## Barber art gallery forging ahead with renovations

A once-in-a-generation transformation of the Barber Institute of Fine Arts at University of Birmingham is under way following a successful fundraising campaign that accumulated in excess of £14million.

A ramp and accessible ground-floor entrance are currently being installed at the side of the Grade-1 listed building on the University's Edgbaston campus, while the terrace is also being enlarged.

New air-handling equipment and support beams have recently been hoisted by crane to roof level for the installation of a new plant room underneath the glass pyramid, while extensive work is taking place throughout the building to allow a fresh-air ventilation system to be retrofitted into the Art Deco concert hall.

The works also include a new accessible toilet, an enhanced reception and shop area, and a replacement boiler system.

The Barber will reopen in the second half of next year. Dates will be announced once the project has progressed further.

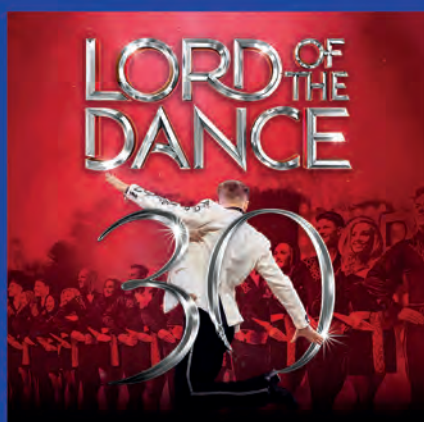

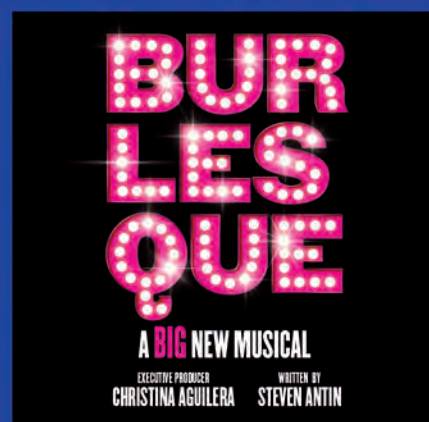

## The return of Birmingham Heritage Week...

Shining a spotlight on the city's fascinating history, the popular festival will see some of Brum's most important heritage locations and unique buildings opening their doors to members of the general public. Here are just some of the week's highlights...**

### Aston Fire Station

**Aston Fire Station, Ettington Road (off Witton Road), Aston, B6 6ED**

Head behind the imposing doors of this historic working fire station to discover vintage fire engines, meet the brave local firefighters, and learn about the evolution of the city's emergency services. Interactive demonstrations, hands-on activities and plenty of photo opportunities also feature.

Established in 1919 and affectionately known as 'the people's bank', the institution played a significant role in the city until its closure in 1976. Through personal stories, original archive material and oral histories, visitors can explore the experiences of employees, customers and communities connected to the bank.

## The return of Heritage Open Days...

**This month also sees the return of Heritage Open Days, a nationwide festival of history & culture (Friday 11 - Sunday 20 September). ### **Birmingham Honey Show**

**Winterbourne House & Garden,

Discover the fascinating world of bees at the Birmingham Honey Show, with live hive demonstrations offering a close-up look at how colonies work. Meet local beekeepers, learn how honey is made, and pick up tips from the experts. Visitors can browse local honey and handmade products, or try traditional candle rolling.

Sunday's programme includes an awards ceremony celebrating regional beekeeping. There's also plenty of time to explore Winterbourne House & Garden, with refreshments available from the Terrace Tea Room.

### **Bournville Model Boat Club**

Discover the history of Bournville's model boating tradition at Bournville Model Yachting Club, founded in 1923. Originally based at Rowheath Park, the club moved to the Valley Pool, created in the 1920s and officially opened in 1933. Visitors can explore the recently updated boathouse, browse historic photographs and artefacts, and watch model yachts and power boats take to the water. The boathouse and pool have also recently been awarded listed status by Historic England, recognising their importance to Bournville's heritage.

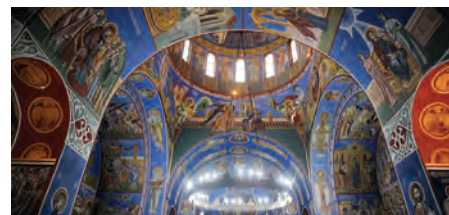

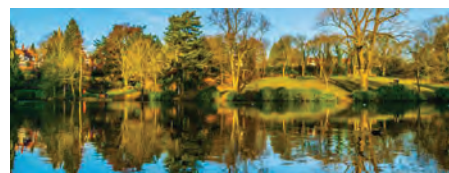
### **Moseley Park & Pool**

# WHEREFORE ART THOU, RUSSELL?

**Comedian Russell Kane is this month making his debut in a Shakespeare play, starring as a middle-aged Romeo...**



## Much-loved comedian Russell Kane is dipping his toe into fresh waters this month, making his stage debut as Romeo in a modern-day retelling of 'the world's greatest love story' at Newcastle-under-Lyme's New Vic Theatre. What's On recently caught up with the host of the hit TV series *Evil Genius* to find out more...

Russell Kane is best known for the quick wit of his stand-up comedy shows, but this autumn he fulfils a long-held ambition - to tread the boards in a Shakespeare play.

Russell is starring as Romeo, alongside Natalie Casey as Juliet, in *Not Too Tame* Theatre Company's new staging of the Bard's classic love story at the New Vic Theatre in Newcastle-under-Lyme. But it's a re-telling with a difference, because the couple, who are usually played as bright-eyed teenagers, are instead presented as fortysomethings discovering true love for the first time.

The idea for the show was sparked by a conversation between Russell and Jimmy Fairhurst, *Not Too Tame*'s artistic director.

"I went to see their *Twelfth Night* at Shakespeare North and it was fantastic," Russell recalls. "I was standing up and clapping at the end; a few of the cast saw me, and that got back to Jimmy. He said 'You'd make a great Shakespearian actor - meet me for a coffee.' So I met him for a coffee and he said 'If you could do anything in Shakespeare, what would you do?' And I said 'I won't do a clown or a comedy part; I would love to do an older Romeo. The tragedy of finding love later on in life would say a lot about where men are, and where we are as a culture.' Then he texted me and said 'Let's do it!'"

Alongside stand-up, Russell has written books, created the podcast and subsequent television show *Evil Genius*, and appeared in numerous television programmes. Now, playing Romeo is a dream come true.

"I've always wanted to do Shakespeare. I've toured three of my own plays, and two of them were in a sort of mock blank verse, so it's not as though it's an alien world to me - but I've never had the nerve to do real Shakespeare.

"I love language and the musicality of Shakespeare. I love the wordplay, the rhetorical devices, the use of metaphor, paradox, contrast. I use it in my stand-up. I think Shakespeare is the greatest writer in any language - certainly in English - ever to have lived. Why wouldn't I want to be part of that tradition?"

Russell hopes an older Romeo gives the story of his fated love with Juliet a new dimension: "Every single person will know men aged 40 who still haven't grown up, who are still living in the studio flat above the Chinese, still going to Marbella, doing cocaine in the

pub and so on. We all know men who are still boys. Never underestimate the ability of fully grown-up people to act like children and ruin their whole life in an impulsive moment.

"Then there are more people than you realise who will die never having been in love.

And it's not a good thing to not know true vomiting-in-the-toilet, wanting-to-tear-each-other's-skin-off love. So to get that Cupid's arrow through the heart at 40, for the first time and when you have all that wisdom, that raises the stakes. If you finally, after living with your cat and not having had a partner in years, fall in love with someone, and your family say you cannot fall in love with this person, you cannot be with this person - just imagine that."

Although the production moves the tale to contemporary times and includes a few tweaks to cater for the older characterisations, the story remains true to the original, says Russell: "We haven't re-written the words, but I'd call it a radical re-staging. Part of the reason I love working with Jimmy Fairhurst is that he loves to play - all of it is up for grabs.

