

PATCHED TOGETHER

Catch a rare painting on display at Warwickshire's Compton Verney, at the heart of an exhibition illuminating 17th-century attitudes towards morality and race...

A fascinating painting, entitled Two Women Wearing Cosmetic Patches and painted by an unknown artist, is currently featured at the centre of an exhibition at Warwickshire's Compton Verney venue.

The painting was brought into the gallery collection in 2023, and this month marks a year since it was first put on public display at the unique 'art in the park' location. The painting was loaned to Yale Center for British Art for an 18-month conservation and research project, and the exhibition features a short video about this process. There is still time to visit the painting, before its two-year display period comes to a close.

Two Women Wearing Cosmetic Patches was painted around 1655 and depicts a Black woman and a white woman sitting side-byside, both of their faces adorned with small patches - used cosmetically to hide blemishes - of various intricate shapes. The two women mirror each other, with the patches standing out in contrast with each woman's skin tone. The women are presented equally in size and position, and they are similarly dressed, from their opulent gowns to their pearl necklaces and curled hair.

This was unusual at the time of painting extravagant portraiture was a status symbol, commissioned by the wealthy. The portrait's main subject would be framed to draw the viewer's attention, while other figures would be positioned less prominently. Black people who were featured in portraits of the time were likely to be enslaved by the people who commissioned the painting, and included in the picture to further display the wealth of the central white figure, who had paid the artist to be depicted in their finery.

With this in mind, Two Women Wearing Cosmetic Patches might at first glance appear to be an unusually progressive representation, with the two women being given equal status in the painting. Jane Simpkiss, curator at Compton Verney, has written an essay exploring the context behind the exhibition, which is available to read on the gallery's website. In it, she states that the painting is not a portrait, but instead a 17th-century morality painting - with the moral message revolving around the eyecatching cosmetic patches.

Above the women is painted a slogan, which condemns the practice of altering the appearance with such cosmetics. The words are written as if spoken by the Black woman in the portrait, and imply that the white woman's use of patches reveals the sinful pride in her heart, dooming her to Hell.

To give context to the painting, two books are displayed alongside it at Compton Verney. Both dated 1653, the books contain images and descriptions similar to the figures in the painting, and offer an insight into why the

artwork might have been created.

The books are John Bulwer's Anthrometamorphosis, subtitled 'the man transform'd or, the artificiall changeling', and by Francis Hawkin, 'A discourse upon some innovations of habits and dressings against powdring of hair, Naked-Breasts, Black Spots and other unseemly Customes'.

The exhibition reveals strong moral objections which were common at the time, opposing cosmetic changes of appearance. The weight of such moral judgment fell most heavily on women, condemning them for partaking in "unseemly Customes".

Two Women Wearing Cosmetic Patches illuminates 17th-century attitudes towards race, and the way in which such cosmetic practices were condemned.

The exhibition at Compton Verney provides a rare opportunity to take a deep dive into the meaning of a unique piece of artwork, and to look beyond the paint to understand the social ramifications of its creation.

Sir Simon Rattle & the Bavarian Radio Symphony Orchestra Symphony Hall, Birmingham, Tues 11 November

Sir Simon Rattle makes a much-heralded and very welcome return to the second city, 27 years after he brought to a close his 18-year tenure as music director of the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra.

Since bidding a fond farewell to Brum, the 70-year-old conductor has brought his immense talent to bear on the output of the Berlin Philharmonic, London Symphony Orchestra, and now (since 2023), the

Bavarian Radio Symphony Orchestra, a world-leading ensemble which last visited Birmingham some 20 years ago. The programme for this mouthwatering concert features Schumann's second symphony and the complete ballet score of Stravinsky's The Firebird. The latter was the composition which Sir Simon chose for the first concert in Symphony Hall way back in 1991.

Spires Philharmonic Orchestra

The Hub, Coventry University, Sat 22 November

"We are acoustic adventurers," explain Spires Philharmonic Orchestra & Chorus, a community of ambitious musicmakers from Coventry. "We seek out unheard gems and then



programme them alongside classics we know and love, crafting concerts that are not only outstanding to listen to but that we love to perform, too."

The choir and pro/am orchestra's latest outing sees them performing Bruckner's Mass No1 in D minor and Schubert's Symphony No 8 in B minor 'Unfinished'. Orchestra leader is Alistair Kennedy and Benjamin Hamilton (pictured), conducts.

English Symphony Orchestra

Malvern Theatres, Wed 12 November

The English Symphony Orchestra's (ESO) latest Malvern appearance sees them getting to grips with a programme of music celebrating the adventurous spirit of the Roaring 1920s.

The ESO are joined for the occasion by soprano April Frederick, who last year memorably performed Samuel Barber's Knoxville 1915 with the orchestra in Malyern.



