe Hisaishi, with the Royal Shakespeare Company. While the story might seem decidedly un-Shakespearean, Vic has her own theories about why Totoro and the RSC are a perfect fit.

"The Royal Shakespeare Company is bringing stories to life from around the world, the way Shakespeare did, and bringing new audiences into the theatre. Listening to what people are interested in, bringing it to the stage, giving them a new experience - it makes a lot of sense for the RSC to be telling a story like this. It's poetic in its own way. I think Shakespeare would be proud, if he were alive."

"We are part of a long and very proud heritage," adds Ami, harking back to the RSC's contribution to mega-hits Les Misérables and Matilda. "They are champions of new and exciting work, as well as being custodians of Shakespeare." My Neighbour Totoro, like Les Mis, premiered

at London's Barbican Centre, the RSC's home-away-from-home in the capital. This year, the production has moved half an hour down the road to the Gillian Lynne Theatre, which has a slightly cosier stage set-up.

"What you gain there is a sense of intimacy that I really wasn't expecting," says Ami. "It's been magnificent watching the creative team and the backstage crew find solutions to how we fit this enormous, wonderful show in there... The backstage ballet and choreography is as impressive as what you see on stage."

Larger-than-life style is built into the design of the show - in particular, through the puppetry. Bringing to life creatures that were originally dreamed up via hand-drawn animation is no mean feat. From the wobbly, chaotic chickens (Vic's favourite puppets) to the psychedelic, 12-legged Catbus (yes, it's a cat that is also a bus!), real care has been taken to represent the magic and wonder of each puppet's design.

"That journey is complete when you put them in the hands of the puppeteers, and they come to life," says Ami. "You get delicate, deceptively simple puppets, and then you get some really big ones that are marvels of design, engineering and puppetry... It makes our job easy - it's not difficult to believe they're alive."

Alongside recognisable characters, the play's score, rearranged and orchestrated by Will Stewart, will be familiar to fans of the film. In fact, it was a condition of the adaptation that composer Joe Hisaishi would be involved during production.


"The soundtrack is so iconic and so beloved," says Ami. "You can see the musicians throughout the show. The puppeteers are called the Kazego - 'wind spirits'. They are the spirits of the forest, who move the story about. The band are all in green, up in the trees - they are like spirits as well. Music is interwoven into the piece, and integral."


Ami has fond memories of the show's rehearsal period, in Stratford-upon-Avon: "We spent eight weeks of summer in the countryside around Stratford, making the show. It felt perfect. We were having our lunch next to the river, watching the swans, and then going back to create a show about the forest. The sticks that I drop in Act 1 - we needed some sticks, so a stage manager went out and collected some sticks! They stayed with us to the West End!

"Talking about the spirits of the forest, among all those trees, we did feel like Will's spirit was smiling down at us, giving us the thumbs-up."

"It's a one-person show where my character is a major James Bond fan and uses him as inspiration for how to live," Cyril told Starburst. "But as he gets older and wiser, he starts to question if this is a good idea...

Ultimately, the show is about ideas of masculinity, and how we feel we need to express ourselves because of societal pressures. Sometimes that's positive, sometimes it's toxic. Oh, and [the show] is funny! That's not just *my* opinion - people actually laugh when I expect them to!"

G4 Phantoms Of The Popera

Having scored a hit with debut offering Yoga & Sex... For Women (Over 40), Kathryn Haywood here turns her attention to the art of illusion. The Hong Kong-born comedian is promising a show in which she will 'baffle with her feats of mentalism', and 'confuse with what she keeps under her hat'.



Fun-loving Oddsocks bring Shakespeare into the open air - and it works like a Dream...



Oddsocks Productions, formed in 1989 by husband & wife team Andy Barrow and Elli Mackenzie, have developed a reputation for bringing the fun side of Shakespeare into the open - quite literally. This month, the company tours their new production of A Midsummer Night's Dream to a selection of outdoor Midlands venues, promising a high-energy, feelgood show for all the family. Although this particular version will be shaken up for a modern audience, it's still definitely Shakespeare - as founder Elli explains to What's On...

Midlands-based fans of Oddsocks Productions know they're in for a good time when the summer season rolls around and the company's latest off-the-wall Shakespeare adaptation arrives in the region. Oddsocks have toured regularly for over 35 vears, visiting outdoor venues with adventurous, inclusive and highly entertaining versions of centuries-old plays. For anyone who has yet to experience one of their offerings, now might be the time to give it a go. This year's summer tour features a new production of Shakespeare's magical comedy, A Midsummer Night's Dream - billed as great fun for anyone from age seven to 107 - with transformed tradesmen, star-crossed lovers and a sprinkling of fairy mischief. "Giving people an opportunity to see Shakespeare, and not see it as something that's unapproachable, is part of our mission," says Oddsocks co-founder Elli Mackenzie. "It's always a joy when we do a play which parents will be able to say to their children, 'I know this one - it's a fun one!' It's a good introduction to Shakespeare." Even if you're an Oddsocks regular, Elli is confident that this production will be unlike any version of the play that you've seen hefore.