"The people who say they've never understood Shakespeare are the ones I'm interested in bringing to Shakespeare for the first time. If you've been to see Shakespeare and you were bored, then it wasn't done properly - end of. When it's done right, the audience should come out and say 'It's a shame they used modern language, I'd like to go and watch one of the originals now.' That's what happens with Jimmy's work all the time: people leave saying '*that* was Shakespeare!'"

When we chat, Russell has been on a photo shoot in St Mark's Church near Newcastle-under-Lyme for the production. And he's waxing lyrical about the New Vic Theatre - partly because of its in-the-round staging.

"In-the-round is better for Shakespeare and stand-up because you want to feel you're part of the audience, that you're connected to them. The other great thing is the front row being on the same level as the performers, so their feet are touching the same surface I'm touching. That is a direct electrical link and changes everything from being up on an eight-foot stage front-on with a proscenium arch - it's a completely different experience.

"As an audience member, you want that feeling that you're invisible, watching someone in their bedroom or lounge. This love story plays out and you cannot believe

you have such a voyeuristic view."

Russell is only too aware that he's stepping outside his comfort zone with *Romeo And Juliet* - but that is the attraction: "I don't know if any other British comedian has gone from just generating laughter in the most gut-wrenching way to true naked vulnerability on stage - metaphorically; it remains to be seen whether physically!

"I've never kissed another person on stage in my life. I've never even held hands with another performer, I don't think. It's so far from what I've done, and there's only one way to do it - to actually truthfully fall in love every night when I step into that world, so that it will be raw, real, funny, different and clear as a bell."

Aware of these challenges, Russell is keen to ensure he brings all his talents to the role: "If you knew the amount of training and processing I've done for this play, on top of my schedule. I've got the bit you can't teach at drama school, which is years and years of comfort and being able to connect with an audience when onstage. You can't learn that at RADA, but the bits I was missing are the bits you *can* learn at RADA! I won't necessarily use them, but they're a box ready for an emergency. It's like if you go on a long drive and pack a first-aid kit and a glittery triangle. You may not need it, but you drive more calmly knowing it's in the boot.

"I did a workshop about a year and a half ago, when we first started this project, to try and find out what I was weak at. I felt like I was struggling with my listening and reacting, so I've done some training that's helped me really become obsessed with what the other person is saying. My wife has loved this training; I've become her best listener!"

And the hard work had an unexpected bonus...

"I'm in the gym 24/7, and my fitness is really high because I wanted my body to be up to the task of these long performances, and as a consequence, I got myself a cover shoot for a health magazine out of it! I was the cover of *Men's Fitness* in April - that was a giggle."

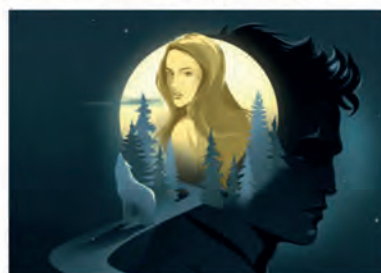

## Frances Mistry

"If it was practical and made financial sense to play everywhere, we would," they explain. "The spirit is willing. The reality is more complicated... Touring takes us away from writing, recording and our families. We have to remain alive - and sane - so schedules have to be sustainable as well as practical. We're not as young as we used to be..."



## Jill Scott

O2 Academy, Birmingham, Tues 29 September

Residency-style performances, placing live-band instrumentation at the heart of the experience, are very much the name of the game for Jill Scott on this latest tour. The three-time Grammy Award-winning

neo-soul star is visiting Birmingham in support of her exuberant latest album, *To Whom This May Concern* - her first in more than a decade. Her Midlands stop-off comes as part of an extensive world tour.

## Pacific Avenue

O2 Institute, Birmingham, Mon 21 September

The challenge of the tricky sophomore album, which can see many a promising young artist or collective come a career-compromising cropper, has proven to be a walk in the park for Pacific Avenue. Following the success of their debut offering, *Flowers*, the Australian alternative rockers returned earlier this year with *Lovesick Sentimental*, a heartfelt record positively dripping with raw emotion and soaring rock ambition. The boys are visiting the region as part of their biggest-ever tour.

## Evanescence

Arkansas-originated two-time Grammy Award winners Evanescence came to prominence back in the early years of the new millennium, grabbing music-industry attention with a fabulous fusion of gothic themes and heavy alternative and symphonic rock. Debut album *Fallen*, nowadays considered a modern classic, propelled them to stardom in double-quick

time - although their 'overnight' success had actually been nearly a decade in the making. They're visiting Birmingham in support of their sixth studio album, *Sanctuary*.

## Munich Philharmonic Orchestra with Martha Argerich

Gwilym's Triple Concerto - which has been co-commissioned by the CBSO - will be performed by three talented musicians, one of whom is saxophonist Jess Gilliam... The afternoon of musicmaking begins with Benjamin Britten's Simple Symphony, a four-movement composition based on pieces he wrote as a pre-teen and which he then reworked in his early 20s. The concert is brought to a conclusion with a performance of Elgar's Enigma Variations, included within which is the hugely famous and familiar Nimrod movement. Audience members can enjoy a talk with Stephanie and Jess ahead of the afternoon performance.



## Ex Cathedra: Can Beauty Save The World?

As well as featuring warm-ups and ensemble sessions with Conservatoire students and teachers, the day also includes the opportunity to hear a performance by the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra's hugely talented principal horn, Elspeth Dutch (pictured). The event will conclude with an informal sharing of the ensembles' work, in Bradshaw Hall.



## CBSO: Kazuki Conducts Grieg's Piano Concerto

Edvard Grieg's only piano concerto was famously brought to the wider public attention by a nowadays oft-repeated sketch from the 1971 Morecambe & Wise Christmas Show. During the sketch, Andre Previn (or Andrew Preview, as Eric & Ernie repeatedly referred to him throughout) attempted to conduct the work despite an unhelpful musical contribution from Eric, who claimed he was "playing all the right notes, but not necessarily in the right order".

Arnold Bax's symphonic poem Tintagel, Anna Clyne's Restless Oceans and Claude Debussy's La mer complete the evening's programme. Kazuki Yamada conducts; the pianist is Alice Sara Ott.







# A CURIOUS TALE

**Joe McFadden talks about starring in a new version of  
The Curious Incident Of The Dog In The Night-Time...**



**Mark Haddon's bestselling novel, *The Curious Incident Of The Dog In The Night-Time*, has captured the imaginations of readers all over the world. Since being adapted for the stage and premiering at the National Theatre in 2012, the story has consistently wowed audiences and critics alike. A new production of the show premieres at Birmingham Rep this month, with Joe McFadden top-billing alongside ex-EastEnder Charlie Brooks. Joe recently chatted to What's On about his love of the original novel - and his delight at being involved with this latest stage version...**

When actor Joe McFadden first read Mark Haddon's bestselling novel *The Curious Incident Of The Dog In The Night-Time* more than 20 years ago, he immediately fell in love with its story and its characters. So he's genuinely delighted to now be a part of a brand-new staging of the novel.

Premiering at Birmingham Rep early this month, the show sees Joe playing the character of Ed, alongside Charlie Brooks as Judy - the parents of autistic teenager Chris Boone. Discovering that neighbour's dog Wellington has been killed with a garden fork, Chris turns detective to uncover the perpetrator. However, in doing so, some shocking secrets within the Boone family are also revealed...

The production uses the Simon Stephens adaptation - which proved such a hit for the National Theatre in 2012 - but recreates the story with new sets and designs by Eleanor Bull. Ned Bennett is in the director's chair. Joe is very much enjoying being part of the process: "I absolutely loved the book back in 2003. It was one of those books that it seemed everyone was reading. I loved it so much that I then went and saw the play because I was fascinated with what they were going to do with it. And I loved the play! It was such a hit, and it was great in so many different ways.

"The Simon Stephens adaptation is just brilliant, and we're very lucky that that's the adaptation we're using. We were very fortunate that he came in and talked to us during rehearsals. It was really interesting hearing his take on it all and his process of adapting such a loved book, capturing all the elements that everyone loves but still making it work as a piece of theatre.