Armonico Consort: Karl Jenkins The Armed Man

Coventry Cathedral, Wed 12 November; Worcester Cathedral, Thurs 27 November

Armonico Consort here celebrate the 25th anniversary of Karl Jenkins' monumental choral work The Armed Man - an anti-war mass dedicated to the victims of the Kosovo conflict. A composition performed more than 3,000 times during the last quarter-century, the piece this year took second place in Classic FM's Hall of Fame, behind Rachmaninov's Piano Concerto No2... For this month's two cathedral performances, Armonico are joined by hundreds of children from their Academy choirs, as well as The Choristers of Coventry Cathedral Choir, Wells Cathedral School Chamber Choir and King's School Worcester Chamber Choir.

Gildas Quartet

Holy Trinity Church, Leamington Spa, Fri 14 November

Former first-prize winners in the 'audience engagement' category of the prestigious International Franz Schubert & Modern Music Competition, the Gildas Quartet boast a bold and explorative approach to performance.

Their mid-month Leamington Music concert sees them presenting a programme of three works: Jessie Montgomery's Strum, William Alwyn's String Quartet No1 in D minor, and Beethoven's String Quartet No9 in C major, Op59 No3 'Razumovsky'.

Orchestra Of The Swan: Wintertide

Holy Trinity Church, Stratford-upon-Avon, Sat 29 November

The Warwick-based Orchestra of the Swan are promising 'an exquisite weave of atmospheric, seasonal music' combined with 'winter words by Dylan Thomas, Laurie Lee, Charles Dickens and more' when they pay a visit to Stratford's Holy Trinity Church - Shakespeare's final resting place - at the end of the month. The programme for the concert features, among other compositions, Holst's Midwinter, Corelli's Christmas Concerto and Vivaldi's iconic 'Winter' from The Four Seasons. The seasonal poetry and prose is narrated by Sunny Ormonde, best known for her role in BBC Radio Four soap The Archers.





Hugh Cornwell

Warwick Arts Centre, Coventry,

Hugh Cornwell is best known as the vocalist and guitarist for punk rock/new wave band The Stranglers, with whom he played from 1974 to 1990.

One of the most celebrated songwriters of his generation, Hugh boasts a back-catalogue that includes Peaches, No More Heroes, Golden Brown, Always The Sun and Duchess. This Coventry concert is a 'full band show featuring the Nosferatu album in full, Stranglers choice cuts and solo delicacies'. He's joined for the gig by explosive Wall of Sound group The Courettes.



Better Joy

Coventry Central Library, Sat 15 November

Founded and fronted by Mancunian musician Bria Keely, alternative pop outfit Better Joy play music that's all about contrasts; their sound is bright but also dark, fun but also moody, often blending energetic guitars with lazy vocals. Inspiration comes from many different sources, included among which are The Smiths and The Cure.

Bria is the band's songwriter as well as their vocalist, and more often than not pens lyrics about relationships, not only romantic ones but also the relationship which she has with herself.

Better Joy will follow up their Coventry gig with another visit to the region later in the month, supporting Amy MacDonald in Wolverhampton on Friday the 21st.





The Urban Folk Quartet

Huntingdon Hall, Worcester, Thurs 27 November

The Urban Folk Quartet are like no other folk band. With Birmingham's vibrant and diverse music scene having a significant influence on their work, they dabble in all kinds of sounds, from funk grooves and Middle-Eastern melodies, to afrobeat and north Indian rhythms. They tug their collective forelock in the direction of more-traditional folk too, describing their music as 'fiddle-led' and drawing heavily on 'Celtic dance forms and traditional song'.

Charlie Dore

Malvern Cube, Fri 7 November

Charlie Dore is perhaps best known as a songwriter, an artform at which she undeniably excels; her songs have been covered by, among others, George Harrison, Tina Turner, Lisa Stansfield, Sheena Easton, Celine Dion, UB40, Status Quo, Paul Carrack and Jimmy Nail.

She stops off at Malvern Cube in the company of her long-time collaborator (and Steeleye Span lead guitarist) Julian Littman.

Sound Of The Sirens

The Marrs Bar, Worcester, Fri 21 November Rightly considered to be one of the UK's hardest-working folk acts, Abbe Martin & Hannah Wood are nowadays reaping the rewards of a decade spent honing their craft. The West Country duo, who write and perform everything from beautiful, emotive ballads, to upbeat, foot-stomping, hands-in-the-air anthems, have been widely praised for the quality of their live shows, during which their authentic camaraderie and natural chemistry is evident for all to see.

Babyshambles

hmv Empire, Coventry, Thurs 13 November
Pete Doherty fronts this London band,
which has undergone several changes in its
line-up since being formed back in 2004.
Heavily influenced by Britpop and punk,
Babyshambles were initially viewed as a
Doherty sideline - having been formed while
he was still involved with The Libertines but regular chart success eventually saw
them develop an identity all their own.
Here visiting Coventry as part of their first
UK tour since 2014, the band are celebrating
the 20th anniversary of critically acclaimed
debut album Down In Albion.