"Athens becomes the Taste of Athens restaurant, and the lovers are actually on their first dates! It's still Shakespeare, it's still the text, it's still a huge amount of fun, but it's taken from a very modern perspective. The play within the play - featuring the 'rude mechanicals', who in our production are the kitchen staff - is hilarious, because Shakespeare was a genius. There's very little you need to do to it to make it work. If you've seen A Midsummer Night's Dream before, I can guarantee you've never seen it this way." When choosing which Shakespeare plays to perform, the Oddsocks team are conscious that much has changed since the author put quill to parchment - so they create a show which is suitably pitched to a modern crowd. "Even in A Midsummer Night's Dream, we're making some changes, to make it more palatable for a contemporary audience. Four hundred and fifty years ago, what was acceptable to white, middle-aged playwrights and their theatre-goers is perhaps less so now - we're in the 21st century, and a little bit different. The nice thing is that we can be flexible with Shakespeare, just as long as we use the text, we make sense of it, and we don't make decisions which take it so far

removed that people can't follow it."
Oddsocks is something of a family
endeavour. Elli and her husband, Andy
Barrow, founded the company in 1989 after
beginning their artistic collaboration (and
relationship) at Webber Douglas Academy of
Dramatic Art.

"I've spent more of my life with Andy than not, and vice versa. The fact is, right from drama school, when we were in the same class, we have worked together - it's natural for us. It happens by osmosis now."

While the majority of performances in the tour take place in the open air, last month the company made a stop-off at a more traditional venue: Coventry's Belgrade

Theatre. This has a practical impact - not least that the company aren't building their own stage. It also creates an environment where the actors can fine-tune their performances.

"The difference is that it's more intimate indoors. From a performer's point of view, there's more nuance. Small pauses, flicks of the eye, and small expressions go for nothing when you're working in a large, open-air space, with shouting peacocks, dogs, people walking past, and 500 people up a hill. You have to be really clear. It has to be bold and it has to carry."

Another factor when performing outdoors is the unpredictable weather. However, while gathering clouds might make an audience member reach for their brolly and waterproofs, it rarely puts a damper on the Oddsocks spirit.

"About 36 years we've been touring. Over each of those tours, we do between 54 and 56 performances throughout the summer in the UK and the Channel Islands, in 29 venues. I can count on one hand the number of times we've had to cancel - and that's usually been down to the fact that the audience can't get to the venue because of flooding. Usually, we carry on whatever the weather. It's a really important part of the audition process that we find actors who are prepared to work like that. Understandably, not every actor is. "We're friends with actors who first worked with us in the early 1990s. In fact, our daughter is making a documentary about Oddsocks and our journey."

The company is raising money for the film with a GoFundMe campaign entitled Oddsocks At 35. "She's touching base with a lot of actors who worked with us over many years, whose highlights are times of the worst

weather; when the audience, diminished down to a sturdy 20 to 30, would sit there under whatever circumstances."

The theatrical fun continues with a second, non-Shakespearean tour for 2025. This autumn, Oddsocks present a new (indoor) offering: Florence Nightingale - The Lady With The Hammer. The show is inspired in part by the company's rehearsal space - a chapel that once belonged to Florence's family.

"We were working with an actor who plays her at the Florence Nightingale Museum in London - that's her day job - so her knowledge of this lady is incredible. It just seemed to come together, and we thought 'Let's investigate...' We realised what an amazing woman she was."

One of the company's aims when creating productions like A Midsummer Night's Dream is to pitch the show to appeal to audiences of any age. And Oddsocks' relationship with their punters, Elli says, is key to striking that balance.

"As soon as people arrive, we're out there, we're talking to them, we're selling programmes, we're welcoming them. It's important for our team to feel like we're hosts of a party... And people become familiar faces, and grew up with us. It's important to us that our plays speak to both children and adults. And it's true that there are things that go above the children's heads - it's not a children's show. It works best when it's an age mix."

And when it comes down to it, for Elli, the ability to make connections between people - on and off the stage - is the company's highest accomplishment.

"For me, our biggest achievement is bringing people together, in all its forms... We now have 11 'Oddsocks children' - people who might not exist had their parents not met whilst working with us. We have networks of people that get together just to come and see our shows."

The Smurfs - anthropomorphic beings who live in mushroom-shaped houses in the forest - were all the rage here in the UK back in the late 1970s and early 1980s, not least because of the success of The Smurf Song. Released in the summer of 1978, the nearchart-topping number was memorably performed by a Santa Claus lookalike named Father Abraham. But the curious little blue creatures have a history which stretches back to the 1950s, when they were created by Peyo (the pen name of Belgian comicbook artist Pierre Culliford). Their global popularity in the ensuing decades has rarely waned, and this new movie looks set to give Smurfmania a significant boost - particularly as Rihanna is lending her voice to the project (playing the character of Smurfette). She's joined for the endeavour by John Goodman, James Corden and Sandra Oh.