"I'm just really excited knowing that this is a new production, and how exciting it's going to be to reinvent a story that is so loved by so many people."

Ed is far from the perfect dad, but for Joe, that's what makes the part so interesting: "Ed doesn't always get everything right as a parent. He makes mistakes, he's fallible, and that's the thing that I related to in him. The great thing about this story is that no-one is perfect. There's no good guys and bad guys; it's very nuanced storytelling. Sure, we all do some quite horrendous things, but we do them for the right reasons. Ed loves his child dearly, and he's absolutely doing his best for her."

This is definitely the point at which we should mention that this new telling sees the character of Christopher, the boy in the

original book, being replaced by the character of a girl named Chris. Alex Keenan and Imi Price will share the role during the show's run.

"Having female leads is really interesting because the dynamic changes," Joe says. "The fact that this family unit has broken down, and how that plays itself out. So it's a father and his daughter being left behind and how devastating that would be and how a daughter absolutely needs her mother.

"It feels so important that we do this. There has been a lot of misconception that more boys are autistic than girls, and that's absolutely not true. It's just that it presents itself in different ways, and I think it's harder to diagnose, so it feels really important that people realise that it's just as prevalent in girls. The two girls we've got, Alex and Imi, are brilliant and heartbreaking and completely immersed in it, so the scenes feel really fresh.

"If you've seen this story told from a male perspective, now you can come and see it from a female perspective - and it absolutely will be different. If you loved it before, you'll still love it now. It's a re-invention and a re-interpretation.

"You're sort of seeing inside someone who is neurodivergent, and you're seeing the processes of their mind. Mark Haddon did it brilliantly in the book, where absolutely we are seeing the world from Chris' perspective.

"The question is, when is Chris going to figure it out? What the play did really well, and I think our production is also going to do really well, is show you the whimsy and the fantasy and the excitement of being a 15-year-old, of having this wonderfully adept mind. Chris is so wonderful at mathematics and is really into space exploration, and you get to see into their mind and it's really entertaining.

"Her school and her father underestimate her. One of the things that Simon talked about is that essentially this story is about bravery and people's kindness at a time when we need those qualities more than ever. We do sort of put Chris into this box that she can't cope, and it turns out that's her journey and her quest during the play. How much can she cope with? And can she do a lot more than the people around her feel that perhaps she can?"

Produced by Birmingham Rep and Melting Pot, the new show will tour the UK after premiering in the second city this month. The hope is that neurodivergent people will go along and enjoy the experience.

"I think for the first time we are making it friendly for neurodivergent audiences. It's going to be explained at the beginning, and how loud and how bright it's going to get. I think the reasoning behind that, which I absolutely agree with, is that as this story is about neurodivergent people, they should be able to come in and see it - there shouldn't be any barrier to stop them.

"The aim is that, in the same way 15-year-old boys came along, spotted themselves [in Christopher] and thought 'I'm like that, my mind works like that,' hopefully we are now going to get 15-year-old girls coming along and feeling the same way."

It isn't the first time Joe has played to Birmingham audiences, having previously starred as Andy Dufresne in *The Shawshank Redemption* and drag queen Tick/Mitzi in *Priscilla Queen Of The Desert*, both at The Alexandra. *Curious Incident* will mark his first appearance at The Rep.

"I hear it's a really big space, and it's exciting to be able to fill a space that size. On the tour, we're playing some really big places but some much smaller venues as well, and that's the challenge for the designer: different-sized shows. Eleanor's design is a feast for the senses; there's so much lightness and so much humour. At Birmingham Rep, it's going to look amazing."

Before we finish chatting, I ask Joe about his own dog, black cockapoo Douglas, who died last year.

"I decided against getting another dog. I'm on the road too much, so for the moment it doesn't make sense. It's great, though, that having loved a dog, you know how devastating and heartbreaking it is when they die. And so I realise the gravity of the death of this dog in the show for Chris. It's a shocking and a brilliant way to open a novel and a play because everyone wants to know who has done this horrible thing, just as much as Chris wants to know and goes on this quest to find out."

## Comedy previews from across the region...

## Tez Ilyas

The Glee Club, Birmingham, Wed 2 September; Royal Spa Centre, Leamington Spa, Sat 26 September; The Old Rep, Birmingham, Wed 11 November; Warwick Arts Centre, Coventry, Sun 22 November

Silly, smart and subversive humour is the name of Tez Ilyas' comedy game. And as the rapid growth of his fanbase ably illustrates, he's extremely good at what he does. Tez's political stand-up has been likened to candyfloss with a razorblade hidden inside, while his television work has brought him to the attention of a whole new audience. The fact that he's been able to hit the right notes with so many people comes as no surprise to Tez himself: "It doesn't matter what walk of life we're from, I think we're all united by the British sense of humour. "Whatever creed, colour, sexual orientation or gender type we are, we have a connection based around a mutual appreciation of that sort of comedy."

## Fin Taylor

"From karaoke with a bunch of bankers, to petrol-station bathrooms and the United Nations," explains the publicity for Matt's show, "Solastalgia is an epic story about fatherhood, finance and facing the future, together."



## Gary Pownland

"Life was tough growing up," says Gary Pownland, the alter-ego of Wolverhampton laughter merchant Jack Kirwan. "My mom and dad popped out for a loaf when I was younger, which is quite an ordinary thing. But I realised as they were leaving that they were carrying suitcases. Straight away I

thought to myself, 'How much bread do they think we can eat?'"

Jack is very much enjoying his creation Gary's time in the spotlight, but his own career in comedy hasn't always been plain sailing. "I've done my share of driving up to Newcastle for a 20 quid gig, getting back at 1am and needing to be up for work at five," says Jack. "And then there was the time I played Edinburgh and basically died on my arse every night for a month!"

## Barry From Watford

'Fierce one-liners, biting satire, plus some effing and that sort of thing for the teens' all feature on the menu when Barry From Watford visits the Midlands with his latest stand-up show, Shooting From The New Hip. The critically acclaimed creation of actor, comedian & voice artist Alex Lowe, Barry is a swearsy nonagenarian who first came to the wider public's attention courtesy of a series of prank calls to a London phone-in show. He later became a regular contributor to BBC Radio Two's Steve Wright In The Afternoon... Alex is also well known for playing the character of hapless clairvoyant, medium & psychic Clinton Baptiste, who will be making a guest appearance in Barry From Watford's two West Midlands shows.

four years ago. Described by spellbound critics as a nutball with a touch of genius, he has since firmly established himself on the UK comedy circuit and developed an enviable television career. Sam's absurdist loops and razor-sharp observational wit will be much in evidence when he stops off in Birmingham mid-month with latest stand-up offering Kid Gibley.

## Mark Simmons

Stafford Gatehouse Theatre, Thurs 17 September; The Glee Club, Birmingham, Thurs 26 November

A runner-up in the 2022 'top 10 jokes of the Edinburgh Fringe competition' - "Did you know, if you get pregnant in the Amazon, it's next-day delivery" - Mark Simmons went one better two years later, emerging from the summertime get-together in the Scottish capital with the Funniest Joke award: "I was going to sail around the globe in the world's smallest ship, but I bottled it."

And there's plenty more where those little gems came from, with Mark's talent for one-liners seemingly knowing no bounds. He's visiting the Midlands this month with currently touring show Jest To Impress.

## Sam Campbell

# BOSTIN' TAY PARTY

Jonny Cole chats about his spectacular rise to fame...





## Comedian Jonny Cole's meteoric rise has seen him graduate from the back rooms of pubs in his native Black Country to comedy clubs, theatres and - for one night this autumn - Birmingham's Utilita Arena. His overnight success has actually been a decade in the making, and the former diesel salesman is determined not to leave anything in the tank - as he explains to What's On...

The past couple of years have been nothing short of extraordinary for Black Country musical comedian Jonny Cole. His current show, *Armagudd'n*, kicked off in September 2024 to little fanfare. Eleven shows presented in and around the Black Country struggled to gain traction, with gigs in Tipton and Bewdley on the verge of being pulled - after barely selling 30 tickets between them - and the remaining dates struggling to sell half their seats.