STILL GOING STRONG (OH YES HE IS)

Andy Hockley is starring in his 20th panto at Coventry's Belgrade Theatre this Christmas...



Award-winning actor Andy Hockley stars in his 20th pantomime at Coventry's Belgrade Theatre this festive season. A stalwart of the venue on and off the stage, there's nowhere he'd rather be at this time of year, he tells What's On...

Welsh actor & singer Andy Hockley moved to Coventry more than 30 years ago, with the city's Belgrade Theatre his second home for much of that time. Having first worked there in 1982 while a theatre design student, he's returning this Christmas to appear in a production of Sleeping Beauty - his 20th pantomime at the venue. And when he's not treading the boards, he can regularly be found showing people to their seats or selling ice creams.

"[The Belgrade] has really become part of my life now," he says, the soft Welsh accent still very much intact despite living in the Midlands for so long. "I've done 20 pantomimes since 1989, had a large chunk of time out between 2012 and 2022, when I went off to do other projects, mainly down in the West End, came back in 2022 and have been here ever since."

Those West End projects include major musicals such as The Phantom Of The Opera, Chitty Chitty Bang Bang and Wicked (where he's still its longest-serving Wizard), while in the early 1990s he also had a brief flirtation with Hollywood, appearing in Robin Hood: Prince Of Thieves and Kenneth Branagh's star-studded version of Much Ado About Nothing.

These days he's happy to be winding down his workload, although the pantomime will always bring him back to the stage. And that's especially true if it means working alongside Belgrade legend Iain Lauchlan, who has written, directed and starred in the annual production for more than 35 years. The duo were named Best Sisters at the 2024 UK Pantomime Association awards for their performances in Cinderella. This year's production also features Best Villain winner Wendi Harriott, who will reprise her role as Carabosse from a version of the show at Watersmeet Theatre in Rickmansworth.

Craig Hollingsworth, another Belgrade regular, is back as well, for his 14th panto, playing Muddles the Jester. Iain will play Nanny Fanny McWheeze and Andy will appear as an entirely new character called Grumbleweed.

"The role I'm playing hasn't existed in any form of the play that's ever been done before," he says. "He's a disgruntled gnome, the sidekick of Carabosse, the wicked fairy who curses the princess. He's her much-put-upon, disgruntled henchman, who just happens to be a gnome."

Given that Andy is playing a wholly new character, it's safe to say that Iain has created a new script ("he always tries to keep it topical and up to date") even though he's written previous versions of the show. The reasons for doing so are more than just artistic.

"Carabosse has always had at least one henchman - she used to have two. The first Sleeping Beauty I did in the mid-1990s with Iain, they were two Cockney wide boys called Duck and Dive. Nowadays, budget restrictions mean cast sizes have got smaller, orchestra sizes have got smaller, and so there's only one henchman this time."

Budget sizes have certainly changed during Andy's time working on Belgrade pantomimes: "The first one I did had a principal cast of about 14, plus chorus members and a seven-piece band. This year's show has a three-piece band and an entire company of about 11."

This is where Iain's experience - alongside a highly skilled team of designers, choreographers and musical arrangers - really comes in, ensuring that the show still ticks all the boxes for a family night out.

"Iain just gets it. That's why he's had such longevity and built up such a legacy at the Belgrade. He does it for families - he doesn't do pantos that are heavy for adults and full of innuendo. He writes for a family audience and understands the breadth of what he's dealing with. That's why he's still there after 30-odd years."

That breadth means embracing new technology ("that's the biggest difference performance-wise") as well as knowing, and reflecting, what youngsters are tuned in to. This year, that includes nods to AI ("Iain's character is a nanny from Scotland, so it's called Och Aye") and animated musical phenomenon KPop Demon Hunters ("my granddaughter's six and she's obsessed with them"). It's an element of the show that Andy admits often goes over his head.

"There was one year we included a song from the Barbie movie - it was called I Am Ken or something. I'd never heard it before in my life, but it was part of the overture. When the orchestra started to play it, within the first half dozen notes, the kids, especially young kids at the school shows, absolutely erupted because they recognised the song. I didn't know what was happening and had to have it explained to me."

That disconnect arguably wouldn't have been so profound 30 years ago, when there were fewer TV channels and no internet, so it's clearly more and more of a challenge to stay abreast of things that resonate with younger audiences.

"Absolutely. And it's coping with their attention spans as well now. What I've found is that over that time period, scenes have become a little shorter, just because children's attention spans have got shorter. It's through no fault of their own; it's just the society they're being brought up in - looking at stuff on computers, tablets, smartphones, watching YouTube videos and so on."

That said, it's clear that Andy still revels in performing for youngsters and families, and even more so in a city that he has come to love and call home.

"Because of where Coventry is geographically, it's a great focal point for families that have become dispersed to get back together at Christmas. And one of the main things they do is come and see the Belgrade panto. It's become such a great tradition and such a huge part of family Christmases, and you really get that feeling.