Jurassic World: Rebirth CERT 12a (134 mins)

Starring Scarlett Johansson, Rupert Friend, Jonathan Bailey, Mahershala Ali, Ed Skrein, Manuel Garcia-Rulfo Directed by Gareth Edwards

Cinemagoers just can't get enough of dinosaurs. Three years after the Jurassic World trilogy concluded (with each film netting in excess of a cool \$1billion at the global box office), the series is this month making yet another return.

Five years after the events of Jurassic World Dominion, the planet's ecology has proven largely inhospitable to dinosaurs. Those remaining exist in isolated equatorial environments.

The three most colossal creatures within the tropical biosphere hold, in their DNA, the key to a drug that will bring miraculous lifesaving benefits to humankind.

Covert operations expert Zora Bennett (Scarlett Johansson) is contracted to lead a skilled team on a top-secret mission to secure the genetic material. When Zora's operation intersects with a civilian family whose boating expedition was capsized by marauding aquatic dinos, they all find themselves stranded on a forbidden island that had once housed an undisclosed research facility for Jurassic Park.

There, in a terrain populated by dinosaurs of vastly different species, they come face-to-face with a sinister, shocking discovery that has been hidden from the world for decades... Released Wednesday 2 July

Hot Milk CERT 15 (92 mins)

Starring Emma Mackey, Vicky Krieps, Fiona Shaw, Vincent Perea, Yann Gael, Patsy Ferran Directed by Rebecca Lenkiewicz

Screenwriter Rebecca Lenkiewicz here takes the helm for her directorial debut. Much admired for penning screenplays about simmering female discontent and rebellion think Disobedience (2017), She Said (2022) and the Oscar-winning Ida (2013) -Lenkiewicz oversees the story of a cantankerous and wheelchair-dependent woman, Rose, and her daughter, Sofia, as they journey to a Spanish clinic in search of a cure for the mother's mysterious illness. With trouble brewing in their relationship and Rose undergoing treatment, Sofia finds an unexpected but welcome distraction from reality in the form of the sensual and freespirited Ingrid... The film is adapted from the same-named 2016 novel by Deborah Levy.

The Fantastic Four: First Steps CERT the

As with DC Comics' Superman (see below), Marvel Comics' Fantastic Four is being rebooted this year.

After a couple of okayish big-screen outings in 2005 and 2007, and then an execrable Marvel Cinematic Universe offering in 2015, Mr Fantastic, the Invisible Woman, the Human Torch and the Thing find themselves battling against planet-devouring space god Galactus and his metallic-skinned herald, the Silver Surfer.

First Steps' storyline - which unravels against the backdrop of a 1960s-inspired, retro-futuristic world - is being billed as the titular quartet's 'most daunting challenge yet'. But if rumours about the film's quality prove to be true, distributor Disney may well have a 'daunting challenge' of its very own to deal with... In a recent public test screening in Los Angeles, the movie apparently received a less-than-enthusiastic response, with media sources claiming that audience members slammed the film for its lack of character development and questionable CGI usage. Late-stage reshoots have been taking place; never a good sign.

The UK's very own Nicholas Hoult plays the Last Son of Krypton's arch nemesis, Lex Luthor. The first film to be released under the DC Studios banner, Superman is being described as a singular blend of epic action. humour and heart, delivering a Man of Steel who's driven 'by compassion and an inherent belief in the goodness of humankind'.

James Gunn directs from his own screenplay. Gunn has previously enjoyed superhero success with Marvel Cinematic Universe's Guardians Of The Galaxy trilogy and - to a lesser extent, in 2021 - DC Comics' The Suicide Squad. **Released Fri 11 July**

Emma Talbot: How We Learn To Love


Compton Verney, Warwickshire, Sat 5 July - Sun 5 October

Textiles produced on the loom will be exhibited alongside work by contemporary artists Raisa Kabir (work pictured above), Alis Oldfield, Bharti Parmar, Dinah Prentice and Su Richardson.

Shelter: The Outside In National Open Exhibition

The New Art Gallery, Walsall, until Sunday 19 October

Shelter is the seventh National Open exhibition to be presented by Outside In, an award-winning charity dedicated to helping artists who encounter barriers to accessing the art world. These may include issues around health, disability, isolation, or the individual's social circumstance.

As part of Shelter, surrealist sculptor & furniture designer Chantal Pitts was selected for a 21-week residency at the gallery, during which period she developed an interactive and den-like installation that will serve as the exhibition's information hub.



Billy Dosanjh Endz Of The World: Coded Furnaces

Featuring more than 200 iconic objects and artworks, the show recalls toys, video games, fashions, food, films and music from the decade of Cool Britannia. In the process, it calls to mind all manner of cultural treasures, from the Spice Girls and Lara Croft, to Pokémon and Power Rangers.



Watch Us Lead

Birmingham Museum & Art Gallery, XXX

Multi-disciplinary artist Christopher Samuel's new exhibition highlights the experiences of disabled people of colour in Birmingham - and echoes the many facets of his own lived experience as a Black disabled man.

Bringing together stained glass and drawings with nine newly recorded interviews, the show investigates themes of stigma, belonging and agency.