Everything changed when manager and promoter (as well as friend and fellow comic) Wayne Beese put a few clips online that he'd filmed at a 2023 performance at the Glee Club in Birmingham. Two went viral, getting more than a million views each, and Jonny became a star overnight. All 11 shows sold out within days, and the tour was extended by 90 dates, culminating in a sold-out gig at Wolverhampton Civic Hall at the end of 2025. That was supposed to be the finale, but another 64 dates were then added for this year. The final show - which Jonny assures me really *will* be the last one - takes place at Utilita Arena, Birmingham's biggest indoor venue, in November.

Despite being as surprised as anyone by the stunning turnaround in fortune, the affable Wednesbury native appears to be taking success in his stride, and seems completely unfazed by the prospect of an arena show.

"I'm often just blindly led by Wayne," he admits. "He's come into the dressing room and said 'If you had the opportunity to do this, would you?' Firstly I said, is that even a conversation? And secondly, do you think we'd get anyone to come?"

With over 50 million views on YouTube and more than 150,000 followers on social media ("Wayne does all that - I don't really understand it"), there are serious grounds for optimism. Jonny's hardly expecting to fill the venue, but a crowd of around 4,000 will still comfortably be the biggest of his career, either as a comic or as a musician gigging in bands for years prior to the switch to stand-up.

Had he given much thought to performing in such a vast auditorium? It's clearly a different beast to the three nights he's playing at Katie Fitzgerald's in Stourbridge (capacity 120) just

weeks before...

"I'm more intrigued than nervous about it, to be honest. I started out doing the backstreet pubs and clubs, which really did me a lot of good, [making me] pretty thick-skinned and relentless. It's grown to the bigger stages, so I'm aware that when I'm performing, it's got to be a bit bigger. My mannerisms have got to be a bit bigger, I've got to travel a bit further, and my exclamation needs to be a bit larger."

The expanded audience is also likely to include more people from further afield, as this year's tour has seen him performing all over the UK. Given that his act - a mix of gags and comedy songs with a Black Country twist - relies heavily on local dialect and knowledge, had he been surprised by its success, or felt the need to water down any elements when performing away from home?

"You know, I think it isn't so much a Black Country thing as a working-class thing. Wherever you go in the country, you've got pockets of working-class people that have got exactly the same sort of culture as we have in the Black Country and the Midlands, so I think that's what travels. Sometimes, though, I *will* slow down the accent a little bit, just to make sure they're actually understanding it."

That being said, Jonny's use of, and riffs on, the Black Country are precisely what people come to see. The two clips that went viral are a case in point. One was about how locals speak in letters rather than words, the other a routine about what Disney would've been like if it was located in the Black Country. Better yet, his initial breakthrough came from a song he wrote about Wednesbury.

"I woke up with a hangover, wrote this tongue-in-cheek parody and sent it to my dad to give him a laugh. He put it on YouTube and it got a couple of thousand hits. He told me I should do more of the comedy 'because no one likes your other stuff'."

Jonny still runs new material past his dad, as well as a couple of mates, all of whom he credits with helping make things funnier. He also admits that members of the audience or people in pubs have provided some prize material - such as the punter who gave him the title 'No Woman No Sky', about a man whose partner takes the remote control when they break up.

"I don't profess to be any sort of genius," laughs Jonny, suggesting his Black Country 'family' are naturally funny and a constant source of inspiration. "It's so easy to pick up on little ideas and bits of banter that you hear in pubs. I've been doing a gag for years about the pronunciation of the word mosque because I remember when a mosque was something the Lone Ranger wore."

Endearing the accent to non-natives is one thing, but he's also delighted when people who have migrated away from the area turn up to shows when he plays further afield, suggesting the tour posters are effectively "a bat signal" to lure them in.

"You put that up and Yammers far and wide come to have a look what's going on and support it, just because it's Black Country and we look after our folk."

He also admits he's had to start looking after himself in recent times, giving up alcohol four years ago after it was doing him rather more harm than good.

"I'd get very drunk before going on stage - I mean *really* drunk. So that just had to stop. I came from a rock & roll background, where you'd get hammered and then go and play. When I transitioned into comedy, no one told me that wasn't the gig. One night, when I was warming up for Joe Lycett, I drank a whole bottle of JD Honey. I then went on and did the same song three times!"

Sobering up has improved his ability to perform, as well as changed his mindset about the whole endeavour: "I'm a lot sharper on stage now. I can think two or three gags ahead, and my timing's better. Personally, when I was pissed, it was all about how much fun I was having, but since sobering up, it's about how much fun I can get [the audience] to have. And, coincidentally, my career has gone from strength to strength."

An out-of-work thespian, Daniel makes use of his acting skills to create an alter-ego - the splendidly named Euphemia Doubtfire, a Scottish 'supernanny' - to look after his beloved kids...

That's the basic premise of both this hit stage musical and, of course, the original much-loved 1993 film starring Robin Williams.

"I learned a lot of comedy from watching people like Robin, Steve Martin and Jim Carrey," says Gabriel Vick, who's playing Daniel/Mrs Doubtfire. "There's a lot of Jim Carrey in what I do. You kind of borrow from these people, and then bring your own thing to it."

### **The Last Laugh**

Wolverhampton Grand Theatre, Wed 9 - Sat 12 September

No discernible plot, three aging men chewing the fat and gently ribbing each other in a shabby dressing room...

At first sight, *The Last Laugh* doesn't seem a top contender for an evening of great entertainment. But

when the three men in question are three of the greatest English comedians in living memory, the unpromising surroundings and absence of a strong storyline fade into insignificance.

The show's premise is simple: an imagined meeting between Tommy Cooper, Eric Morecambe and Bob Monkhouse - names that will surely evoke memories of Christmas specials and cheesy game shows for any member of the audience who's reached at least their half-century.

The scene is perfectly set, the jokes come thick and fast, and anybody looking for an evening of laugh-out-loud, uplifting entertainment is in for a real treat.



### **Heathers The Musical**

Belgrade Theatre, Coventry, Tues 15 - Sat 19 September

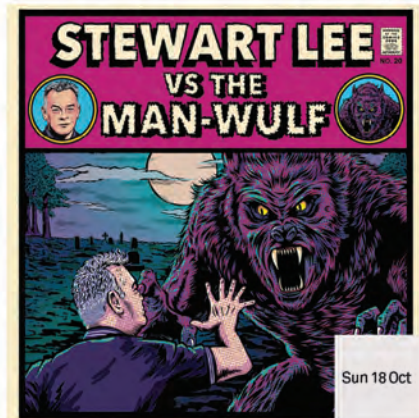
Although far from being an unqualified success with the critics, *Heathers The Musical* did great business in the West End, and is equally likely to pack them in on this latest UK tour.

Thirdly, the show is a real hoot. An Agatha Christie-inspired whodunnit, it features a classic murder-mystery which is created 'on the spot'... The show runs for two hours, including an interval.



## Private Peaceful

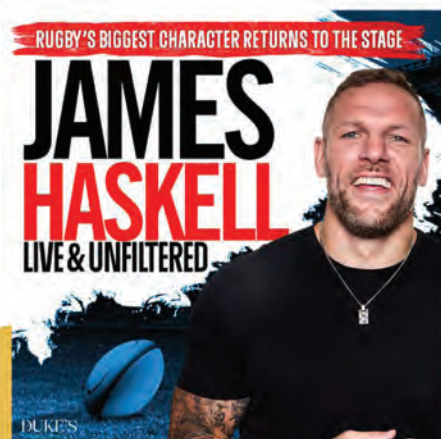

## Theatre previews from around the region



### Twelve Angry Men

The Rep, Birmingham,  
Mon 21 - Sat 26 September

Reginald Rose's gripping courtroom drama makes a welcome return to the region. Best known from the 1957 film starring Henry Fonda, *Twelve Angry Men* tells the story of one juror's battle to save the life of a man on trial for the murder of his father. Initially a lone voice in the wilderness, Juror Eight is faced with the monumental challenge of persuading his 11 fellow jurors to spare the defendant's life. His task is made all the harder by the other men's prejudices and preconceptions about the trial. The cast includes soap-opera veterans Gray O'Brien and Bill Ward.