"The one thing you *do* pick up on, if you're performing in the same place regularly - which I've been lucky enough to do, building up a relationship with the audience - is the generational thing."

That 'generational thing' means Andy regularly meets people who have grown up watching or working with him, and who are now bringing their own children to shows which is where Andy's borderline photographic memory comes in handy.

"I remember them better than I remember my lines, which is a bit worrying!"

Speaking of which, he's a real fan of the way pantomimes develop throughout a run, acknowledging how Iain often picks up on, and adds in, nods to topical news stories. He also tweaks things that work and get the best laughs, even if they come from actors making mistakes or corpsing on stage.

"Panto is always very fluid - from the first read-through to the last night, it'll change immeasurably. That's part of the fun. Things will get dropped or something will come up in the news that we'll bring in. If someone corpses and it gets a laugh, then we might work it in, but only as long as the audience shares the joke. Ultimately, it's all about giving them a great night out."

Sleeping Beauty shows at the Belgrade Theatre, Coventry, from Wednesday 19 November to Saturday 3 January



treading a delicate line when it comes to her material. Her post-9/11 joke, "My name's Shazia Mirza - at least, that's what it says on my pilot's licence", marked her out as a comic who was happy to balance on the precipice of acceptable humour. Other examples of her style and content include: "My parents really want me to get married. But Muslim men don't want to marry me because... I speak", and "My dad said if I went out with a black man, he'd burn me. Which would be good, because then I'd be black too."

Not to everybody's taste, obviously, but then which comedian ever could be?

Helen Bauer

Warwick Arts Centre, Coventry, Thurs 13 November

Helen Bauer is a real force of nature, a fact which is emphatically reflected in her highenergy comedy routines. Her latest show, Bless Her, finds the 6ft ninch 34-year-old grappling with the issue of self-loathing - not to mention various other similarly intrusive problems, including toxic female-friendship groups and the propensity to binge-eat. Bless Her is Helen's fourth solo show and is further cementing her reputation as one of the UK's brightest and most engaging comedians.





MORE THAN AMATCH

Hit musical Fiddler On The Roof is spending Christmas in Birmingham First produced at Regent's Park Open Air Theatre, the Olivier Award-winning production of Fiddler On The Roof is now out on tour and will be spending Christmas at The Alexandra in Birmingham.

Ahead of its arrival in the city, What's On caught up with Matthew Woodyatt - who plays the lead, Tevye - and Jodie Jacobs - who plays his wife, Golde - to find out more...

After winning this year's Olivier Award for Best Musical Revival, director Jordan Fein's acclaimed version of Fiddler On The Roof has now embarked on a national tour, which concludes at Birmingham theatre The Alexandra across the Christmas period.

The story follows Tevye - an impoverished milkman in the tiny village of Anatevka - whose Jewish traditions are challenged and disrupted, both within his family, as his daughters choose husbands, and within his community, as the threat of displacement looms.

Matthew Woodyatt plays Tevye on tour. After understudying the role in 2017 at Chichester Festival Theatre, he then played the part at the Barbican, in the same critically acclaimed production that's now travelling the country.

"It feels like it's been in my life for a very long time," says Matthew. "They don't write many musicals anymore for voices of my type - not lead roles, anyway. It's always been on the list, and it's nice to be able to have a go!"

Tevye is the family's patriarch, who runs a gamut of emotions as three of his five daughters find love with men who, in his eyes, are increasingly inappropriate matches. Having become familiar with the iconic role over the years, Matthew is now developing his own interpretation.

"I'm less terrified of it than I was. It's everchanging, because Tevye contains so many facets. It's a gift - everyone around me is so brilliant. It's always very alive - we're several weeks into our tour, and in a glorious way, it's never quite the same twice. It's still playful, it's still alive. New things are being discovered all the time, which is lovely."

Jodie Jacobs takes the role of Tevye's wife, Golde - and playing the part is providing her with the opportunity to celebrate her own heritage.

"I could talk about it all day and say lots of glib and silly things," she says. "For me to be able to play a role that is so closely linked to my heritage - I grew up in a very traditional Jewish family - is really lovely. I don't have to hide anything, I can be entirely myself, I don't have to explain what I'm doing - it's all there for me in the script. In some ways, I feel so familiar with it, and in other ways, I'm discovering a whole new side of myself."

The role of Golde in this production was first developed by Lara Pulver, with Jordan Fein's direction, and Jodie is glowing with praise for her predecessor.

"They've created a 'real mum'," she explains. "Someone who's not a pastiche, who's not a caricature. Someone who is caring and loving - and also harangued and put-upon, because they live in poverty. They make the utmost and the best of every moment, and every single thing they have."

Joining the company for the tour, Jodie took on the challenge of being 'rehearsed in', while the existing cast were simultaneously performing in London.