### The Haunting Of Blaine Manor

When Doctor Roy Earle - a renowned American parapsychologist famous for discrediting hauntings and exposing fake mediums - accepts an invitation to attend a seance at 'the most haunted building in England' (the Blaine Manor of the title), he finds himself, along with his companions for the evening, temporarily cut off from the outside world by a raging storm... And as every lover of the ghost/horror genre very well knows, where there's a raging storm *and* a haunted house, there are also, inevitably, things that go bump in the night... ### The Curious Incident Of The Dog In The Nighttime

The National Theatre stage adaptation of Mark Haddon's award-winning novel bagged an impressive seven Olivier Awards in 2013 and was met with almost universal acclaim. The story is here being told in a brand-new production presented by Birmingham Rep and Melting Pot. And there's every reason to believe the show will prove to be just as impressive as that original stage version. At the centre of the action is the character of teenager Chris, who self-describes as "a mathematician with some behavioural difficulties". Initially coming under suspicion

after discovering the lifeless body of the neighbour's dog, Chris decides to investigate the crime - and in so doing embarks on a journey that will ultimately see some truly shocking family secrets being revealed... Charlie Brooks and Joe McFadden top-bill.

### Woodhill

Documentary theatre and 'gut-punching' choreography combine to thought-provoking effect in this 'explosive' true story from multi-award-winning company Lung.

# SISTER SUFFRAGETTE

Midlands-born Beverley Knight will star in acclaimed musical Sylvia when it visits Birmingham Hippodrome next month...





**Sylvia, a musical bursting with dance, soul and hip-hop, retells an essential and ever-relevant slice of British history: the fight for universal suffrage. The play revolves around the Suffragettes in the Pankhurst family, particularly hard-line matriarch Emmeline and her daughter Sylvia. After first playing the part of Emmeline in 2017, the Midlands' very own Beverley Knight is returning to the role when the show visits the region next month. What's On caught up with the Wolverhampton-born singer, songwriter & actor to find out more...**

Sylvia, a new British musical illuminating the lives of the Suffragettes, visits Birmingham Hippodrome next month. Named after the rebellious and headstrong middle daughter of Emmeline Pankhurst - the leader of the Suffragettes - the story sees Sylvia Pankhurst defy her mother, advocating for universal suffrage.

Midlands icon Beverley Knight originated the role of matriarch Emmeline Pankhurst, and has remained with the production as it's gained traction. Her performance saw her named 'best actress in a supporting role in a musical' at the 2023 Olivier Awards.

"Sylvia Pankhurst goes against her mother's orders and agitates for everyone to get the vote, and that puts her on a collision course with her mother," explains Wolverhampton-born singer, songwriter & actor Beverley. "It's a fabulous, fast-paced show, using R&B, hip-hop, garage and soul ballads to tell the story of how these ordinary women became extraordinary... It's a brilliant piece. There's a lot of humour, there's a lot of darkness, but ultimately there's a hell of a lot of joy."

Involved in the production from its very beginnings - London-based workshops in 2017 - Beverley knew early on that the musical was going to be something special. She recalls the moment she was approached by its writer, director & choreographer, Kate Prince: "Kate said 'I'm developing this show about the Suffragettes, and I would love you to play Emmeline,' and I was in! I'm a history freak; I love history. The first song I heard was a song called March Women March, which is almost like [the play's] theme tune. I lost my mind. I was in, and I've been in it since."

It was at the 2018 premiere performance, at London's Old Vic theatre, when the real weight and impact of the production became clear.

"We got to the interval - that's the real pivot-point of the show. A terrible thing happens to the women - they are beaten terribly by the police - and then the women come back stronger in Act Two. I saw people holding each other in the audience, weeping... I had to take a minute - this is British history. There are people in this audience, especially some of the older people who had come, whose grandmothers or mothers would have been

involved in the fight for women's suffrage. I mean, this is *that* near in terms of history. We're not quite a hundred years into full universal suffrage, and that really puts things into perspective. This is not 'way back many centuries ago'. This is only just falling out of living history."

As a self-professed history fan, Beverley has taken the opportunity to find out more about Emmeline.

"I've loved it. I've gone into the deepest search when it comes to researching her. I have her book, I have Sylvia's book, I've managed to track down a DVD that was copied from a VHS tape of an old series that was on TV in the 70s, about the fight for women's suffrage. I've read everything I can. I've researched old files to listen to Christabel Pankhurst's speaking voice - she sounds really high-pitched, like old transcriptions of the Queen. It's quite funny how people spoke back then. I've done everything I can to try and transport myself back to Edwardian Britain, and for me, I couldn't be in a better place. I'm fascinated by it."

In the national tour, Beverley is joined by Naomi Katiyo, who takes the title role. The familial relationship which the pair bring to the stage is the backbone of the drama.

"It starts out as this wonderful, loving, united Pankhurst family, all of them agitating for the same thing: votes for women. They're all pulling in the same direction, until it becomes increasingly obvious that the government isn't going to bend, isn't going to shift, isn't even gonna listen to these women. Emmeline says, 'Well, a Suffragist would *like* to have the vote, and a Suffragette will *fight* for the vote.' It's that fight where the cracks begin to show in the family. Adela Pankhurst is not comfortable with it. Christabel loves it - Christabel is the strategist who is thinking of all these wonderful schemes that her mother implements. Sylvia at first goes along with it, but her pacifism means that she just can't continue on that road. Then she sees how her mother, over time, becomes this autocrat - 'My way or the highway' - and that sets mother and daughter on a collision course. Eventually, the relationship is fractured beyond repair and they never speak again. It's quite a serious drama - high stakes."

Since the early days of the production, the

play has been refocused to centre the action around the women themselves.

"When I first started, [Labour Party founder] Keir Hardie and his relationship with Sylvia was very much at the forefront. It takes a little bit more of a back seat this time round, to concentrate on the dynamic between Sylvia and her mom, and Sylvia with the other women. Christabel is also important because she's very much her mother's henchwoman. The focus is around the Pankhursts as a family."

The play doesn't shy away from the realities of the Suffragettes' protests - including the famously public death of Emily Wilding Davison at the 1913 Derby. Beverley believes that these historical events remain shockingly relevant: "The cruelty of what happens to these women and how they are ridiculed - we see the echoes of that today. A lot of the arguments and the problems that the women came up against almost 100 years ago are things that we are seeing repeating today. The right to protest - who has that right, what protest is acceptable, when does it cross the line? What is the role of women in today's society - has it changed? The more things change, the more they stay the same."

While there are undoubtedly some heavy themes, the uplifting and rousing music brings joy back to the production. And, with the tour's second stop-off being Birmingham Hippodrome, Beverley is buzzing with excitement to perform on home turf once again.

"Just glorious! There's this extra frisson of excitement from my point of view because I know I'm going to be coming back to God's own country, and to know that I'm in a place where people know my journey. They know what it's taken for me to stand on these stages - that's always extra special, and I appreciate them. There's gonna be a lot of people who are part of my story in that audience watching, and I don't take a single one for granted. It's always a joy to come home and to play - and the Hippodrome is one of the great stages in this country."

### 5 Mistakes That Changed History

### Paul Zerdin: Shut Your Mouth

"As a ventriloquist, I can get away with jokes that other comedians can't," Paul Zerdin explains. "I've got the luxury of taking the p\*ss out of myself, but through the characters, rather than me just being relentlessly self-deprecating. I can get away with having a go at the audience much more, too; you get to be cheekier. Mocking the front row is a trademark of my characters, but I'm evolving my audience interaction beyond that."

Comedian & ventriloquist Paul, the 2016 winner of America's Got Talent, here returns to the Midlands with a show that's definitely not appropriate for young children (the age suitability is 14-plus). "They might be cute little puppets," Paul says of his numerous characters, "but leave the kids at home!"





# GLORIOUSLY GRACEFUL

**Birmingham Royal Ballet presents Sir Peter Wright and  
Galina Samsova's magnificent retelling of Swan Lake...**





Birmingham Royal Ballet (BRB) returns to the Birmingham Hippodrome stage this month with one of the company's most popular works: Sir Peter Wright and Galina Samsova's Swan Lake.

Set to a dramatic score by Tchaikovsky, the ballet tells the tale of Princess Odette, who has been turned into a white swan by the evil sorcerer Baron Von Rothbart. Her only chance of freedom is true love, and when Prince Siegfried meets her and pledges his heart, it seems the spell will be broken. But Rothbart has a trick up his sleeve: the black swan Odile. So can Odile tempt Siegfried, or will the prince remain true?

BRB principal Céline Gittens has played Odette/Odile many times and says the two swans need to have very different characters: "Audiences want a form of escapism, to be taken away from their everyday life into this magical world of ballet, and I think the way to succeed with that is to really understand the character fully so that I can portray the story and the character properly.

"So when I first approached the role in 2012, I did a lot of background research on other ballet dancers and different productions, which provided inspiration for how I interpreted the role. In 2012, I also became the first mixed-race female ballet dancer to perform the role of Odette/Odile in the UK" Born in Trinidad, Céline grew up in Vancouver, where she trained with her mother, Janet Gittens, and at the Goh Ballet Academy. It was from watching Canadian principal Evelyn Hart that she found the key to creating Odette/Odile.

"Evelyn was just stunning in the way she made both roles so different, and that really inspired me. That is where I've drawn a lot of my interpretation from.

"I feel that Odette is maybe a little bit naïve and very tender. What's driving her is to find love. And then along comes Odile, who is quite different. There are a variety of possible interpretations, whether Odile is a transformation of Odette or a completely different character, and I feel like Rothbart has transformed her and given her a new persona to lure Siegfried."

A gold medallist and audience choice award recipient at the prestigious Margot Fonteyn international ballet competition, Céline joined BRB in 2006, becoming a principal in 2016. She has danced many of the lead roles with the company, including Juliet in Sir Kenneth Macmillan's Romeo And Juliet, the Sugar Plum Fairy in Sir Peter Wright's The Nutcracker, Aurora in Sir Peter's Sleeping Beauty, Kitri in Carlos Acosta's Don Quixote

and Fortuna in Sir David Bintley's Carmina Burana. And it is getting to the heart of a character that matters for her: "Sir Peter Wright says this - you have to act to be a classical ballet dancer, you have to act to be in love or in hatred or remorse, but also you have to feel it. When you feel it, that's when it carries through to the audience. And that is when you get the audience on your side."

Taking the role of Prince Siegfried in the full-length ballet for the first time, Mason King joined BRB2, a two-year initiative for young dancers, in 2022, becoming a member of the main company in 2024.

"This is my first big character ballet," he says, "but I actually played Siegfried in the White Swan pas de deux from Act II the year I joined BRB2, and then the next year as well. In fact, I've done it every year but one in my professional career.

"BRB2 set us up really nicely because I was able to do these big solo roles and these big pas de deux; not in a full ballet context, of course, but a snippet - and I think that did help me.

"Any young dancer would hope that eventually they would get to do the role of Prince Siegfried, and I was the same. I didn't think it was going to come around so fast, but I always had the drive for it."

Born in the UK, Mason grew up in New Zealand, training at New Zealand School of Dance. He then attended The Royal Ballet School in London, after which he joined BRB2, where he's performed pieces including Carlos Acosta's Dying Swan pas de deux, Agrippina Vaganova's Diana & Actaeon pas de deux, and Ben Stevenson's End Of Time. But Siegfried is one of ballet's most demanding male roles.

"From watching other principals do it when I first joined, I'd say the challenge is partly the length. This is probably the longest ballet for a male dancer. In Swan Lake, you're in all four acts, so you're doing quite a lot of work. "You really have to carry the story throughout all four acts. and you need to be able to show the emotion at the end of the ballet. So you need the technique but also the stamina - that will be the biggest challenge."

Mason's approach is to focus on the constituent parts of the work: "It's almost broken down into acts for me. So in Act I, Siegfried is very sorrowful; you're by yourself, you're surrounded by all these other people dancing for you, but you're very internal. And then you progress, and in Act II you meet Odette and you slowly fall for her and you have to show the progression

through that.

"Then Act III is with Odile. For me, that's almost a completely different role because of how Céline will portray that part, and I will respond to that. And then there's all the emotion of Act IV. That emotion is essential - if you don't feel it and show it to the audience, then it's just steps on stage." Mason is also benefiting from partnering with Céline.

"Because Céline has performed this role so many times, she knows what she wants, so then I just have to find my way of doing it." BRB founding director laureate Sir Peter Wright is due to turn 100 later this year, but he has always made a point of attending rehearsals for his ballets, to help the dancers fine-tune the roles. And Céline says his input is appreciated: "Sir Peter will tell you when you've done a good job. Even in a principal position, principals still need to hear that. I'm open to corrections because that's what ballet dancers do - we live off being corrected and receiving constructive criticism. But don't forget to also praise the dancers! The fact that Sir Peter is almost 100 and still praising the dancers, that means a lot."

Former ballet mistress Marion Tait, who now holds the role of guest répétiteur, will also be in the rehearsal room.

"Marion often comes to set Sir Peter's ballets," says Céline. "She's been a huge influence in my career, because coming from Vancouver, she helped me switch into the British style of dancing.

"She's very understanding of the dancers. For example, Mason and myself are tall, and she understands what works to bring out the best in ourselves as tall dancers, using the space on the stage and making the most of our aesthetic."

So why does Céline believe Swan Lake has remained central to the world of ballet?

"It's a classic which has stood the test of time. I think what makes it stand out is the fact that it's so technically demanding; it has every classical step, thrown into one ballet. And then there's the music. Tchaikovsky's score elevates this ballet to another level entirely.

## Film highlights in September...



### Practical Magic 2 CERT tbc (110 mins)

Starring **Sandra Bullock, Nicole Kidman, Stockard Channing, Dianne Wiest, Joey King, Maisie Williams** Directed by **Susanne Bier**

The season of the witch has returned - 28 long years after Nicole Kidman and Sandra Bullock last stepped into Practical Magic's world of moonlit mischief and powerful ancestral sorcery.

The Hollywood A-listers once again play Gillian (Kidman) and Sally (Bullock), sister witches who find themselves having to confront the dark curse that threatens to finally unravel their family...

The original 1998 film, based on the same-named novel by Alice Hoffman, was by no means a resounding success, either with critics or at the box office. However, subsequent decades have seen it achieve cult status, which is nowadays a surefire reason for film studios to back a sequel.

Kidman and Bullock are co-producing the new movie alongside Denise Di Novi, who also produced the first film.

"I think the big mistake people make with sequels is when they kind of want to reinvent the wheel and be totally original and surprise people," Di Novi told People.com. She added that they "[get] how important the first movie is to so many people, women in particular, and we want to honour that for sure."

### The Incomer CERT 12a (102 mins)

Dark comedy combines with modern folk fairytale in The Incomer. The winner of the Next Innovator Award at the Sundance Film Festival, the movie stars Domhnall Gleeson as Daniel, a painfully awkward land-recovery coordinator whose boss sends him to a remote and tiny Scottish isle on which two siblings - Isla and Sandy - have lived alone since the loss of their parents 30 years earlier. Daniel's brief is straightforward enough: to evict the pair and have them return to the mainland within 10 days. But Isla and Sandy are set in their ways, survive by hunting and eating seabirds, speak to mythical beings, and most pertinently of all from Daniel's point of view, have vowed to fight off any 'incomers'...

### Pressure

Starring **Andrew Scott, Brendan Fraser, Kerry Condon, Chris Messina, Damian Lewis, Tamsin Topolski** Directed by **Anthony Maras**

There can't have been many bigger decisions to make in the 20th century than the one facing General Dwight D Eisenhower and chief meteorological officer Captain James Stagg in the three days prior to the D-Day Landings. With the fate of the free world hanging in the balance, do they launch the largest and most dangerous seaborne invasion in history, or risk losing the war altogether?