"It was just a whirlwind rehearsal process. I had to integrate with this already set-up family and township, not embarrass myself, and not take away from what Lara Pulver had created. I wanted to honour that and maintain it, and just sprinkle a little bit of Jodie on top... Matthew has been incredibly patient with me, because there were a lot of weeks where I was still finding my feet with it. And he's been very generous, allowing me to do that."

"There's nowhere to hide in this production," Matthew adds. "It's pared back. That's not saving it isn't massive and brilliant, but there's a simplicity to it which I think is revelatory. As a result, you only really have each other. Thank God, Jodie's amazing... We were playing at the Barbican, eight shows a week, and then rehearsing our new cast members pretty much in isolation. Then we had a little 'starter' tour date, which was not a full week - that was the first time we properly got our feet under the table as a family. Then it grows and it develops. The blueprint of the script and music is so strong that one can be very free within that - which isn't always the case."

After stints of one or two weeks at venues around the country, the show will stop off at The Alexandra for a longer run - and both actors are looking forward to making Birmingham their home for four weeks.

"I did a production of Privates On Parade about 20 years ago at Birmingham Rep," Matthew recalls. "I was there for about a month then as well - we had a lovely time! I'm really relieved, at the end of the tour, to actually sit down somewhere for a month. It'll be a much-needed bit of respite. I think Christmas in Birmingham will be perfect for that."

Fiddler On The Roof features multiple love stories, but the particular kind of interaction which exists between Tevye and Golde is rarely seen in musical theatre. Their 25-yearlong relationship is brought to the foreground in Do You Love Me?, a duet in which the pair's fond companionship - and hardworking partnership - is revealed.

"There are deep fundamentals that just need doing," says Matthew. "Even in a shtetl - Anatevka - which is fairly poor, they are the poorest. There's graft, and there's not a lot of time for much else."

"I watched my mum and dad be really similar to this," says Jodie of Tevye and Golde's onstage relationship. "Lots of bickering. They're like two children. I feel like they grew up together. You never really see romance. It's a partnership more than a great, deep, 'Cathy and Heathcliff' love story... They seem to make each other laugh, and I find that important in my own life!"

It's "refreshing" for both the actors and the audience, says Matthew, to see this underrepresented love story featured on stage. According to Jodie, it's been a long time coming: "You go through the beginning of your career, if you're lucky, to be an ingénue or a romantic lead. I don't know about you, Matt, but I've done a lot of comedy sidekicks..."

"Oh yeah," he agrees. "Second banana!"
"It's nice for the second banana to be Top
Banana for a bit," Jodie continues. "You see
kids in musicals and you're like, 'How do you
know? You haven't been there yet!' But by the
time you get to our age - I've been with my
partner for 10 years, you've been with your
partner 20 years - you know what it's like. We
can 'fake it' better!"

Fiddler On The Roof shows at The Alexandra, Birmingham, from Tuesday 9 December until Saturday 3 Ianuary



Miss Saigon The Alexandra, Birmingham, Tues 18 - Sat 29 November

The musical partnership of Alan Boublil and Claude-Michel Schonberg has produced some impressive results down the years, most memorably the smash-hit musical Les Miserables. Another of their shows, less lauded than Les Mis but still widely admired, is *this* epic tale, which premiered in the West End some 36

years ago... Set against the backdrop of the American evacuation of Saigon in 1975, the show tells the story of an American GI and his love for a young Vietnamese woman.

Best-known numbers include The Heat Is On In Saigon, The Movie In My Mind, Last Night Of The World and The American Dream.

Moulin Rouge! The Musical

Birmingham Hippodrome, until Saturday 15 November

Based on the 2001 Baz Luhrmann film starring Nicole Kidman and Ewan McGregor, Moulin Rouge! The Musical tells the love story of dancer Satine and writer Christian, set against the heady parties of Paris' most famous nightclub.

"There are over 75 pop songs in the show, from Offenbach to Lady Gaga," says actor Kurt Kansley, who plays the part of the artist Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec. "There's so much music that pulls at the heartstrings of any demographic of person who might have a memory of a particular song. There's a lot to be said for a jukebox musical, and what I like about Moulin Rouge! is that it doesn't apologise for being one. Instead, it celebrates it."







The Bodyguard

Regent Theatre, Stoke-on-Trent, Mon 3 - Sat 8 November





Camp As Christmas sees the one-time Torchwood star presenting an evening of festive favourites and showstopping tunes, all wrapped up with 'plenty of glitz'.

Trouble, Struggle, Bubble And Squeak

Theatre Severn, Shrewsbury, Mon 10 November; Stafford Gatehouse, Wed 12 November

Victoria Melody's decision to quit theatre in favour of becoming a stand-up comedian steered her down an interesting path. In an effort to become better at being funny, she took the unusual step of enlisting the assistance of speech & language specialists. It was a move which led to her discovering that she is neurodivergent...

Victoria has since discovered plenty of other things too, including the fact that the experience of joining a historical reenactment society is much more fun than it's generally cracked up to be - as she's at pains to explain in this latest stand-up offering. The show is directed by fellow comedian Mark Thomas, who is himself appearing in the region this month, starring in Ordinary Decent Criminal at the Coventry Belgrade.