Based on the 2014 stage play of the same name by David Haig - who co-wrote the screenplay with director Anthony Maras - Pressure focuses on the impact which meteorological conditions had on crucial decisions about the D-Day operation. It's certainly an impressive work of cinema, which in itself is no small achievement given that its action basically revolves around the rather prosaic subject of a weather forecast.

### The Runner CERT 15 (107 mins)

Starring **Alan Ritchson, Owen Wilson, Leila George, Rodrigo Santoro, Peta Sergeant, Geraldine Hakewill** Directed by **Scott Waugh**

A former soldier is thrown into a brutal race against time when a critical medical delivery makes him and his unlikely partner the targets of a ruthless cartel. As the mission spirals into a deadly manhunt, they must survive the chase and successfully deliver their cargo, to save the life of a little girl...

That's the synopsis for a film that pairs Owen Wilson - perhaps best known from Ben Stiller comedies such as Zoolander and Starsky & Hutch - with Alan Ritchson, who's come to prominence over the last few years for his portrayal of Midlands born-and-bred author Lee Childs' action-hero Jack Reacher.

"Runner is the kind of theatrical film audiences have been waiting for," says the movie's director, Scott Waugh. "Big action, real heart, and a story that brings light into this world. When everything's on the line to save a life, real men don't run from the fire; they drive straight into it."

## Sense And Sensibility

Focus Features and Working Title Films once again team up to present another cinematic adaptation of a Jane Austen novel; they previously harnessed their talents for a 2020 adaptation of *Emma*, while their 2005 version of *Pride & Prejudice* earned four Academy Award nominations and secured Focus' status as a leading independent film company. For those whose interest in Austen has at best been cursory, *Sense And Sensibility* revolves around the characters of Georgian-era sisters Elinor and Marianne Dashwood. The storyline follows the siblings as they busily make their first forays into the excitingly decadent world of 18th-century high society, where the giddy excitement of love and the terrible pain of heartbreak await them...

With no time to waste, Shaun the Sheep turns 'mad scientist' to fix the problem. But he quickly finds things rapidly spiralling out of control when the farmer goes missing and a wild creature appears in the woods... The *Beast Of Mossy Bottom* is the third film in stop-motion studio Aardman's *Shaun The Sheep* franchise, following on from *Shaun The Sheep Movie* (2015) and the Academy Award-nominated *Farmageddon* (2020).

## Resident Evil

Based on the famous Japanese video-game franchise, the *Resident Evil* movies have done exceptionally well at the box office, despite almost universally being panned by the critics.

This brand-new offering is the second reboot of the series and runs parallel to the timeline of the *Resident Evil 2* computer game.

"So I had this idea for a story in the world of *Resident Evil*," explains the film's director, Zach Cregger, "but it's kind of like me; like if I was dropped into a *Resident Evil* game. I'm terrible with guns. I wouldn't know how any of them work. I would miss 99 percent of all of my shots!"

Described by its publicity as 'an intense adventure thriller exploring the unbreakable bond between a man and his best friend', *Heart Of The Beast* is helmed by David Ayer, who brings to bear his experience of being involved with such muscular two-handers as *Training Day* and *The Fast And The Furious*. "Working with animals is its own experience," he told GQ, "and sometimes you can see the lack of connection when people do these movies, but we really made the dog a living, breathing, fully formed character, with a soulful presence. And you can feel their history, their connection."

# FEELGOOD FACTOR

Jonathan Maitland's new play pays tribute  
to Dr Feelgood legend Wilko Johnson...





## Wilko: Love And Death And Rock 'n' Roll - a brand-new play with live music that tells the miraculous tale of how Dr Feelgood guitarist Wilko Johnson survived a terminal-cancer diagnosis - comes to Coventry this month. Here, its writer, Jonathan Maitland, explains why the incredible story will appeal to a wide audience, not just fans of the legendary Essex rock band...

"It is one of the greatest, if not *the* greatest rock & roll story ever told. If it wasn't real and you invented it, people wouldn't believe you."

Playwright and former journalist Jonathan Maitland is animatedly effusive about the inspiration for his latest play: the truly extraordinary life of Wilko Johnson - guitarist and founder member of legendary 1970s pub rock band (and punk trailblazers) Dr Feelgood.

In 2012, the iconic and bullet-headed star - who also had a recurring role in TV's *Game Of Thrones* - was given the devastating news that he had inoperable cancer and less than 12 months to live. The notoriously grumpy rocker refused all treatment, deciding instead to spend time with friends, make a final album (with The Who's Roger Daltrey) and play a farewell concert tour. It proved an unlikely new lease of life for the perennial curmudgeon, according to Maitland.

"When he got the diagnosis, he was on the verge of giving up rock & roll - he'd had enough of travelling to gigs and playing to audiences of five, 10, 15 people," he says, noting that the diagnosis not only rejuvenated Wilko but changed his typically antagonistic, downbeat demeanour.

"The way he dealt with his illness and the way he just said [adopts note-for-note Canvey Island accent] 'I'm not taking any chemotherapy. I'm gonna die, and it's made me a new person - I love life. It's incredible. I'm tingling all over.' It was amazing. There's footage on YouTube of him saying, 'I'm alive. I feel alive.' He wasn't faking it."

And then a miracle happened. At his farewell gig at KOKO in Camden, which included a poignant singalong encore of *Bye Bye Johnny* - Wilko's real name was John Wilkinson - a cancer doctor and amateur photographer called Charlie Chan (yes, really) told Wilko 'for a man who's about to die, you look surprisingly well' and convinced him to get a second opinion.

Charlie introduced him to a French surgeon called Emmanuel Huguet, who determined he had a cancerous tumour but not actual cancer. Without treatment it would kill him, but it could be removed... which it was, during a risky 12-hour operation at Addenbrooke's Hospital in Cambridge. Wilko went on to live another decade, eventually passing away in 2022, aged 75.

The extraordinary tale of his (mis)diagnosis, acceptance of his fate, new-found love of life and miraculous survival are now the subject

of Maitland's latest play, *Wilko: Love And Death And Rock 'n' Roll*.

The writer has penned a number of dramas based on real-life people and events - subjects have included Margaret Thatcher, Lady Diana, Boris Johnson and Jimmy Savile - but this one evidently means more, given his lifelong admiration of the subject.

"I've always been a massive, massive fan of Wilko, primarily because of the music he made with Dr Feelgood, but also afterwards because he was so exciting and so funny and so mesmeric and brilliant. You listen to the music and it just sends 50,000 volts of electricity through you."

Not that he ever intended to write a play about the man, he admits: "There was always something extraordinary about him, but I didn't think there was a play there. You can't just write a play about somebody you like. I love the Electric Light Orchestra, and Jeff Lynne is wonderful, but he's probably the most boring man in the world."

That said, Jonathan had been trying and failing to develop a play involving a musician who faked his own death in order to become famous.

"The best thing you can do for your career if you're a rock star is die like all those kids who died at 27 - Jim Morrison, Jimi Hendrix, Janis Joplin, Kurt Cobain... the 'Stupid Club', as Cobain's mother called them. I didn't get very far with it, but I thought, what a great story; this rock star goes missing, he goes to number one, and then they find out he's still alive. When Wilko got ill, I thought, my god, it's happened for real - these two things have come together! One of, if not my favourite rock star, has done my idea for real - not pretending but basically being given 12 months to live! In the process, he does a sell-out tour, his album goes to number one and he becomes a national treasure all over again."

Jonathan instantly got to work bringing the two threads together, even contacting Wilko to get his blessing, something the English Literature graduate and self-professed 'man of letters' was delighted about.

"He understood theatre and loved it. He used to take his son, Simon, to see Shakespeare, so I think he was quite honoured that somebody who could write plays wanted to make a play about him. I said 'I'm going to have to take a bit of a dramatic licence' and he said [adopts accent again] 'Well, it's a play, right, just f\*cking make it up.'"

Once he had a first draft, Jonathan visited

Wilko to get his opinion and instantly found himself being corrected on an all-important element. Having been read a stage direction saying 'Wilko sniffs a line of coke', the guitarist jumped in: 'No, no, stop - it's not coke, it's speed.'

"He then tells this story about how he and Lemmy from Motorhead used to stay awake all week on speed," recalls Jonathan. "He said day three was the best 'because it's like someone's taken off the top of your head, poured in Rice Krispies and then milk on top - snap, crackle and pop inside your brain'."

"It's such a great line - I put it in the play and it gets a massive laugh every night."

There are plenty of laughs in the show, of course, but there's angst, tragedy and heartbreak too. Wilko was effectively kicked out of his own band (they had their biggest chart hits less than a year later, as singer Lee Brilleaux was quick to remind him), his wife died of cancer in 2004, and sadly he never got to see the play performed before he passed.

It all adds up to a drama that Jonathan believes has a life way beyond lovers of Dr Feelgood - something demonstrated by the show's sold-out runs in London: "The reason the play's been a success and has made people laugh and cry is because it's imbued with Wilko's spirit and his words. A lot of the best gags in it are his gags - I just fashioned a narrative and scenes around it."

The mixture of drama, quotes from the man himself and live music - including a number of Dr Feelgood hits as well as cover versions such as *Route 66* - make for a suitably emotional but ultimately uplifting journey of redemption that also draws comparisons with a certain well-known festive tale.

"It's a real-life Christmas Carol but with cancer and guitars," laughs Jonathan. "[Wilko] is Scrooge, gets cancer, sees his death, sees his demons and thinks 'Oh my God, I've been appalling.' After his death sentence, he became a better person. Or, as he put it: 'less of an arsehole.'"

These include The Retrospective 2002-2022, an epic, highly detailed painting which functions as a visual inventory of the Calcutta-born artist's impressive career.

# HOBBITS IN THE SHIRE

**A brand-new Tolkien-inspired festival is taking place at Weston Park this month...**





**Tolkien fans will be in their element this month when a brand-new festival takes place in the beautiful setting of Weston Park. Promising lantern-lit lanes, woodsmoke, music - and the chance to live life as a hobbit - Brandywine offers five days of unique and immersive fun.**

**What's On recently caught up with one of the team responsible for bringing the festival to the Shire...**

Lord Of The Rings fans are being invited to explore their inner hobbit when the immersive Middle-earth festival Brandywine comes to the UK for the first time this month. A live-action role-playing (LARP) event, Brandywine will turn the grounds of Weston Park near Shifnal into The Shire, home of the hobbits in JRR Tolkien's beloved books *The Hobbit* and *The Lord Of The Rings* trilogy. Festival-goers will take on the role of a hobbit and follow immersive storylines created by a team of performers. Plus, they can join in with a whole host of hobbit-related activities, including games, live music, dancing, and workshops exploring cookery and textiles. Visitors to the festival have the option of staying for the full event and camping, or just attending for one day on Saturday the 12th. The first Brandywine Festival took place last year in Kentucky and was an immediate sell-out. The organisers, German-based LARP experts Burgschneider, were keen to bring the event not just to the UK but as close as possible to Birmingham - the childhood home of Tolkien.

"How Tolkien imagined The Shire was specifically the West Midlands and the Cotswolds," says Burgschneider chief creative officer Thomas 'Beol' Miller. "Those regions are really the spiritual home of Middle-earth, and Tolkien was clear about this in some of his writing. Therefore, we very much loved the idea of having the festival so close to his home in Birmingham. This was very much on the wish list, and when it came to finding the right venue, the team at Weston Park were able to help us bring that to life by having a wonderful site there on the estate. They are a wonderful team - capable and knowledgeable - and helped us with all the questions that we had as we developed the event."

Once visitors step into the festival, they will be entering a whole different world.

"The Brandywine Festival is a fully immersive, multi-day experience set in The Shire," explains Beol, "so from the moment you arrive, the modernity of the world fades and we're focused on being 'in character', roleplaying and being as hobbits; everything from lantern-lit little lanes between tents, woodsmoke over fires, live music, and a living community of hobbits who are there to roleplay that world and embody that world for the four days of the event."

"We have the Four Farthings Games and a series of Shire games, camping, and the

storytelling of what is happening within The Shire in that period. We've picked a very specific date within The Shire, which gives us a lot of context [in terms of] what is happening within the world of the hobbits. So what would be the gossip? What would there be to do? And then we try to explore those ideas in the story."

From the time the Burgschneider team were first asked by Middle-earth Enterprises - which holds the worldwide rights to *The Hobbit* and *The Lord Of The Rings* books - to create Brandywine, it took around 18 months to develop the concept. Beol says it was essential from the outset that the festival be faithful to Tolkien's novels.

"We treat the event almost as if it is a re-enactment of that world, just as much as it is a game of make-believe at its core. We are treating Tolkien's work almost as a primary source for a historian. We look at the books and then try to surmise and understand what and how he described it, so that we can attempt - as best we can within reason - to recreate that feeling and those moments."

On the Brandywine website, the team provide helpful guides to costuming, creating a character and all the other elements of the festival, to ensure visitors can fully immerse themselves in the fun.

"The idea is that you are stepping into the world that exists there, and you aren't Bilbo but you can decide who you are. And because we are giving players a very clear set of guidelines and railings [within which] they can interact and roleplay, it's very easy for them to go through the process of designing a character."

"We have wonderful tools on our website that help you to design a character, and tools to help you to understand what it is to roleplay as a generic hobbit of your own accord. There is no limitation to the creative opportunities within the world of Tolkien. We want to see a visitor's story through their character; we want to see their creativity come out, and the expression and the love that they have for Tolkien's work."

This even extends to the camping, where visitors have the choice of recreating a Shire camping experience or stepping out of the game and bringing more modern equivalents. The aim, says Beol, is to ensure Brandywine is as accessible as it can be.

"This event is really for everyone, even if you haven't done LARP before. This is a wonderful place to be able to explore

roleplaying and being in a character in a way that is very accessible and fun. The event very much welcomes you in with open arms, with a wonderful community of like-minded people who are there to play to life.

"If you love *The Lord Of The Rings* and you can imagine yourself enjoying a Saturday spent relaxing, having a picnic as a hobbit, playing games, listening to music, dancing, eating food and spending time with good friends, then this is the event for you. Tolkien said 'If more of us valued food and cheer and song above hoarded gold, it would be a merrier world' - and that is what we are trying to bring here."

Tolkien's *The Hobbit* and *The Lord Of The Rings* are among the most popular books ever written and were memorably made into a series of hugely successful films by Peter Jackson. Beol believes the key to their success lies in Tolkien's vision.

"At the end of the day it's an endearing story that touches the core of our wanting a world in which there is a clear division between good and evil and a clear opportunity for us to make a difference in the world; and then, further than that, to explore a space in which myth and legend still hold sway. I think that speaks to who we are as people, and to our love for adventure and for the triumphing of a classic hero story, despite the fact he's nothing but a simple hobbit."

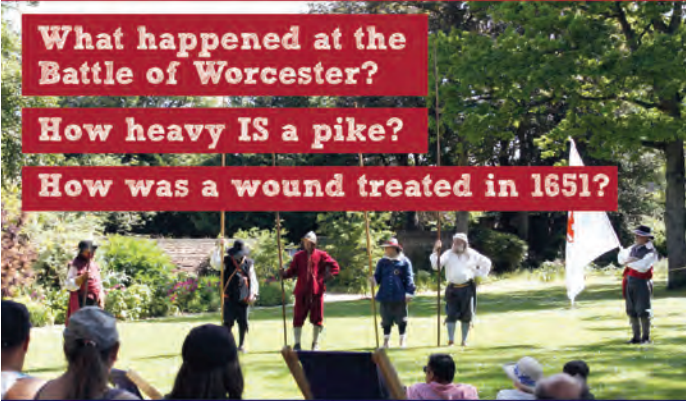