A CHRISTMAS CRACKER



Presented as a gift to the city of Birmingham way back in 1990, The Nutcracker has become a permanent fixture in the Birmingham Royal Ballet calendar. The show tells the story of Clara, who is given a mysterious nutcracker doll on Christmas Eve and then embarks on an enchanting adventure. What's On spoke to Paul James, the company's chief executive, to find out what makes the much-loved festive production such a sweet treat...

Birmingham Royal Ballet's spectacular production of The Nutcracker returns to the stage this month, celebrating its 35th anniversary at the Hippodrome.

A lavish Christmas fantasy, underscored by the beloved music of Tchaikovsky, the story follows Clara's Christmas Eve adventure with her toy Nutcracker, which has come to life.

"It's always very difficult for me to say 'this is the best Nutcracker in the world', because it's very subjective," says Paul James, chief executive of Birmingham Royal Ballet (BRB). "And also, we're slightly biased! It's the scale of the storytelling, the scale of the sets, the growing tree, the snow goose, the snow, a full company of musicians - the Royal Ballet Symphonia are at the heart of everything we do - it's all just mind-blowing. Whether you're a fan of ballet, or a fan of great theatre and event theatre, it finds its story for each generation."

The production was a gift to the people of Birmingham, from Artistic Director Sir Peter Wright, when the company transferred to the city from London's Sadler's Wells Theatre in 1990. Sir Peter turns 99 during The Nutcracker's run this month.

"One of our strongest partnerships was always with Birmingham Hippodrome," says Paul. "So when we came here, it wasn't out of the blue, but out of the development and evolution of a partnership over decades of ballet touring. [The Nutcracker] premiered in our first season here, and here we are 35 years later. More than a million people have seen it. It is an icon of everybody's festive calendar."

In 2022, the scenic and costume elements were rejuvenated, overseen by the original designer, John Macfarlane, after a two-year fundraising campaign.

"This wasn't about trying to find some big organisations to come in with a large cheque - it was about individuals making smaller donations to support the redevelopment. It is a shinier and brighter show [now]. There's a new lighting rig, there are things that make it work better, that you'd never see from an audience perspective. But the thing that struck us all when the curtain went up on the first day after it was refurbished, was just how bright it was, how everything sparkled again and gleamed again."

The production has endured as a festive tradition for generations of ballet fans, both

in the audience and on stage - BRB provides a pathway into dance and ballet careers for the people of Birmingham.

"It feels 'about us' in some ways - it feels very connected to the city. You see that more recently with Black Sabbath. These are ballets for Birmingham, for the people of Birmingham. They have been built here and developed here. Yes, we take the national label, but there is also that sense of 'home'. Our dancers all live here - all of those things are very palpable."

This is the second year that The Nutcracker schedule will include a 'relaxed performance', taking place on Tuesday 2 December. While the performance is designed to be more comfortable and welcoming for people with sensory needs, Paul says that last year's show also proved popular with a wider audience.

"It's a great show, and it's great for kids. Whether you're neurodiverse or not, it's a really accessible performance in all meanings of the word - but it's also specially adapted for the neurodiverse community. We've actually had one or two older members of the audience who want to come back to the show, and it's a way to do that. It's still got all the elements of the show - it's not reduced in any way - it's just helping people understand and engage with it."

One of Paul's favourite moments in the production is a tiny exchange between two dancers, which is easy to miss but could represent the turning point of the story.

"The moment when Clara's parents swap gifts, and he clips the necklace around her neck. Every pair of dancers behaves ever so slightly differently in that moment, and to me it's almost like that's the transition. You've gone through the overture, and it clicks - here's where things start to move. It's such a little thing, but it's something I look out for every time I watch it. It's the acting, not the dancing, in this particular moment. How does that then pivot the story forward? It's such a little moment, but for me, it's really important."

It is now almost six months since Paul was named CEO of the company, having previously taken on the role in an acting capacity following the death of Caroline Miller last December.

"I can't describe how horrible it was, this time last year, to work with Carlos [Acosta, BRB's director] and the company through that grieving process. What was amazing was the sense in which the company pulled together and supported each other. There's a great group of leaders here, and people who have dedicated their careers to BRB and to ballet. People understood that we needed to do both things - that we needed to communicate and share what was going on and how we were feeling, but also that there was a business plan that we had to submit, and an end-of-year finance system that we had to do."

The company took part in a memorial service in April to celebrate Caroline's life and legacy.

"We were able to express all of that through dance and through speech. Then the company was able to say, we need to carry on reaching as high as we can - as Carlos says, 'reaching for the stars'. That's what Caroline gave us; that energy and ambition to match Carlos' insane amount of energy - to get us to all these great places."

As well as personal tragedy, this year has also brought the challenge of running BRB with reduced funding. Now, more than ever, the company is hugely grateful for the assistance of its supporters.

"We saw the end of our Birmingham City Council funding this financial year, so after April we got nothing. The impact of the National Insurance contributions meant that we had a double hole - not only did we lose the money that we used to get, but we then also had to find almost as much again. The great news is that audiences are really strong. The audiences in Birmingham - and on tour as well - have really come back after the pandemic. This current Black Sabbath tour is packed to the rafters wherever it's going, and that is really important.

"The first thing I say to anybody if they want to support us is 'come and see us'. That's the reason we're here - it gives us joy to perform in front of an audience, so buy a ticket. It's that relationship between a performer and their audience that makes live performance, particularly ballet, so special."

Diversity launch a new dance studio in Birmingham's Jewellery Quarter

Street Dance troupe Diversity - winners of Britain's Got Talent in 2009 - have found a home for their second national dance studio: Birmingham's Jewellery Quarter. With the group's first studio being well established in their home county of Essex, Birmingham was chosen for their follow-up venture after a slew of requests from Midlanders. As well as having their name proudly displayed on the venue's outside wall, Diversity are also deeply involved in the day-to-day running of the place. What's On spoke to Diversity founder member Ashley Banio to find out more...

Ashley, what inspired the creation of Diversity Studios?

We all came from a studio that my mum started back in the day. It was called Dancework - we used to train there and practise there. So having a studio - it was a place for us to train, but also a place for us to train the next generation of Diversity. So Diversity now - even the ones who are older, all of them pretty much - we've trained. And you can see with these studios and the next generation, they're just coming up super, super strong.

You scoured the Jewellery Quarter and settled on the Coin Foundry - which still housed old industrial equipment at the time. How did you choose the venue?

We still do everything as a family, from the very first studio, maybe 30 to 35 years ago. We've been driving around Birmingham - me, my mum, my sister, my dad - looking at different places in different areas. The moment we walked into this building, we just thought 'This is it, this is the one.' We were really excited about it - and the rest is history.

The members of Diversity are heavily involved in dance classes and running the studios. Why is that important to you?

It's community. We could do shows, we could perform and tour and do shiny stuff like that all the time, and then, when we think we've had enough, hang our shoes up. But it's way bigger, way deeper, way more important than that.

I think bringing up the next gen is amazing -

the idea that members of whatever the next generation of Diversity is going to be, could come from right here in the heart of Birmingham; the idea that, in 20, 30 years, we could be here, looking at someone else sitting in this chair, talking about what Diversity is. That, for me, is a way bigger push than just the next show.

How did Birmingham end up at the top of the pile as a choice for the second venue?

We've always had a lot of love for Birmingham. We've got five nights at The Alexandra for our new Soul tour in February, which is amazing. We've always had a lot of love and support here.

When we asked about the studio, right at the top of the list, hundreds and hundreds of people were just saying, 'Yes please - Birmingham!' And when I started to look around, I didn't feel like there was enough potential for creative outlet versus demand. The arts, the potential and the talent feels really high here, but the studios and the opportunity for people to come and be creative doesn't seem that abundant. It felt like a moment that we could seize.

Current Diversity Studios members showcased some of their work together at the launch. What's their story?

There are people who danced with us that started as complete beginners. Even now, some of the members of the group, who are maybe 24 or 25, started when they were six or seven. People can start to dance here and have an entire dance career here, which is something that we're also really proud of.

We offer classes for seven-plus, 12-plus, Intermediates, into Advanced... One of our most popular lessons is our adults - Adult Beginners and Adult Intermediates. I think that people think 'I'm too old to start'. Not the case. And there are loads of people who used to dance, back in the day, who just enjoy it.

What are your hopes for the future of the Birmingham studio?

My long-term dream for this venue is for it to be right at the heart of dance in Birmingham. And I hope to have this place as a hub for the Diversity community, and for people to feel welcome, safe and just enjoy being in it.

Of all the classes, events and performances happening in Diversity Studios, what are you proudest to see?

A space that people belong in. When I was younger, I was either the only Black kid or the only dancer - a bit of an outsider in so many ways.

I think Diversity has always felt really close to my heart in terms of making people feel welcome. Whatever background, whatever they look like, whatever their choices are, I want people to unite in this space and do something that's bigger than any one individual.

Die My Love CERT 15 (118 mins)

Starring Jennifer Lawrence, Robert Pattinson, Sissy Spacek, Nick Nolte, LaKeith Stanfield, Gabrielle Rose Directed by Lynne Ramsay

Adapted from the same-named 2017 novel by Ariana Harwicz, Die, My Love spotlights a young couple - Grace (Lawrence) and Jackson (Pattinson) - who move from New York to an inherited house in rural Montana.

Grappling with their relocation to such an

Grappling with their relocation to such an isolated environment, and the challenges of taking care of a new baby, aspiring writer Grace struggles to find her identity and soon begins to unravel...

This isn't the first time Lynne Ramsay has directed a film about the impact of postpartum depression; she previously

helmed the critically acclaimed big-screen adaptation of Lionel Shriver's novel, We Need To Talk About Kevin.

The Glasgow-born director's desire to avoid retreading that same ground led to her co-writing and directing Die, My Love as "a bonkers, crazy love story" rather than a study of postpartum disorder.

The film premiered to rave reviews in Cannes earlier this year, with Jennifer Lawrence in particular earning plenty of plaudits.

In a near-future society, The Running Man is the top-rated show on television - a deadly competition where contestants, known as Runners, must survive 30 days while being hunted by professional assassins, with every move broadcast to a bloodthirsty public and each day bringing a greater cash reward. Desperate to save his sick daughter, working-class Ben Richards (Glen Powell) is convinced by the show's charming but ruthless producer, Dan Killian (Josh Brolin), to enter the game as a last resort. But Ben's defiance, instincts and grit turn him into an unexpected fan favourite - and a threat to the entire system. As ratings skyrocket, so does

the danger, leaving Ben with the task of outwitting not only the Hunters, but also a nation addicted to watching him fall... Based on the 1982 novel of the same name by Stephen King (published under the pseudonym Richard Bachman), this is the second film adaptation of the story; the first, released in 1987, was a modest hit for Arnold Schwarzenegger.

Predator: Badlands

Set in the future on a remote planet, Badlands follows the fortunes of Dek (Schuster-Koloamatangi), a young outcast Predator who, accompanied by the android Thia (Fanning), embarks on a treacherous journey to prove himself - by finding and then vanguishing a worthy adversary... Badlands is the latest in the long-established Predator series, which kicked off almost 40 years ago with the release of the eponymous movie starring Arnold Schwarzenegger. The franchise has struggled in more-recent times but received a welcome shot in the arm three years ago, when director Dan Trachtenberg's Prey proved to be a surprise hit at the box office.

"[Badlands is a] crazy adventure against monsters and the elements," Trachtenberg told Empire. "We wanted Dek to be relatable, but without turning him into Luke Skywalker. He's still a Predator; we had to allow him to be a dick - but a dick you can root for." Released Fri 7 November



Now You See Me: Now You Don't CERT 12a (123 mins)

Starring Jesse Eisenberg, Woody Harrelson, Dave Franco, Isla Fisher, Justice Smith, Dominic Sessa Directed by Ruben Fleischer

This is the third instalment in the Now You See Me series, a franchise which is blossoming, albeit slowly, despite struggling to gain traction with the critics.

The original film, released in 2013, was a glossy thriller which revolved around the adventures of the Four Horsemen, a team of magicians who use illusion, hypnosis and sleight-of-hand to pull off daring heists. Initially returning in Now You See Me 2 some three years later, the team are now back yet again, this time after a near-decade-long break and accompanied by a new generation of illusionists.

Their latest challenge? To steal a diamond, possessed by a powerful crime syndicate, from right under its owners' noses.

The year is 1945. Adolf Hitler is dead, and the Second World War is drawing to a close. Several figures within the Nazi high command have been apprehended by the Allies - among them the eerily charismatic commander-in-chief of the Luftwaffe, Hermann Göring (Russell Crowe). The Allies, led by the unyielding chief prosecutor, Robert H Jackson, have the task of ensuring the Nazi regime answers for the unveiled horrors of the Holocaust. Meanwhile, a US Army psychiatrist (Rami Malek) is locked in a dramatic psychological duel with Göring...

"I wanted it to be a thriller," Nuremberg director James Vanderbilt told The Hollywood Reporter, in talking about his latest film. "I want it to be a ride for people emotionally; I want it to be entertaining... It was really important for me, in order to give the gravity to the atrocities... [that] the entire movie [wasn't] heavy. As a viewer, the last thing I want is to feel like I'm being lectured to or beaten over the head by a film."

Following on from last year's first film, For Good brings the story to its conclusion, and opens with Elphaba and Glinda estranged

and living with the consequences of their choices. Elphaba, now demonised as The Wicked Witch of the West, lives in exile. Glinda, meanwhile, has become the glamorous symbol of Goodness for all of Oz, living at the palace in the Emerald City and revelling in the perks of fame and popularity. But the partnership was not without its tensions, many of which were caused by Hart's fragile mental state and dependence on alcohol... Richard Linklater's new film, named after one of Rodgers & Hart's best-known songs, is set on the evening of 31 March 1943, the opening night of ground-breaking musical Oklahoma!, Rodgers' first collaboration with Oscar Hammerstein II. While Rodgers celebrates the occasion, former collaborator Hart confronts his shattered self-confidence in a local bar...

"He's heartbroken about Rodgers," Ethan Hawke, who plays Hart in the film, told Indiewire. "He can't deal with the real pain that's happening. He can't look at it for a second. The movie is about a man who died of heartbreak. The alcohol was part of his sadness; the pain was too great to suffer without it. Alcohol is a painkiller."
